## Export Movement of Canadian Wheat

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 3,038,283 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended August 14, 1930, making a total of 6,032,064 bushels for the first two weeks of the month. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended July 14, were 1,052,735 bushels, a total of 2,500,965 for the period of two weeks. This makes a total water movement of 8,533,029 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending Aug. 18, 1930. The quantity in store on Aug. 15, 1930 was 95,599,678 bushels, compared with 98,651,942 bushels last week and 100,763,531 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity in store for the week, 13,418,455 bushels are in elevators at United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

Shipments from Western Country Elevators show a further reduction from the previous week being 1,582,589 bushels, compared with 2,803,084 bushels. As in the previous week. Wheat stocks in all the elevators show decreases with the exception of the Public Elevators in the East - the net decrease amounted to 3,052,264 bushels. Western inspection returns for the week ended August 14, 1930, were 2,460 cars against 1,288 cars for the previous week and 392 cars for the same week last year. This is the first week in which new crop inspections are shown, and they consist of 32 cars of Wheat, 64 Oats, and 42 of Rye.

FOREIGN SITUATION

The Bureau through the Department of Agriculture, received in August 14, the following cablegram from the International Institute at Rome "Australia wheat weather condition eminently quite satisfactory throughout; frequent showers ample for present requirements, all states report crop conditions good. On August 18, the following cablegram was also received-"Union of South Africa final estimate yield in current season thousand metre tons Maize 2,093 or 82,398,270 bushels. During the week ended August 8, according to the London (Eng.) Grain, Seed and Oil Reporter the import market was strong in tone due to the bullish American News. The trade was active and prices rose on Manitoba, Australian and Indian Wheats.

The bullish factor was the reported drought damage to the United States maize and fodder crops. Damage was also done to spring wheat, which somewhat lessened its production, but this will be offset by the increase in the winter wheat crop. The European situation indicates smaller breadstuffs and fodder crops and are in part reported as follows:- French report estimate is as low as 216,000,000 bushels compared with 316,000,000 bushels for last year. The Italian crop is estimated from 32,000,000 to 40,000,000 bushels less than the previous year, which was 260,669,000 bushels. Germany reports about 16,000,000 bushels more wheat and a larger crop of Rye. Hungary and Jugoslavia have smaller crops, while Poland will have good quantities for export. Russia is reported to have sold 1,100,000 bushels to Western Europe at the recent advanced prices. The reports from Russia are somewhat confusing some mentioning crop failure in certain districts which will prevent export, while others state that Russia will be an exporter.

The crop outlook in the Southern Hemisphere continues good. Australia and Argentine give every present indication of bumper crops.

It is impossible at this stage to estimate the European requirements. London cargo business is quiet, while Liverpool reports pressure to sell American winters.



Broomhall's of August 6, reports that rains in the United Kingdom are causing damage to the harvest in the Southern sections of that country. Trading in wheat was quiet, due to the holiday and the knowledge that there will be large crops in the exporting countries of the Northern Hemisphere and prospects of a generous crop in the Southern Hemisphere. European crop situation is reported the same as in the previous paragraph.

American winter and Canadian wheat have been offered freely, whilst the market reports quotations on Plata, Danubian, Russia and Australia wheats. Plata wheat supplies will be small until the new crop appears on the market. This should help reduce the North American surplus for export, but the millers and the merchants will greatly miss the good quality Plata which featured, the trade in the summer and the autumn of 1929.

The United States report for the week ended August 16th (a week later than the foregoing) states that domestic prices declined under increased offering of spring wheat and prospects of large supplies in the Northern Hemisphere. Scattered rains in the central west practically relieved the drought area.

It is stated that the stocks of old wheat in Europe will be almost 50,000,000 bushels less than last year, while the 1930 excluding Russian production may be about 75,000,000 to 100,000,000 bushels, below that of last season. The world shipments of wheat and wheatflour in bushels for the week ended August 16, were 14,119,000 bushels made up as follows: From North America 8,835,000 bushels, Argentine 908,000 bushels Australia 848,000 bushels and 3,528,000 bushels from other countries.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 15, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 15, show a net decrease of 3,493,463 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 95,599,678, Oats 6,848,675, Barley 20,529,984, Flax 427,157 and Rye 7,816,547 bush., a total of 131,222,041 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,052,264, Oats 96,044, Flax 4,471 and Rye 407,587, while Barley shows an increase of 66,903 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 129,572,371 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 100,763,531, Oats 15,846,070, Barley 9,098,811, Flax 345,228 and Rye 3,518,731 bush.

Western Country Elevators.- Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,288,244 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,193,506, Barley 100,625, Flax 6,032 and Rye 2,795, while Oats shows an increase of 14,714 bushels.


