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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to Elevator reports for the week ended December 26, 1930, from Montreal, Quebec, Saint John and Vancouver, 2,101,142 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearance from the United States Atlantic ports of Canadian wheat amounted to 1,602,000 bushels, making a total export movement during the week of 3,703,142 bushels from these ports.

During the four weeks ended December 26th, 9,436,136 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped from Canadian Seaboard Ports, to which must be added the movement of the United States Atlantic ports of 6,012,000 bushels, making a total overseas movement of 15,448,136 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase over the previous week ended December 19th. The quantity in store on December 26th, 1930, was 217,742,829 bushels compared with 215,941,628 during the week ended December 19, while 228,443,021 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 32,124,674 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 22,538,497 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The Western Country Elevators shipments for the week ended December 19th amounted to 3,139,381 bushels compared with 3,172,578 bushels for week ended December 12. For the period from August 1 to December 26, wheat delivered at country points was 241,697,000 bushels or 41,971,000 bushels more than the total of 199,918,000 bushels for the same period last year.

The weather in the Western Provinces during the week ended December 30 was mostly fair and mild in Alberta and Saskatchewan but rather cold in Manitoba.


Owing to the fact that large quantities of the Canadian crop of late has been graded tough by the Inspection Department at Winnipeg, the wheat pool Research Bureau published a report from which it is stated briefly that samples grading No. 2, 3 and 4 show no damage from weathering the snowstorms in the early fall, in fact 35 samples were found to be as good, if not better, than the average for the same grades in store at the Head of the Lakes.

FOREIGN SITUATION

The Canadian wheat market prices touched several low marks during the last ten days, while recently at Liverpool December wheat sold at 57.3 cents, the lowest since the year 1864.

Prices at Liverpool have since rallied owing to the advances in Winnipeg and Buenos Aires markets, together with the fact that France has guaranteed to import 9,000,000 bushels of wheat from Canada and arrangements are in progress to increase sales to the Orient.

Up to the present time, the overseas shipments to the importing markets have been from countries of the Northern Hemisphere and in the future increased movements will take place from the Southern Hemisphere. The Australian shipments from August 1 to December 26 amounted to 30,172,000 bushels, compared with 18,956,000 bushels for the same period in 1929. Argentine shipments for the same period in 1930 were 18,477,000 bushels against 83,312,000 bushels last year and North American shipments were 194,344,000 bushels against 146,834,000 bushels in 1929 and 279,670,000 bushels in 1928.



The world production is estimated by the United States Bureau of Agricultural Economics as 3,784 millions compared with 3,495 millions last year.

According to Broomhall's estimate of December 29, 11,181,000 bushels constituted the world shipments of wheat. This is 751,000 bushels less than last week. Of the 11,181,000 bushels shipped, 4,959,000 bushels were credited to North America, 1,062,000 from Argentine, 2,200,000 bushels from Australia, 2,136,000 from the Black Sea Ports and 824,000 bushels from other countries. A small improvement was shown in North American and Australian movements.

The destination of the North American movement was principally to United Kingdom, France, Belgium, Italy and Holland in order named.

In Central and Western Europe the winter wheat crop has been injured by the wet, cold autumn weather. This has also prevented some seeding. Australia and Argentine report unsettled weather for harvesting and threshing their crops.

Recently, the United States corn prices have declined to the lowest of the year, which will increase the consumption of that grain on the farm, thus curtailing the consumption of wheat.

Russia - Black Sea shipments amounted to 78,640,000 bushels from August 1 to date. Of this amount 69,941,000 bushels were of Russian origin. For the week ended December 26, 1930, 1,920,000 bushels were shipped from Russia compared with 2,568,000 bushels for the previous week. Russian wheat is predominating the European and United Kingdom import market being sold ex-quay or ex-ship at prices a little above millfeed produced. It is reported that Russian wheat is mixed with rye, which is objectionable to the United Kingdom millers and cargoes over 5% mixed are transhipped to the continent. British ports are overstocked with unsold Russian wheat, and with regard to the future shipments from that country, it seems to be assured for sometime yet, as chartering of vessels for December and January shipments have taken place.

Switzerland - According to a report from the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam, some 1,872,203 bushels of wheat were imported during the month of November, of which 849,548 bushels were supplied by Canada and 619,128 from the United States, and 275,560 bushels from Russia; the balance was received from other countries. From January to November 1930, 8,355,408 bushels were imported from Canada and 3,951,597 bushels from the United States, Argentine 1,726,461 bushels and France 909,810 bushels.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 26, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 26th, show a net increase of 1,813,977 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 217,742,829, Oats 14,973,090, Barley 31,238,194, Flax 2,079,583 and Rye 13,437,420, a total of 279,471,116 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,801,201, Oats 124,576, Flax 77,178 and Rye 85,628 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 274,608 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 291,252,349 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 229,788,290, Oats 22,028,804, Barley 29,509,267, Flax 1,241,706 and Rye 8,684,282 bushels..

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 709,302 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 583,303, Oats 114,102, Flax 34,478 and Rye 8,567 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 31,148 bushels.
