CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 8, 1930.

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 2,462,395 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended July 18, 1930, making a total of 7,974,397 bushels for the first three weeks of the month. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended July 21, were 3,248,870 bushels, a total of 7,205,802 bushels for the three week period.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending July 11, 1930. The quantity in store on July 18, 1930 was 117,011,575 bushels, compared with 121,473,461 bushels last week and 107,018,685 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity in store for the week, 15,479<sup>951</sup> bushels are in the Elevators at United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

There has been a decided reduction in the shipments from the Western Country Elevators as compared with the previous week. The amount shown as shipped is 2,903,313 bushels, while for the previous week the quantity was 5,617,343 bushels. Practically all elevators holding Canadian grain show reductions from the previous week, the net amount being 4,461,886 bushels. Western inspection returns for the week ended July 14, 1930, were 3,024 cars against 3,540 cars for the previous week and 3,507 cars for the same week in 1929.

The Bureau, through the Department of Agriculture, received the following cablegram from the International Institute at Rome: "Situation crop beginning of July indicates following probability, European wheat production slightly under last year. Rye nearly same, barley and especially oats smaller. Northern Hemisphere wheat and rye production slightly larger than last year, barley and oats smaller. Southern Hemisphere wheat crop good."

The reduced crops of France and Italy steadied the international market. Authentic estimates estimate the French crop at 256,000,000 to 280,000,000 bushels, which compares with 319,361,000 bushels in 1929. It was thought that even the reduced crop would meet France's home requirements, but France has been a large buyer of wheat lately. The Italian crop is also reduced and in addition is of low quality. The crop is estimated at 220,000,000 bushels and this estimate will likely prove too high. Greece has suffered from floods. Abnormal heat prevailed over the greater part of Europe, which no doubt has affected the coarse grains to some extent.

Canada and the United States have been favoured with rains during the past week, which relieved the damage from the intense heat which endangered the corn and spring wheat crops particularly. It is now estimated that 300,000,000 bushels of wheat are still in reserve from the 1929 crop, with 1930 crops slightly larger than last year.

United States Department of Agriculture reports for the week ending July 19 show that the domestic wheat market has strengthened owing to less favourable crop prospects of spring wheat in the United States Northwest and Canada and by the good domestic demand for new winter wheat together with a better export inquiry.

Harvesting of winter wheat in the United States is nearing completion under favourable weather. The quality of the wheat is unusually good with the protein content above average. It is also thought that the amount harvested will be larger than official estimation. World shipments during the week ended July 18 of wheat and flour in bushels amounted to 11,311,000 bushels, made up as follows: North America 7,499,000 bu., Argentina 1,340,000, Australia 1,064,000 bu., India 280,000 bu., Russia 104,000 and other countries 1,024,000 bu. For the week ended July 5, the imports of wheat and flour to the United Kingdom amounted to 4,369,168 bu. against 2,772,568 bu. during the previous week.





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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING July 18, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 18, 1930, show a decrease of 5,267,060 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows, Wheat 117,111,575, Oats 8,371,831, Barley 22,041,317, Flax 487,988, and Rye 8,282,613 a total of 156,195,324 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,461,886, Oats 289,358, Barley 129,605, Flax 629 and Rye 385,582 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 137,518,125 bushels made up as follows, Wheat 109,013,642, Oats 16,223,913, Barley 8,373,078, Flax 465,563, and Rye 3,441,929 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 2,785,007 bushels made up as follows, Wheat 2,308,154, Oats 201,146, Barley 129,578, Flax 41,472 and Rye 104,657 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 14,309 bushels, Oats and Barley show decreases of 13,610 and 1,537 bushels respectively while Wheat shows an increase of 838 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 107,258 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 118,284, Barley, 95 and Rye 838 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 11,959 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are nil.
