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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the four weeks ended November 28, 1930 from Montreal, Quebec and Vancouver, B.C. 15,806,788 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances from the United States Atlantic ports of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,315,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 19,121,788 bushels, from these ports.

During the period from November 30, 1930, the water movement of wheat from the Head of the Lakes to Buffalo and other United States Lake ports amounted to 8,194,484 bushels. For the month of November, the Canadian wheat shipped to the above ports amounted to 20,990,918 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase over the previous week ended November 21st. The quantity in store on November 28th, 1930, was 205,319,398 bushels compared with 199,585,855 bushels for the previous week and 222,916,365 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 30,386,557 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports.

During the period from November 21st to November 30th, 6,326 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 3,369 cars for the same week in 1929. Of the 6,326 cars, 65 percent graded tough and damp, and 32 percent within the contract grades.

The western country elevator shipments for the week ended November 21, 1930, increased over the previous week, being 8,968,818 bushels, compared with 6,879,084 bushels for the week ended November 21. For the period from August 1 to November 28, 1930, the quantity of wheat delivered to country points was 221,179,000 bushels, or 31,164,000 bushels more than the total of 189,565,000 bushels for the same period of last year.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

Wheat prices were steadier in all markets at the first of this past week, but this tendency was followed by further declines due to favourable harvesting weather and high estimates of exportable surpluses in the Southern Hemisphere and to limited British and European demand in the face of increasing port stocks.

World shipments, as compiled by Broomhall, showed a decrease for the third successive week and totaled 13,072,000 bushels compared with 16,502,000 bushels in the previous week, but still above last year's total in the same week of 9,863,000 bushels. The large declines from the previous week were registered in North American and Russian shipments, North America's contribution falling from 7,434,000 to 5,400,000 bushels and Russia's from 6,344,000 to 4,504,000 bushels. Russian shipments have fallen over 3,000,000 bushels in 2 weeks, while the holding of United States and Argentine wheat prices above the Liverpool parity is affecting their shipments. The instability in Russian charterings suggests further reduction in their export movement. The Great Lakes will soon be closed to grain traffic and until the new Southern Hemisphere reaches the European and British markets, stocks of Canadian wheat at the seaboard will be the main reliance of importers. About 31 million bushels of Canadian grain are in store at United States lake and seaboard ports, about 10 million on the



Eastern Canadian seaboard, and 11 million on the Pacific Coast. The first-mentioned stocks will likely be increased before lake navigation closes.

Stocks of wheat at European and United Kingdom ports continue to increase. Broomhall reports Liverpool stocks at 4,476,000 bushels compared with 3,976,000 bushels last week and 8,512,000 bushels last year. The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam reports stocks of 175,385 tons of wheat in that port on November 15th (139,775 tons being Russian), with arrivals in the preceding week, 35,961 tons from Russia, 19,050 tons from Germany, 6,208 tons from the United States, and 4,060 tons from Canada.

Argentine weather and rust news, which has been an important market influence lately, has been superseded by the first crop estimates. The experience of past years has proved these to be decidedly risky. The first ventures in the 1929-30 exportable surplus were around 140 to 150 million bushels and the actual total will approximate 85 million bushels. The first threshing reports from the northern districts are promising, but it is expected that yields will be lower and more varied in the later southern provinces, where frost and rust did the most damage. Broomhall's agent has raised his earlier estimate of the exportable surplus from 155 to 205 million bushels. Other private estimates are 165 and 185 million bushels, while the United States Department of Agriculture (on the basis of an average yield per acre) estimates 190 to 200 million bushels. All figures suggest heavy supplies and although no new wheat has yet been shipped, some has been purchased for December clearances. The weather has been generally favourable for harvest, with some light rains and slight frosts in the south-west.

In Australia, favourable harvest weather has continued and cutting is now general in New South Wales and well started in the southern regions. The acreage of wheat is estimated at 18,160,000 and the average yield is slightly above 12 bushels per acre. The season would indicate an above-average yield. Dry weather up to the end of June gave way to a period of ample moisture in July and August, but the crop received some set-backs in September. The critical month of October was wet in comparison with recent years. Broomhall believes that the final outturn will be greater than the official estimate of 215 million bushels, which shows slightly less than an average yield per acre. The first shipment of new wheat has been reported.

In the United States, the visible statement showed another decrease. The primary movement is very light, suggesting that farmers are either feeding or holding wheat. Experts disagree in the amount of wheat that will be fed, estimates ranging from 60 to 200 million bushels. The American market is being maintained on a domestic basis and Chicago futures are 17 - 18 cents above Winnipeg - a distinct contrast with last year's relation of prices in the two markets. Export movement of United States wheat is very dull, but since July 1st and up to November 22nd, 9,461,000 bushels of Canadian wheat have been milled in bond for export as compared with only 2,822,000 bushels in the same period of last year. The condition of the winter wheat crop has improved, but is not as good as last year.

In Europe, the weather is generally unfavourable for the winter wheat. Rain and floods have delayed sowing in France. In Germany and Italy, however, the weather shows an improvement over last week.

Broomhall reports that weather and crop conditions are favourable in most of Russia, but collections of grain from farms continue small and there have been further disturbances in northern farming regions.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 28, 1930

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 28, show a net increase of 5,681,562 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 205,319,393, Oats 13,710,223, Barley 31,722,125, Flax 2,530,574 and Rye 13,140,661, a total of 266,422,981 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,733,543, Oats 560,464 and Flax 261,034, while Barley and Rye show decreases of 313,410 and 555,069 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 281,953,528 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 222,916,365, Oats 21,667,581, Barley 27,663,450, Flax 1,275,047 and Rye 8,436,035 bushels.

Western Country Elevators Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net increase of 4,266,395 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,073,555, Oats 239,170, Barley 35,370 and Rye 45,981 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 127,681 bushels.


