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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 9, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 9, show a net decrease of 3,622,640 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 214,047,364, Oats 14,761,344, Barley 31,147,798, Flax 2,148,092 and Rye 13,237,876 bushels a total of 275,342,474 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,008,348, Oats 267,209, Barley 204,808 and Rye 179,744 bushels. While Flax show an increase of 37,469 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 289,741,220 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 228,665,352, Oats 21,630,104, Barley 29,524,405, Flax 1,211,778 and Rye 8,709,581 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 275,258 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 330,148 and 24,765 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 37,184, Barley 10,216 and Flax 32,255 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks of the week show a decrease of 543,362 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 494,419, Oats 46,540 and Barley 2,403 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 556,920 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 447,821, Oats 88,775 and Rye 20,357 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 33 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 19,598 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,540,990 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,399,040, Oats 25,278 and Flax 16,560 bushels while Barley and Rye show decreases of 51,690 and 48,198 bushels respectively.
