CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 31, 1930.

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 3,150,917 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended July 31, 1930, making a total of 13,970,955 bushels for the last four weeks of the month. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the period ended July 31, were 4,272,478 bushels, a total of 11,478,280 bushels for the month.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending July 25, 1930. The quantity in store on July 31, 1930 was 105,572,892 bushels, compared with 110,648,937 bushels last week and 105,679,728 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity in store for the week, 16,065,242 bushels are in the Elevators at United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

A reduction occurred in the shipments from the Western Country Elevators, the amount being 2,545,077 bushels compared with 4,079,430 bushels for the previous week. Practically all the elevators show decreases from the previous week, the net amount being 5,076,045 bushels. Western Inspection returns for the week ended July 31, 1930 were 2,833 cars against 2,683 cars for the previous week and 2,248 cars for the same week last year.

Foreign Situation

The Bureau, through the Department of Agriculture, received on August 5th the following cablegrams from the International Institute at Rome. "Italy yield current year forecasted 1,000 metric tons Wheat 6,071 tons". This computed into bushels amounts to 223,061,269, which compares with 260,669,000 bushels in 1929. "The Serb Croat Slovene (Jugo Slavia) yield current year forecasted 1,000 metric tons Wheat 2,422." This amounts to 88,989,366 bushels against 94,998,000 bushels in 1929.

A communication of August 6th from Rome, through the Department of Agriculture conveys the following cablegram: "Australia officially informed estimate area or prospective yield not yet made but Commonwealth statistician states that with continuance favourable prospects anticipate record total yield probably 200,000,000 bushels." In 1929 the wheat yield of Australia amounted to 112,000,000 bushels.

For the week ended July 25th according to the London (England) Grain, Seed and Oil Reporter, the import market is much firmer, with a good milling demand for London and outports.

World shipments for the week amounted to 12,538,000 bushels, compared with 12,487,000 bushels in the previous week. North American clearance formed a smaller proportion of the total, being 8,880,000 bushels this week and 9,494,000 bushels last week.

Unfavourable reports of the European and British crops continue. Prospects for the British crop are not as favourable as 1929. Bad weather has caused a further deterioration of the crops in France and has induced buying from North Africa and caused an agitation for the reduction of the import duty.

United States crop conditions have been greatly lowered by prolonged drought, the main effect being by the corn belt but also by the spring wheat area.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 1, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 1, show a net decrease of 5,051,933 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 105,572,892, Oats 7,307,739, Barley 20,751,263, Flax 442,958 and Rye 8,255,932, a total of 142,330,784 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,076,045, Oats 598,786, Barley 561,788 and Flax 34,184 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 218,870 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 135,082,776 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 105,679,728, Oats 16,234,386, Barley 9,312,883, Flax 444,387 and Rye 3,411,392 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 2,760,677 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,979,535, Oats 279,221, Barley 406,705, Flax 2,849 and Rye 90,367 bushels.


