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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 20, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 20th, show an increase of 18,621,593 bush. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 135,541,368, Oats 14,920,635, Barley 15,933,923, Flax 410,473, and Rye 5,484,902, a total of 172,291,301 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat of 15,159,896, Oats 249,942, Barley 2,817,516, Flax 28,639 and Rye 365,600 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 12,523,110 bush. made up as follows:- Wheat 10,599,480, Oats 438,116, Barley 1,242,300, Flax 30,241 and Rye 222,973 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,369,279 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,357,284, Oats 9,346, Barley 2,579 and Flax 150 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 80 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 713,815 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat of 615,246, Oats 130,973 and Rye 219, while Barley shows a decrease of 2,623 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 3,411 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 5,115,892 bush. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,912,214, Barley 1,586,172, Flax 10,225 and Rye 259,773 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease 322,497 bush.

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
