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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the week ended March 20, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 2,051,808 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 1,636,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the week of 3,737,808 bushels from these ports.

For the three weeks ending March 20, 1931, the movement by vessel from the winter ports of Saint John, N.B. and Vancouver, B.C. amounted to 5,041,069 bushels. The clearances from the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports were 4,488,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 9,529,069 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended March 13, 1931. The quantity in store on March 20, 1931, was 185,731,271 bushels, compared with 187,905,977 bushels for the week ended March 13, 1931, while 200,744,368 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week 14,434,277 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 9,792,015 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The western country elevator shipments for the week ended March 13, 1931, amounted to 2,225,299 bushels, compared with 2,655,256 bushels for the week ended March 6, 1931. For the period from August 1st to March 20, 1931, wheat delivered at country points was 271,339,000, or 53,556,000 bushels more than the total of 217,833,000 bushels for the same period last year.


During the week ended March 21, 1931, 1,732 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,355 cars for the same week last year. Of the 1,732 inspected 55.2 per cent graded tough and damp, and 37.3 per cent graded within the contract grades.

Deliveries of wheat in western Canada have been checked by the colder weather prevailing in the past few days. They are being maintained at such a level, however, that they nearly equal the export disappearance, which is much lower than for the same period of February. Reductions in the visible supply are lower than at this time last year.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

The only flurry in the quiet markets of the past week was caused by the formal announcement that the Federal Farm Board of the United States would not support the prices of the 1931 wheat crop in that country. Such an announcement had been very largely discounted in the prevailing prices of the May and July futures at Chicago and Winnipeg, but caused a sharp drop in the Chicago June future in which there is little trading. Winnipeg futures reacted less since they are nearer the world price basis.

Broomhall's International Review for the week was somewhat pessimistic regarding present wheat markets, but expects a later increase in both Oriental and European demand.



In spite of slightly increased world shipments during March, the movement of Canadian wheat into foreign markets has declined, and only the absence of selling pressure at Winnipeg has kept prices from larger declines.

Continental port stocks continued their downward course in the first half of March, the largest reductions being in Holland and Belgium. Liverpool stocks were slightly lower compared with last week. On passage supplies of wheat dropped nearly 3 million bushels to 53,120,000 bushels, but are still over 17 million bushels in excess of last year. Continental arrivals were 7,712,000 bushels last week compared with 4,976,000 bushels in the previous week and 3,848,000 bushels last year. Belgium and Italy took large supplies. The arrivals of wheat in the United Kingdom continued the increase which began in the second week of February, being 5,456,000 bushels compared with 4,072,000 bushels last week and only 1,661,248 bushels in the same week of February. Arrivals this week were the highest of the year. Reports received from the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Glasgow show increased imports during February, with Canada securing the bulk of the trade. Stocks in Glasgow rose 50 per cent during the month but are still lower than last year.

World shipments for the week were higher than for the previous week and over 7 million bushels higher than last year's figure for the same week. The total was 16,097,000 bushels, comprising 4,654,000 bushels from North America, 3,363,000 bushels from Argentine, 5,256,000 bushels from Australia, 2,576,000 bushels from the Black Sea and 248,000 bushels from other countries. Most of the Black Sea shipments (2,560,000 out of 2,576,000 bushels) were from Russia, bringing the total since August 1 up to 83,824,000 bushels compared with 2,320,000 bushels in the same period of the 1929-30 season. Australian shipments maintained the high level reached last week, while Argentine shipments remained lower than the recent average, partly because of a holiday on the 19th. North American shipments are lower than last year because of limited clearances of United States wheat.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam reports further arrivals of Russian wheat in the first week of March, after a period during February when there were no imports from that country. There were no imports of Russian wheat into Holland during the second week of March, United States, German, Argentine and Canadian wheat being favoured in that order. There are still large stocks of Russian wheat and rye in Rotterdam and Amsterdam, and it is reported that a syndicate of Dutch grain dealers has bought 135,000 tons of Russian rye for feeding purposes at the low price of about 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per bushel (very little above the track price at Winnipeg). From the same source comes the report that recent weather conditions throughout sections of western Europe have been unfavourable for grain crops. There have been severe floods in some parts with late but severe frost in other sections.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam reports that imports of wheat into Switzerland during February were 1,192,111 bushels compared with 1,053,164 bushels in February of 1930. Over two-thirds of the imports were of Canadian origin.

The imports of Canadian wheat into France in January and February of this year were 2,459,962 and 2,678,754 bushels respectively, according to official French figures.

A European despatch during the week contained the announcement that the Belgium government will soon remove the ban on the importation of Russian wheat and admit it free, using the prevailing milling regulation of 5 per cent of native wheat in all grists.

India has imposed an import duty of 91 cents per bushel.

The United States "Intentions to Plant" report is issued on the 26th of March and will be important for its bearing on the 1931 spring wheat crop.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED MARCH 20, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 20th, show a net decrease of 2,581,665 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: wheat 185,731,271, oats 14,363,461, barley 27,782,788, flax 2,118,059 and rye 13,345,726 bushels, a total of 243,341,305 bushels. Wheat and barley show decreases of 2,174,706 and 808,129 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in oats of 323,391, flax 3,726 and rye 74,053 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 254,190,029 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 200,744,368, oats 17,317,877, barley 26,539,226, flax 2,471,664 and rye 7,116,894 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 312,249 bushels. Wheat and flax show decreases of 653,319 and 2,235 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in oats of 255,007, barley 42,402 and rye 45,896 bushels.
