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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the weeks ended December 12th and 19th, 1930, from Montreal, Quebec, Saint John and Vancouver, 2,964,468 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances from the United States Atlantic ports of Canadian wheat amounted to 3,220,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 6,184,468 bushels, from these ports.

Wheat stocks show an increase over the previous weeks ended December 5th and 12th. The quantity in store on December 19th, 1930, was 215,941,628 bushels compared with 210,550,714 during the week ended December 5 and 214,784,221 bushels for the week ended December 12th, 1930, while 228,225,911 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 31,939,447 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports.

During the week ended December 21, 1930, 2,919 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,434 cars for the same week in 1929. Of the 2,919 cars, 68 per cent graded tough and damp and 27 per cent, within the contract grades.


The Western Country Elevators shipments for the week ended December 12th amounted to 3,172,578 bushels, compared with 5,934,360 bushels for the week ended December 5th, 1930. A notable feature is the reduced movement of the Alberta Country Elevator shipments. For the period from August 1st to December 19th, the quantity of wheat delivered to country points was 239,755,000 bushels, or 40,976,000 bushels more than the total of 198,779,000 bushels for the same period last year. Continued mild weather in the West during the past two weeks has encouraged liberal deliveries to the Country Elevators.

Commencing with this week, December 19th, the exports from Canada was moved through the winter ports of the Dominion, viz St. John, N. B., Halifax and Vancouver, while considerable amounts were moved through the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

Total world shipments as reported by Broomhall on December 22nd amounted to 11,932,000 bushels, which is a small improvement over the week of December 15th, amounting to 11,404,000 bushels, while during the same week last year 9,473,000 bushels were shipped. Increased movements took place from Argentina and Australia during the week, while small decreases are noted in the North American and Russian movements.

The bulk of the North American movements were consigned to France, United Kingdom, Belgium, North Africa, Scandinavia and the Orient in the order named. The total world shipments since July 1 is now 58,274,000 bushels over the shipments for the same period last year.

Argentine official estimate have recently published the wheat crop for 1930-31, being placed at 271,404,000 bushels from 21,316,000 acres as compared with 137,434,000 bushels from 19,440,000 acres in 1929-30. The exportable surplus is placed at 200,000,000 bushels. The crop report is better than anticipated, one of the recent estimates placed the production at 268,000,000 bushels. Clear weather prevails in the Argentine, although the wet weather recently delayed threshing. Argentine shipments have not attained the high proportions of a year ago. Last week, December 19th, the amount shipped is shown to be 1,251,000 bushels against 2,208,000 bushels for the same



week last year.

Australia reports clear weather and threshing is progressing with some low quality wheat being in evidence. Broomhall's Sydney Agent estimates the crop at 192,000,000 bushels, some 23,000,000 bushels less than the official estimate of 215,000,000 bushels. For the weeks ended December 5th, 12th and 19th, shipments amounted to 1,895,000, 1,848,000, 2,184,000 bushels, respectively.

United States Final Government Report estimates the wheat crop as 850,596,000 bushels against 809,176,000 bushels last year. This represents an increase of 5.2 per cent over the 1929 crop. The carryover from the last crop amounted to 275,404,000 bushels, which added to the crop makes the total supply of 1,126,000,000 bushels, some 70 millions more than the preceding year. According to reports from farmers, 236 million bushels of wheat will be used for feeding livestock or about 146 millions more than last year. United States exports have declined during the recent month, due to the fact of low world prices, still it is thought if the feeding programme is carried out, it would result in a reduction of the carryover. Recent official report places the acreage sown to fall wheat at 42,042,000 acres, a decrease of 1.1 per cent from that sown last year. This is greater acreage than anticipated on account of the urgings of the Farm Board to decrease acreages in wheat.

Russia. - Blacksea shipments for the week ended December 18, amounted to 76,504,000 bushels; of this 68,024,000 bushels were from Russia. Reports state that some 70 or 80 steamers are lying in one of the Black Sea ports awaiting cargoes. Supplies of grain are moderate and no recent reports of further chartering. Stocks of unsold Russian wheat in the United Kingdom is estimated at 26,000,000 bushels.

Italy. - It is now officially estimated that the wheat requirements will amount to 94,400,000 bushels. Some 34,000,000 bushels have already been imported.

Egypt. - intends to increase the duty on wheat 8 per cent and flax 7 per cent.

France. - The weather reported colder and seeding is progressing in the Eastern districts and in parts of Brittany. Probably acreage will no doubt be somewhat reduced. The new crop is reported in moderate condition. Native wheat offerings are larger and are of low grades. Broomhall's agent estimates imports requirements some 58,400,000 bushels.

The French Millers urges that foreign wheat allowance in flour should be increased to 15 per cent and after the Ministry of Agriculture feels that all native wheat is sold the obstacles to foreign wheat importation will be cleared away possibly at the beginning of the next year.

United Kingdom. - Agricultural returns from England and Wales report the wheat yield at 39,954,133 bushels from 1,346,090 acres compared with 47,460,000 bushels from 1,330,122 acres in 1929. The production represents a reduction of 16 per cent from the previous year.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 19, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 19th, show a net increase of 1,357,257 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 215,941,628; Oats 14,848,514; Barley 31,512,800; Flax 2,002,405 and Rye 13,351,792, a total of 277,657,139 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,157,407; Oats 450,756 and Rye 44,690 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 109,878 and 185,718 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 289,506,839 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 228,443,021; Oats 22,031,284; Barley 29,211,241; Flax 1,105,440 and Rye 8,815,873 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in these elevators show a net increase of 136,242 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 371,973 and 5,250 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Barley of 40,728; Flax 164,396 and Rye 33,357 bushels.


