THE EXPORT MOVEMENT OF CANADIAN WHEAT

The exports of Canadian wheat and wheatflour for the month of July, have just been made available by the External Trade Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, and are presented in the following table for the crop year 1929-30, compared with the crop year 1928-29, and with the average of the five crop years 1924-25 to 1928-29.

Exports of wheat and wheatflour expressed in bushels for the month of July amounted to 22,833,051 bushels compared with 20,779,184 bushels for the same month last year an increase of 2,053,867 bushels and is the third highest monthly quantity for the crop year. The crop year export of wheat was 155,766,106 bushels and wheatflour 6,778,023 barrels or the equivalent of 30,501,106 bushels, making 186,267,212 bushels. This amount compares with the export of 192,721,772 bushels during the crop year 1924-25. The percentage decrease from the previous crop years exports and the five year average 1924-25 to 1928-29 was 54.3 and 39.9 respectively.

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 2,993,781 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended August 7, 1930. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the same week, were 1,448,230 bushels a total of 4,442,011 bushels.


Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending Aug. 1, 1930. The quantity in store on Aug. 8, 1930 was 98,651,942 bushels, compared with 105,572,892 bushels last week and 103,522,001 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity in store for the week, 19,069,306 bushels are in elevators at United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

The Shipments from the Western Country Elevators remained about the same as the previous week being 2,803,084 bushels compared with 2,545,077 bushels for the previous week. Wheat stocks in the Elevators show decreases with the exception of Public Elevators in the East, the net decrease amounted to 6,920,950 bushels. Western Inspection returns for the week ended August 7, 1930 were 1,288 cars against 2,833 cars for the previous week and 577 cars for the same week last year.



FOREIGN SITUATION

The Bureau through the Department of Agriculture, received on August 7 the following cablegram from the International Institute at Rome. "Australia wheat estimated quantity available export August 1, 39,000,000, bushels.

The following cablegram dated August 4, was received from the Indian Director of Statistics at Calcutta stating that the final estimate of the production of wheat in India for the season 1929-30 is 386,512,000 bushels from 31,347,000 acres, as compared with 317,595,000 bushels from 32,011,000 acres the final estimate for 1928-29.

During the week ended August 1, according to the London (England) Grain, Seed and Oil Reporter, import trading was slow and there was no desire to purchase wheat despite the lower prices any buying that was done was for the local needs of the millers and was from afloat cargoes. Europe will undoubtedly have to import more wheat owing to reduced quantities in France and Italy, and in the countries which formerly composed Austria-Hungary.

Russia is reported to be offering wheat to Western Europe, which is taken as an indication that the new crop in that country is up to expectations. London (Eng.) cargoes reported for the week were confined to Indian and Australian wheats. Liverpool market reports indicate a small business in Manitobas, Australian and Karachi wheats, while toward the end of the week, the market was bearish, owing to liberal offerings of American wheat.

Broomhalls of July 30 reports good harvesting weather for the English crops. It is anticipated that future shipments to the continent will be high. Threshing results in France are disappointing, the grain being poor in quantity and low in quality. In Germany, the crop situation continues favourable. Roumania and South Western Russia also have good crops. The Upper Danube is somewhat lower than that shown by previous reports. The estimate of the amount available for export is now revised to 32,000,000 bushels. The large carryover in the United States and Canada will satisfy all the requirements of importing countries for six months. The Southern Hemisphere supplies are about half of last year. There are also lower quantities in United Kingdom ports, while supplies of Europe are also less than a year ago.

The present situation in the world wheat trade would be summarized by mention of the following comparison with last year.

1. Lower stocks in United Kingdom and European ports and in the two main exporting countries of the Southern Hemisphere.
2. Higher stocks in North America.
3. Deficiencies in yearly production of France, Italy and the United States.
4. Larger production in Canada and India, and probably in Russia.
5. Prospects of larger crops in the Argentine and Australia.

Broomhall estimates the total world production for 1930-31 at 4,088 million bushels as compared with 3,888 million in 1929-30.

The grain markets in the United States for the week ended August 9, were decided firmer due to increased drought damage throughout most of the eastern half of the United States. Corn suffered the most serious damage as did flax and late sown spring wheat. Prices of these grains rose from 10 to 12¢ per bushel. On July 1st, wheat stocks in the United States amounted to 256,860,000 bushels compared with 225,750,000 bushels on the same date last year. On July 31st wheat stocks in Canada were 111,692,519 bushels against 104,383,221 bushels in 1929. In these figures, no account has been taken of the amount of Canadian wheat in United States positions or the quantity of United States wheat in Canada.

World shipments for the week, amounting to 15,195,000 bushels were for the third successive week larger than the exports in corresponding weeks of last year. North America contributed 9,689,000 bushels. Argentine, 1,330,000 bushels, Australia, 1,712,000 bushels, and other countries, 2,464,000 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 8, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 8, show a decrease of 7,515,280 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 98,651,942, Oats 6,944,719, Barley 20,463,081, Flax 431,628 and Rye 8,224,134, a total of 134,715,504 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 6,920,950, Oats 363,020, Barley 288,182, Flax 11,330 and Rye 31,798 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 132,220,875 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 103,522,001, Oats 15,725,822 Barley 9,075,115, Flax 347,264 and Rye 3,550,673 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a decrease of 3,757,857 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 2,228,971, Oats 520,743, Barley 865,293, Flax 9,203 and Rye 133,647 bushels.






