According to elevator reports for the two weeks ended November 14th, 1930 from Montreal, Quebec and Vancouver, B.C. 8,413,888 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances from the United States Atlantic ports of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,642,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 10,055,888 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase over the previous week ended November 7th. The quantity in store on November 14th, 1930, was 191,581,000 bushels compared with 157,448,679 bushels for the previous week and 219,634,319 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 23,286,658 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports.

During the week ended November 14th, 5,846 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 3,229 cars for the same week in 1929. Of the 5,846 cars, 46 p.c. graded within the contract grades.

THE FOREIGN WHEAT SITUATION

Continental wheat markets have been featured by wide price fluctuations mostly due to Argentine rust reports and the extreme variations featuring the Winnipeg market. Russian wheat continues to be offered freely, finding a ready market in Italy, but deferred shipments are decreasing and the chartered fleet is much reduced. Plato wheats are offered at cheaper prices to make storage space available. Millers are buying spot Russian wheat, believing further supplies may not be forthcoming. Old Australian wheat is reported to be selling at a good premium over Canadian No.2 Northern because of its value when mixed with Russian wheat. Karachi wheat is again being offered and the Government of India has lowered freight rates to expedite grain export.

Continental wheat stocks are still increasing, especially Rotterdam, Genoa and Naples. On November 15th, stocks of wheat were as follows: Hamburg, 368,000 bushels; Rotterdam, 6,437,000 bushels; Antwerp, 3,348,000 bushels; Genoa, 1,902,000 bushels; Naples, 1,847,000 bushels. Liverpool stocks have increased to 3,272,000 bushels compared with 2,680,000 bushels last week, but are still much less than last year's figure of 8,080,000 bushels.

World shipments of wheat for the week ended November 18th amounted to 17,983,000 bushels, made up about as follows: North America, 6,139,000 bushels; Argentina, 876,000 bushels; Australia, 1,720,000 bushels; and Black Sea, 3,184,000 bushels.

Weather conditions show a general improvement in Europe and seeding is now reported complete in Russia, Italy, Spain, and Germany. It has been delayed by drought in the Balkan States and by rain in France and the western half of England. Larger acreages are forecasted in the United Kingdom and reductions in Roumania and France. The drought continues in northwestern India and will probably reduce acreages. Rains are needed in the eastern part of the United States winter wheat belt, but moisture conditions are very good elsewhere in that country. The Argentine Ministry of Agriculture, reported on November 20th that 14,820,000 acres of wheat were affected by rust which would cause a reduction of 2,000,000 tons in the production.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 14, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 14th, show an increase of 5,601,168 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 191,581,000, Oats 12,730,713, Barley 32,432,981, Flax 2,143,926 and Rye 13,352,635, a total of 252,241,255 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,132,321, Oats 861,436, Barley 129,538, Flax 211,028 and Rye 266,845 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 275,821,557 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 219,634,319, Oats 21,112,710, Barley 25,928,561, Flax 1,094,498 and Rye 8,051,469 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show an increase of 8,720,326 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 7,329,640, Oats 657,966, Barley 275,010, Flax 292,843 and Rye 164,867 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 66,127 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 64,498, Oats 1,183 and Rye 146 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,898,370 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 1,873,957 and 26,895 bushels respectively, while Barley and Rye show decreases of 1,622 and 360 bushels respectively.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 122,987 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 5,540,316 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,542,603, Barley 326,465 and Flax 16,499 bushels, while Oats and Rye show increases of 163,295 and 183,956 bushels respectively.
