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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the week ended March 6, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 1,710,068 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 1,263,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the week of 2,973,068 bushels from these ports.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended February 27, 1931. The quantity in store on March 6, 1931, was 189,873,574 bushels, compared with 190,558,154 bushels for the week ended February 27, 1931, while 206,652,783 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week 16,424,479 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 10,247,911 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The western country elevator shipments for the week ended March 6, 1931, amounted to 3,263,247 bushels, compared with 3,243,450 bushels for the week ended February 27, 1931. For the period from August 1st to March 6, 1931, wheat delivered at country points was 268,122,000, or 52,188,000 bushels more than the total of 215,934,000 bushels for the same period last year.


During the week ended March 7, 1931, 1,386 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,607 cars for the same week last year. Of the 1,386 inspected 54.5 per cent graded tough and damp, and 40.1 per cent graded within the contract grades.

The weather in the West during the past week has changed from mild to cold, with some further light snowfalls. Deliveries have been adversely affected, but although lower, are still about double those of the same days of 1930.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION.

Continued quiet and steady demand has characterized world wheat trade in the past week. The featured market information consisted of high estimates of wheat remaining on farms in the United States, the increase in the official acreage estimate of India and the lower private estimates of this year's probable production, and the tightening in the Argentine exchange rate. The Canadian share of world trade has shown a slight increase and the export sales reported on the Winnipeg market continue higher than the shipments registered. This is a partial cause of the recent firmness on that market.

For the third successive week, there was a decrease in the world shipments of wheat, until this week's clearances were only two million bushels less than those of the same week of 1930 and totalled slightly under 14 million bushels. North American shipments again showed a small increase and Argentine also shipped slightly higher quantities. Russian shipments of 992,000 bushels were more than double those of the previous week. Australian shipments registered a large decline.



For the first time since early January, the supplies of wheat on passage to Europe showed a decrease--falling from 57,880,000 to 55,360,000 bushels. European arrivals were again much higher and the total of 12,520,000 bushels is the highest figure since the second week of December, 1930. Italy, France, Belgium, Germany and Holland were the heavy importers. United Kingdom arrivals were 4,152,000 bushels compared with 3,264,000 bushels last week. Liverpool port stocks showed a further decline from 3,644,000 to 2,832,000 bushels. The monthly statement of United Kingdom ports gave stocks as 12,960,000 bushels on March 2nd, compared with 17,360,000 bushels on February 2nd.

The United States crop report of March 9th reporting stocks on farms on March 1st showed a total of 160,282,000 bushels for 1931, compared with 129,754,000 bushels last year at the same date and the ten-year average, 1920-29, of 143,983,000 bushels. The percentage of the previous crop shipped out of the country where grown was below average -- 59.4 per cent compared with 69.7 per cent last year and 67.4 per cent, the ten-year average, 1920-29. The visible supply of wheat again showed an increase of over a million bushels. Some sales were made under the new Farm Board policy, but the prices at which American Hard Winters were held tempted only the Belgian mills. The new policy is not causing any great pressure and the amount mentioned for sale is little more than would have been sold in the ordinary course of events. The weather in the winter wheat belt is still reported as favourable, with further helpful rain or snow.

The second official forecast of wheat acreage in India for the 1931 crop showed an increase over the first estimate and is now placed at 31,034,000 acres compared with 31,347,000 acres last year and 31,457,000 acres, the five-year average 1926-30. Favourable weather is prevailing for the early harvest. Broomehall reports that estimates of the crop are maintained around 336 million bushels compared with the record 1930 crop of 389 million bushels. Sub-average yields are expected in the early districts.

Reports from both the large wheat-producing countries of the Southern Hemisphere during the past week predict wheat acreage decreases for 1931-32. In the Argentine, the heavy wheat movement has caused a sharp advance in both exchange and freight rates, with a consequent firming of grain prices. The weather is reported as clear and hot, with showers. In Australia the wheat trade with the Orient is brisk and steady, and the weather is favourable for marketing. The Government plan for an export bonus of 6 pence per bushel on the 1930-31 crop will soon be submitted to the Federal Parliament.

Reports of the growing crops in Europe were quite favourable. Heavy snow and rain have fallen, with excess precipitation again reported from France. In England and in the important European countries, the offerings of native wheat are much reduced.

Russian shipments continue erratically up and down. The interior movement is delayed by deep snow and bad roads. According to Broomehall, the present trend of chartings does not suggest a heavy spring movement.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 6, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 6, show a net decrease of 943,903 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 189,873,574, Oats 13,694,614, Barley 28,878,725, Flax 2,105,515, and Rye 13,295,970 a total of 247,848,398 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 684,580 and 711,780 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 436,824, Flax 5,544 and Rye 10,089 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 261,993,820 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 206,652,783, Oats 13,478,365, Barley 27,290,748, Flax 951,074 and Rye 8,620,850 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 172,056 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 420,453, Barley 209,307 and Rye 10,718 bushels while Oats and Flax show increases of 468,317 and 105 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SAKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 78,457 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 82,418 bushels while Oats and Barley show increases of 204 and 3,151 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 606,722 bushels made up as follows, Wheat 592,482, Oats 13,399, Barley 99 and Rye 742 bushels.
