CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 11, 1930.

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 2,689,312 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended July 10, 1930, making a total of 5,512,002 bushels for the first two weeks of the month. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended July 14, were 1,280,813 bushels, a total of 3,956,982 bushels for the two week period.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending July 4, 1930. The quantity in store on July 11, 1930 was 121,473,461 bushels, compared with 126,285,609 bushels last week and 110,515,045 bushels for the same week last year.

Some of the notable features in connection with Canadian movement for the week are the comparatively large movement from the Western Country Elevators and the increased stocks at advantageous positions for export viz. Canadian and United States Lower Lake Ports and the Seaboard Ports of Vancouver and the United States.

Western Inspections for the week ended July 7, 1930 were 3,540 cars, compared with 3,292 cars for the same week last year.

FOREIGN SITUATION

Owing to the fact that there is a favourable outlook for good supplies of wheat from North America, no anxiety on the part of the importers has been manifested with regard to the supply of wheat for the coming year. However, North American weather is the basis for all market movements in the future. There is a similarity between the conditions last year and this year. The prospects of the new crop in North America are about the same and there will be a heavy carry over.

It is certain this year that North America need have no fear of the extraordinary competition from the Argentine that occurred last year, although Argentine has low quality wheat and is willing to sell it. India is selling and also the Balkans and Southern Russia. For the week ended July 10, shipments of Argentine wheat amounted to 782,000 bushels compared with 1,617,000 bushels for the previous week. Australia reports 1,000,000 bushels while, during the week previous, the amount was 1,512,000 bushels. North America shipped 5,254,000 bushels against 6,756,000 for the week ended June 25.

EUROPEAN CROPS

France and Italy will have reduced crops, but this will be offset by larger crops in Germany, Roumania and Southern Russia. In connection with the reduced crops in the forementioned countries, there is also a small supply of imported wheat. This should ensure a market in those countries. During the years 1928 and 1929, France imported from Canada 18,293,221 and 19,555,589 bushels respectively, while Italian imports were 31,201,257 bushels in 1928 and 24,064,264 bushels in 1929.

United States reports reveal an unsettled domestic market, with a continued slow export inquiry. The harvesting of the United States wheat crop is now general in Kansas and Nebraska and is completed in Southern Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas. The quality of the crop is excellent, being both heavy in weight and low in moisture.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 11, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 11, 1930, show a decrease of 5,239,908 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 121,473,461; Oats 8,661,189; Barley 22,170,922; Flax 488,617 and Rye 8,668,195, a total of 161,462,384 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,812,148; Oats 203,879; Barley 188,102; Flax 1,989 and Rye 33,790 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 138,995,084 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat, 110,515,045; Oats 16,011,479; Barley 8,696,521; Flax 443,319 and Rye 3,328,720 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 5,479,673 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,724,938; Oats 315,310; Barley 234,543; Flax 49,094 and Rye 155,788 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 11,593 bushels. Oats shows a decrease of 18,717 bushels while Wheat and Barley show increases of 2,197 and 4,927 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 452,317 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 457,681 and 1,671 bushels respectively, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 6,309 and 726 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are nil.




