CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the week ended March 27, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 2,029,429 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 877,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the week of 2,906,429 bushels from these ports.

For the four weeks ending March 27, 1931, the movement by vessel from the winter ports of Saint John, N.B. and Vancouver, B.C. amounted to 7,070,498 bushels. The clearances from the United States Atlantic Seaboard ports were 5,365,000 bushels, making a total export movement of 12,435,498 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended March 20, 1931. The quantity in store on March 27, 1931, was 183,734,910 bushels, compared with 185,731,271 bushels for the week ended March 20, 1931, while 196,224,512 bushels were in store for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week 13,406,684 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 9,563,515 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The western country elevator shipments for the week ended March 20, 1931, amounted to 2,199,165 bushels, compared with 2,225,299 bushels for the week ended March 13, 1931. For the period from August 1st to March 27, 1931, wheat delivered at country points was 275,483,000, or 54,638,000 bushels more than the total of 220,845,000 bushels for the same period last year.

The weather in the West was much colder earlier in the week with some snowfall, but has now turned mild and clear again.

The Foreign Situation.

The important news of the week concerning wheat originated in Rome and Washington. The wheat conference at Rome is still in its early stages, but keen interest is displayed in proceedings because of the possibilities of agreements between both exporting and importing countries with a view to more orderly marketing of the available supplies.

The United States 'Intentions to Plant' report issued on March 26th showed the possibilities of extensive changes in the cropping plans of that country. Lower seedings of both durum and common spring wheats are indicated, compared with 1930 harvested acreages. For durum wheat the percentage was 76.1 of 1930 acreage and for other spring wheat, 88.0. On the basis of past comparisons of intentions and actually harvested acreages, durum wheat will cover 3,599,000 acres in 1931, the smallest acreage since 1918 and about 50 per cent of the record acreage of 1928. If the usual departure from intentions occurs, other spring wheat will be 14,083,000 acres in 1931, the lowest since 1924. The greatest relative acreage decreases have been registered in Washington (to offset winter wheat increase), Colorado, Illinois, Idaho, Minnesota, and the Dakotas.

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Of the 42,042,000 acres of winter wheat sown last fall, it is estimated that 39,759,000 acres will be harvested (according to appearances at March 1), which is less than average abandonment. The weather in the United States winter wheat belt has continued generally favourable, with heavy rain - and snowfalls recorded, particularly in Kansas.

World shipments declined over a million bushels to 14,932,000 bushels. There were lower clearances from North America, Australia, and the Black Sea, but higher shipments from the Argentine. The movement from Australia, Soviet Russia, and the Argentine is higher than at the same time last year, with North American movement appreciably lower than last year because of the limited appearance of United States wheat in foreign markets.

The quantities of wheat on passage increased slightly to 53,392,000 bushels, 19 million bushels in excess of last year's total at this time. The bulk of the wheat is consigned to the Continent and to orders. United Kingdom arrivals fell to 2,800,000 bushels, less than half of last week's figure. Continental arrivals were a million bushels lower than last week. Liverpool stocks were slightly lower.

The United States Department of Agriculture reports that although present conditions are favourable in some parts of France, indications point toward a considerable reduction in the French wheat acreage. In the Danube wheat basin, 1930 production and surplus estimates have been lowered. Broomhall's summary of foreign crop conditions showed generally favourable conditions in Europe and the United Kingdom. Harvesting in India is proceeding satisfactorily, but there are no indications of export movement.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Milan reports under date of March 18 that the wheat crop continues in satisfactory condition in nearly all Italian regions. During the month of February, snow has fallen in abundance, particularly in the mountain regions, with a lowering in the temperature; these factors, however, have not caused much damage to vegetation. Work is progressing well.

During the last few months, in view of improved prices, Italian wheat has been more widely offered. As regards foreign wheat, there is a reduction in the quantities of Russian wheat lying at Italian ports. A large part of this wheat has been absorbed by consumption, having been preferred on account of its more convenient prices as compared to the prices of wheat from other sources; much of this wheat has also been sold free on truck, and in many cases the buyer has the privilege of taking delivery within a more or less extended period of time - an average of 15 to 20 days.

The elevator company 'Torveglianza' reports that arrivals of wheat at Italian ports during February, 1931, amounted to 98,441 tons, of which 46,246 tons were Russian; 35,151 tons, North American; and 8,258 tons, Australian.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam reports that imports of wheat into Holland during February were 46,435 tons, of which 33,172 tons originated in Russia, 4,944 tons in the United States, and 3,204 tons in Canada. The Russian imports are much higher than was indicated by weekly arrivals.

United States exports of wheat and flour combined during February are officially reported as 3,564,000 bushels compared with 9,343,000 bushels last year, the season's total now being 96,024,000 bushels compared with 116,347,000 bushels last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED MARCH 27, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 27th, show a net decrease of 1,830,437 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 183,734,910, Oats 14,598,314, Barley 27,725,493, Flax 2,086,491 and Rye 13,365,660 bushels a total of 241,510,868 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,996,361, Barley 57,295 and Flax 31,568 bushels while Oats and Rye show increases of 234,853 and 19,934 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 248,553,813 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 196,224,512, Oats 16,553,284, Barley 26,202,416, Flax 973,214 and Rye 8,600,387 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 188,929 bushels. Wheat and Flax show decreases of 612,402 and 5,000 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 398,341, Barley 1,063 and Rye 29,069 bushels.

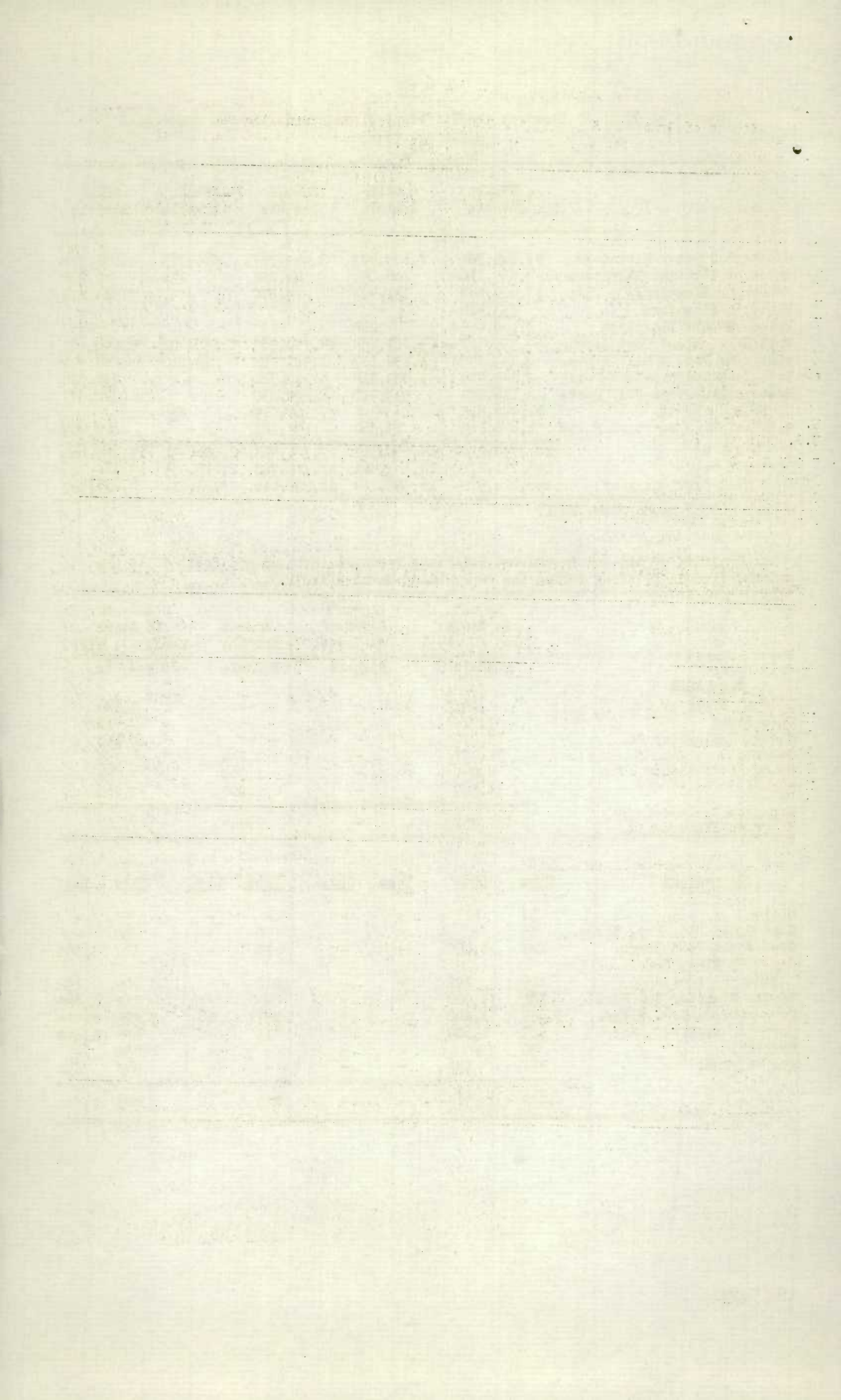
