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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 27, 1929.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending September 27th, show an increase of 23,657,931 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 155,592,619; Oats 15,860,071; Barley 18,152,645; Flax 531,494 and Rye 5,812,403 bushels, a total of 195,949,232 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 20,051,251; Oats 939,436; Barley 2,218,722; Flax 121,021 and Rye 327,501 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain at these elevators show an increase of 14,741,392 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 12,932,711; Oats 809,873; Barley 592,500; Flax 133,605 and Rye 272,653 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 1,660,423 bushels. Increases are noted in: Wheat of 1,652,419; Oats 4,587; Barley 2,393 and Flax 1,104 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 80 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 436,985 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 352,561 and Oats 92,284 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 7,860 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.
PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 91,155 bushels.

PURLUC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,410,076 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,224,489; Oats 191,686 and Rye 7,703 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 13,802 bushels.
