

CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to Elevator reports for the week ended January 23, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 3,750,140 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearance from the United States Atlantic ports of Canadian wheat amounted to 2,226,000 bushels, making a total export movement during the week of 5,976,140 bushels from these ports.

For the four weeks ending January 23, 1931, the movement by vessel from the winter ports of Saint John, N.B. and Vancouver, B.C. amounted to 10,786,571 bushels. The clearance from the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports were 2,226,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 16,192,571 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase over the previous week ended January 9. The quantity in store on January 23, 1931, was 205,992,667 bushels compared with 210,741,874 during the week ended January 17, while 223,895,109 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 27,914,024 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 19,373,368 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The Western Country Elevators shipments for the week ended January 15, 1931, amounted 1,694,712 bushels compared with 3,461,855 bushels for week ended January 9. For the period from August 1 to January 23, 1931, wheat delivered at country points was 251,674,000 bushels or 45,061,000 bushels more than the total of 206,613,000 bushels for the same period last year.

During the week ended January 21, 1931, 1,946 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,098 cars for the same week in 1930. Of the 1,946 cars inspected 43.6 per cent graded tough and damp, and 46.8 per cent, graded within the contract grades.

FOREIGN SITUATION

The wheat market was steady with nothing new to report with regard to prices. There was fair element for Manitobas which was soon satisfied.

Canada, Argentine and Australia have sufficient wheat to satisfy foreign demands during the coming season. The latest estimate of the surplus are as follows:-

Prospects indicate there should be heavier shipments during the period from January to March, than last year, as the foreign buying and importing this season are on a much larger scale. France is a buyer this year being an exporter last year. While Italy and Germany had large crops. Europe generally requires more wheat. There has been some encouragement to Canadian holders owing to the partial destruction of the Argentine crop and the bleaching of wheat in Australia.

The world shipments for the week ended January 26, were 13,316,000 bushels as compared with 13,943,000 bushels for the previous week. These were forwarded from North America 6,208,000 bushels, Australia 3,728,000 bushels, Argentine 2,372,000 bushels, Black Sea 248,000 bushels, India 32,000 bushels, and other Countries 728,000 bushels. Southern Hemisphere shipments are almost equal to the North America exports. The destination of the North American shipments were United Kingdom, Holland, Germany, France, Belgium, Italy and Greece in order named.

Continental arrivals during the week ended January 27, 1931, were 2,952,000 bushels of which 1,152,000 bushels went to Holland, Italy 624,000 bushels, France 440,000 bushels, Belgium 328,000 bushels, Scandinavian 208,000 bushels, Greece 104,000 bushels, Germany 90,000 bushels. During the period from August 1 to January 27, 1931, 177,980,000 bushels, while for the same period last year it amounted to 111,999,000 bushels.

India - Rainfall occurred in the Punjab province which was beneficial to wheat but too late to permit further sowings. Dry weather reported for the United Provinces. Broomhall reports the seasons purchases from Australia as estimated at 4,800,000 bushels to 5,000,000 bushels.

The Bureau is in receipt of the following cablegram from the Indian Director of Statistics stating according to the first forecast of the season the area sown to wheat in India for 1931 amounted to 30,564,000 acres compared with 31,347,000 acres finally reported last year.

France - Weather is reported very mild and rainy with the result that complaints are heard of the poor condition of the seedlings. Native wheat is offered in small lots and less interest taken in foreign grain.

United Kingdom - The crops are reported fair but more seasonable weather required, native wheat is offered sparingly. A fair trade is reported in Russia wheat in Liverpool. During the calendar year 1930, the imports of wheat into the United Kingdom from the Russia Soviet Union was 35,192,513 bushels.

Holland - The arrivals of wheat into Holland during the week ended January 17, 1931, according to report from the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam were as follows:- From Germany 497,796 bushels, Canada 312,647 bushels, Argentine 52,763 bushels, United States 40,087 bushels, Danzig 10,398 bushels. The amount of wheat in storage at Rotterdam on January 19, 1931, was 8,666,228 bushels of which 8,101,854 bushels were Russian, 192,534 bushels Canadian and 371,840 bushels United States. The storage at Amsterdam on same date amounted to 1,250,221 bushels of Russian wheat.

Switzerland - According to a report received from the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam the amount of wheat imported during the month of December was 1,340,697 bushels of which 702,373 bushels were Canadian.


Italy - According to Broomhalls some nine cargoes of Argentine wheat were purchased by Italy at full prices.

Germany - The trade in Germany were awaiting a change in the regulations reducing the quantity of native wheat to be used in milling. The amended regulation was issued on January 28 stating that the quota of native wheat for millers grists during February and March were fixed at 75 per cent; April and May 65 per cent; June and July 50 per cent. The present quota was 80 per cent. The crops are reported fair, with more seasonable weather required.

Russia - During the week ended January 28, 1931 the shipment of Russian wheat through the Black Sea ports amounted to 232,000 bushels since August 1 to date the total shipments of Russian wheat were 72,440,000 bushels.

Argentina - Rain is reported in the southern part of the Argentine, which is causing damage to the crop so much so it is feared a reduction will be shown in the production. So far the wheat receipts have been very small as compared with the normal years. It is expected when the weather clears up that Rosario will be the centre of the heavy movement of wheat. Italy has purchased fair amounts of Argentine wheat. Liverpool reports receipts of newlate wheat and the quality is fine.

Australia - Threshing has progressed recently owing to the clear weather which has prevailed



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 23, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 23, show a net decrease of 5,085,318 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 205,992,667, Oats 14,140,839, Barley 30,923,560, Flax 2,148,200 and Rye 13,366,266 bushels, a total of 266,571,532 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,749,187, Oats 239,382 and Barley 143,887 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 6,115 and 41,023 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 284,243,847 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 223,895,169, Oats 21,151,834, Barley 29,268,423, Flax 1,193,995 and Rye 8,734,426 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 785,640 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 693,354, Oats 80,399, and Barley 26,557 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 2,291 and 12,379 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks of the week show a net decrease of 1,060,048 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,057,525, Oats, 8,136, and Flax 3,246 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a decrease of 1,053,610 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 1,027,535 and 8,075 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 22,681 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 1,055,581 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 971,530, Barley 16,706, Flax 16,205 and Rye 55,406 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 4,266 bushels.



January 23, 1931




