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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 10, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 10, show a net increase of 7,192,402 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 152,012,923, Oats 9,689,967, Barley 30,129,578, Flax 1,300,361 and Rye 11,647,729, a total of 214,780,558 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,598,819, Oats 362,559, Barley 1,102,535 and Flax 246,534 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 118,045 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 239,361,225 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 189,907,247, Oats 18,424,423, Barley 22,651,096, Flax 1,185,430 and Rye 7,193,029 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators for the week show an increase of 3,043,608 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,050,745, Oats 357,679, Barley 348,190, Flax 246,194 and Rye 40,800 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show an increase of 1,443,364 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 1,336,902, Oats 88,692, Barley 5,090, Flax 1,013 and Rye 11,687 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 406,020 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 395,463, Oats 9,791, Barley 873 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 107 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 2,257,723 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,467,253, Oats 194,359 and Flax 211 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 334,894 and 69,206 bushels respectively.


