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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

According to elevator reports for the period from April 1st to April 17th, 1931, from Saint John and Vancouver, 3,556,578 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 3,449,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the period of 7,005,578 bushels from these ports.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended April 10th, 1931. The quantity in store on April 17th, 1931, was 172,651,244 bushels, compared with 179,513,206 bushels for the week ended April 10th, 1931, while 187,350,901 bushels were in store for the week ended April 18th last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on April 17th, 7,057,206 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, of which 5,117,997 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The western country elevator shipments for the period ended April 10th, amounted to 4,801,924 bushels, compared with 3,880,017 bushels for the week ended March 31st, 1931. For the period from August 1st to April 10th, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 282,144,639, or 60,179,415 bushels more than the total of 221,965,224 bushels for the period from August 1st to April 11th, 1930.

After a period of unseasonably warm, dry, and windy weather in the West it has now become much cooler and there have been scattered snowfalls. The precipitation, however, has not been adequate nor general enough to relieve the soil moisture situation. Complaints are becoming more numerous. The delay in seeding operations has occasioned an increase in deliveries of wheat to country elevators, and these daily receipts are now about triple those of the same dates in 1930. Despite the heavy deliveries, the Canadian visible statements continue to decline. There was a revival of export interest last week and with the opening of lake navigation, considerable quantities of wheat are in transit from the Head of the Lakes. Further amounts are being shipped from Buffalo by rail to replenish the low stocks at the American seaboard.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

A renewed foreign interest in Canadian wheat last week carried prices up to the highest levels reached in the past two months. Previous to this upturn, the spread between the prices of Canadian and of Argentine and Australian wheat had narrowed somewhat.

The better demand for wheat was accompanied by dry weather in the North American spring wheat belt and by freezing temperatures in the United States winter wheat areas. Since the beginning of this week, export demand has declined and some precipitation has fallen in the West, causing a sharp decline in prices. There was also some uncertainty due to new reports regarding the policies of the United States Farm Board.

Milling quotas have recently been altered in both France and Germany, the former now permitting 20 per cent of foreign wheat in grists and the latter 50 per cent.

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Statistics of the past week were more satisfactory from the exporters' stand-point. World shipments increased over 3 million bushels, Argentine and Canada being largely responsible. Argentine shipments were the largest of the season. The supplies of wheat on passage increased about $2\frac{1}{2}$ million bushels and are nearly 10 million bushels in excess of 1930 figures. Continental arrivals were much lower at 4,448,000 bushels, only Belgium and France taking good quantities. Italy and Germany have been moderate buyers recently. United Kingdom arrivals were slightly higher than in the previous week.

Reports from European countries on conditions of the growing crops were less satisfactory than in recent weeks. The Indian harvest is proceeding favourably.

According to a cablegram received from the Indian Government on April 23rd, the 1931 wheat crop of that country is estimated at 346,827,000 bushels from an area of 31,609,000 acres. The final estimates for 1930 were 386,512,000 bushels from 31,347,000 acres. Despite a slight increase of 0.8 per cent in acreage, the forecasted production is 10.3 per cent lower.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Glasgow has favoured us with reports showing that imports of wheat into that port during March were higher than last year, with Canadian and Australian sorts predominating. The importations of Canadian wheat caused an increase in port stocks at March 31st compared with February 28th, and stocks are more than double those of last year at this time.

The exports of wheat from the United States remain very low, amounting to only 136,000 bushels in the week ending April 11th. Since July 1st, 58,049,000 bushels have been exported compared with 76,797,000 bushels last year. 56,314,000 bushels of Canadian wheat have been cleared in transit from the United States compared with 39,650,000 bushels last year in the period from July 1st to April 12th. The exports of both United States and of Canadian flour in transit are lower than in 1929-30, 9,324,000 barrels of United States flour and 1,116,000 barrels of Canadian flour have been exported in the season up to April 11th, with the comparable figures for 1929-30 being 10,355,000 barrels and 1,554,000 barrels respectively.

The estimated stocks of wheat on United States farms were 114,983,000 bushels at April 1st, compared with 102,352,000 bushels last year at the same date. Disappearance during March was 45,299,000 bushels, the largest in the six-year period covered by the reports.

According to a Broomhall report of April 18th, the French Government is now permitting the use of a further 5 per cent of foreign flour in the grists in that country. The total allowance is now 20 per cent.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED APRIL 17, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 17, show a net decrease of 9,129,132 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 172,651,244, Oats 14,304,498, Barley 25,571,203, Flax 2,014,002 and Rye 13,598,090 bushels, a total of 228,139,037 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 6,861,962, Oats 635,993, Barley 1,666,583 and Flax 56,142 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 91,548 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 236,663,661 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 187,350,901, Oats 14,616,986, Barley 25,135,004, Flax 898,631 and Rye 8,662,139 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 1,675,164. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,356,867, Oats 311,893 and Flax 15,302 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 5,991 and 3,407 bushels respectively.




