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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the week ended January 30, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 2,807,255 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 1,522,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the week of 4,329,255 bushels from these ports.

For the four weeks ending January 30, 1931, the movement by vessel from the winter ports of Saint John, N.B., and Vancouver, B.C., amounted to 13,593,826 bushels. The clearances from the United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports were 6,928,000 bushels, making total export clearances of 20,521,826 bushels during the four weeks.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended January 23. The quantity in store on January 30, 1931, was 203,914,346 bushels, compared with 205,992,667 during the week ended January 23, while 220,578,631 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 26,541,733 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 17,873,543 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The Western country elevator shipments for the week ended January 23, 1931, amounted to 2,172,596 bushels compared with 1,894,712 bushels for the week ended January 16. For the period from August 1 to January 30, 1931, wheat delivered at country points was 254,562,000 or 46,573,000 bushels more than the total of 207,989,000 bushels for the same period last year.

During the week ended January 30, 1931, 3,239 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,698 cars for the same week in 1930. Of the 3,239 cars inspected 42.7 per cent graded tough and damp, and 51.2 per cent graded withing the contract grades.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

The important features of world wheat trade in the past week have been the increased pressure of shipments from Argentine and Australia (resulting in increased stocks afloat), continued withholding of Russian supplies, further reports of unfavourable crop conditions in important countries, and firmer prices than have prevailed for some time.

Weekly world's shipments are reported by Broomhall at 16,945,000 bushels, considerably higher than last week's total of 13,316,000 bushels and last year's figure of 11,451,000 bushels for the same week. The large contributions were from North America (6,987,000 bushels), Australia (5,416,000 bushels), and Argentine (3,510,000), with Black Sea shipments only 256,000 bushels. Total world shipments since July 1, 1930, are now placed at 446,570,000 bushels -- an increase of 68,354,000 bushels over shipments in the same period of 1929-30.

On passage supplies increased from 30,332,000 bushels last week to 37,272,000 bushels this week, the change being largely due to the increasing stocks from the Southern Hemisphere and the longer period in which they are afloat for their destination. United Kingdom arrivals were lower and the divergence of large quantities of Australian wheat to India and the Orient is reducing pressure on European markets. Liverpool stocks are still falling, being 4,296,000 bushels compared with 4,672,000 bushels last week and 7,864,000 bushels in the same week of last year.

It is still too early for the complete appraisal of the condition of winter-sown wheat and the soil moisture conditions for spring wheat throughout the world. It appears, however, that the preponderance of unfavourable reports is beginning to affect the market (and particularly futures), despite the large existing surpluses. In Eastern and Southern Europe generally, and particularly in Italy and Bulgaria prospects are very satisfactory. (A cablegram received from the International Institute on February 4, places the winter wheat acreage of Italy at 11,893,000 or 1.1 per cent higher than last season). The crops of Austria and Roumania are in need of snow covering. The Danube Basin is reported as having winter wheat in good condition, but the acreage has declined from 18,067,000 in 1929-30 to 17,559,000 in 1930-31. Both North and South Africa complain of lack of moisture. The opposite condition has prevailed in France where continuous wet weather has seriously reduced crop prospects. Germany and Belgium report like conditions, but to a lesser degree. In Sweden, the snow fell on unfrozen wheat ground and this condition is causing some alarm. Russia has had ample snowfall on the large acreage planted in accordance with the government program. In India, the severe drought has been abated by recent rains, but these have been insufficient in amount and extent. More favourable weather has prevailed in Australia and Argentine than was experienced earlier in the harvest season, and the full extent of the damage caused to the present crop will not become apparent until later in the marketing period. In the United States, Government and private reports show that wide areas of winter wheat are without snow covering and drought is particularly evident in Oklahoma, Kansas and Iowa. The prevalent warm weather has caused some sap movement in winter wheat and a cold spell would be destructive. The United States spring wheat belt has received subnormal winter precipitation. In the two western prairie provinces of Canada, the mild weather with little snow is particularly fortunate for the winter ranging of live stock, but is causing some concern as to the prospects for a suitable seed-bed in the spring. Winter precipitation has been far less than normal.

Despite new lower levels in silver exchange which are curtailing wheat movement from Vancouver, there has been steady buying of Canadian wheat and the disappearance is now about double the deliveries. United States export of wheat has dwindled but some encouragement to flour export will be provided by the agreement between the Grain Stabilization Corporation and the Millers' National Federation, whereby millers may borrow wheat for milling for export, returning the wheat in the period, July to September 15. The September future was opened for trading on February 2, and was 20 cents under the May future. Southern Hemisphere shipments are exceeding those of the same weeks of 1930, and are steadily increasing. The first cargo of new Argentine wheat arrived in Liverpool on January 27.

Broomhall has increased his estimate of world import requirements to 768,000,000 bushels by an upward revision of 32 million bushels in the requirements of non-European countries.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 30, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 30, 1931, show a net decrease of 2,482,253 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 203,914,346, Oats 14,075,070, Barley 30,568,722, Flax 2,127,600 and Rye 13,403,541 bushels, a total of 264,089,279 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,078,321, Oats 65,769, Barley 354,838 and Flax 20,600 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 37,275 bushels. For the same week last year the stocks in store amounted to 280,190,807 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 220,578,631, Oats 20,742,576, Barley 28,995,045, Flax 1,177,454 and Rye 8,697,101 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain at these elevators show a net decrease of 76,780 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 262,947, Flax 31,257 and Rye 3,577 bushels, while Oats and Barley show increases of 218,872 and 8,129 bushels.
