Export Movement of Canadian Wheat

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, and Vancouver show that 3,309,494 bushels of wheat were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended October 2, 1930. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended October 7, were 4,585,591 bushels. This makes a total water movement of 7,893,085 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase from the previous week ended September 26. The quantity in store on October 3, 1930, was 156,414,104 bushels compared with 148,383,624 bushels last week and 173,955,269 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 17,563,352 bushels are in elevators at United States Lakes and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

The rail movement for the week shows a small decrease from the same week last year. The vessel shipments for the week October 7 decreased 1,437,845 bushels from the previous week.


The western country elevator shipments shows a small increase over the previous week being 16,887,798 bushels against 15,670,259 bushels for the previous week. Deliveries to western country ports for the period from August 1 to October 3 amounted to 140,145,000 bushels and 126,627,000 bushels for the years 1930 and 1929 respectively. Western inspections for the week ended September 30, 1930 amounted to 12,925 cars compared with 14,915 for the same week last year. For the month of September 51,715 cars were inspected, 86.3 per cent of which graded No. 3 Northern and better, while for the same month last year 39,325 cars were inspected, 84.7 grading within the contract grades.

Foreign Situation

The import markets report (Sept. 26, 1930) ample supplies of wheat, which exceeded the demand, buyers taking only the amounts to satisfy their immediate needs. Manitoba gained in favour in the market, with Australian and Karachi wheat second, but Russian wheat found ready buyers. Russian wheat is clearly cheaper than other wheats and their supplies play a fairly important part in furnishing the International supply at the present time. The amount reported shipped by Russia during the week was 2,774,000 bushels. This was offset by reduced quantity shipped from the Argentine.

At this stage, it is interesting to know the amount of wheat that was exported from Russia previous to the war. In 1908-09, the quantity was 222,400,000 bushels and in 1909-10, 224,000,000 bushels. The five year average amounted to 156,000,000 bushels. About 18 million bushels of Russian wheat were exported from Black Sea ports in the months of August and September.

According to the United States reports of October 4, the market there was firmer on account of the improved demand for all grains. Export demand however is lacking, but increased amounts have been taken by feeders, with millers active buyers of good milling wheat. Since July 1, the export of wheat from the United States amounted to 42,000,000 bushels, an increase of 10,000,000 bushels over the same period of last year.



The weekly world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 16,554,000 bushels for the week ended October 3, of which North America supplied 8,875,000 bushels, Argentine 879,000 bushels, Australia 1,312,000 bushels, Russia 3,976,000 bushels and Other Countries 1,512,000 bushels. This compares with 13,176,000 bushels for the same week last year. A noticeable feature is the reduced amounts from the Argentine from last year and the increased amount from Australia. North America shipped 6,388,878 bushels against 4,648,619 bushels last year.

The Bureau is in receipt of a communication dated Sept. 24, from the Canadian Trade Commissioner in the Netherlands, and the information contained therein is generally unfavourable to the importation of Canadian wheat. This is attributed at the present time to the pressure of Russian selling which has been so intensified that it has upset the trading conditions of the Rotterdam exchange.

Figures show in September 15 that out of a total of 2,698,046 bushels in storage at Rotterdam, some 1,278,660 bushels is of Russian origin.

Russian prices are 12% under Canadian quotations, quality being equal, but in general, so long as their wheat is sold, prices are of a secondary consideration.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 3, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 3, show an increase of 10,794,506 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 156,414,104, Oats 9,327,408, Barley 29,027,043, Flax 1,053,827 and Rye 11,765,774 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 8,030,480, Oats 736,771, Barley 1,466,101, Flax 337,489, and Rye 223,665 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 225,237,324 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 178,955,269, Oats 17,443,223, Barley 21,266,994, Flax 862,323 and Rye 6,709,515 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 4,537,824 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,410,908, Oats 538,630, Barley 366,232 and Flax 281,080 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 58,966 bushels.


