Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 8,841,100 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended August 22, 1930, making a total of 8,873,164 bushels for the first three weeks of the month. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended July 21, were 1,908,461 bushels, a total of 4,409,426 for the period of three weeks. This makes a total water movement of 11,282,590 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a reduction from the previous week ending Aug. 15, 1930. The quantity in store on Aug. 22, 1930 was 91,114,715 bushels, compared with 95,599,678 bushels last week and 100,068,294 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity in store for the week, 11,790,203 bushels are in elevators at United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

Shipments from Western Country Elevators show a further reduction from the previous week being 1,066,332 bushels, compared with 1,582,589 bushels in the previous week. Wheat stocks in all the elevators show decreases with the exception of the Interior Terminal and Vancouver Elevators - the net decrease amounted to 4,484,963 bushels. Western inspection returns for the week ended August 21, 1930, were 3,426 cars against 493 cars of old crop wheat in the same week last year. There were also 903 cars of new crop wheat inspected for the week ended August 21, 1930 while 142 cars were accounted for in the same week of last year.

The movement from farms to elevators in Western Canada continues heavier and earlier than last year, mainly due to ideal threshing weather in Manitoba. Rain has hindered harvesting in Saskatchewan and Alberta. During the week ended August 22nd, 6,494,000 bushels were delivered at western country points as compared with 2,599,591 bushels in the same week of last year.

FOREIGN WHEAT SITUATION

Although British reports are still featured by dullness and lack of interest, world export shipments of wheat have again been high. For the fifth successive week, world shipments in the week ending August 22nd exceeded those of the same week of 1929 and amounted to 17,418,000 bushels. The North American proportion of the total increased again, largely due to the fading supplies of Argentino wheat and reduced shipments from India. Australia and Russia also show significant increases. With lower stocks in the United Kingdom, Europe, Argentina and Australia and with prices much lower and still subject to erratic dips, it seems probable that the present volume of trade in wheat will last for some time and in the next few months, North America will have the opportunity to sell more freely than was the case at this time last year. Canadian visible supplies will soon begin to increase, but a much larger proportionate demand should appear compared with last season. Canadian exports of wheat in the four months, August to November, 1929, were about one third of those of the same period of 1928. This was due largely to the Argentino situation, where shipments in the same four months of 1929 were 3½ times those of August to November, 1928. European demand will likely increase in the next few months with increased realization of their lower wheat stocks and production and smaller available supplies of corn, rye and potatoes. The lower prices should induce new demands for both human and live stock consumption. Uncertain factors still remain in the economic depression with its concomitant lower purchasing power and in the extent to which European countries will find it advisable to modify their import duties and milling requirements to meet a new situation.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 22, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending August 22nd, show a net decrease of 3,824,808 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 91,114,715, Oats 6,515,244, Barley 21,220,285, Flax 430,698 and Rye 8,116,291 bushels, a total of 127,397,233 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 4,484,963 and 333,431 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Barley of 690,301, Flax 3,541 and Rye 299,744 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 128,672,884 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 100,068,294, Oats 15,442,959, Barley 9,023,719, Flax 365,732 and Rye 3,772,130 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show a net decrease of 137,900 bushels. Wheat and Flax show decreases of 196,328 and 1,765 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 37,430, Barley 846 and Rye 21,917 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 44,141 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 50,648 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 5,433 and 1,024 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 924,342 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 927,490 bushels and Oats show a decrease of 3,143 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Stock at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAMS AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the head of the lakes show a net decrease of 1,163,717 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 1,517,524 and 73,733 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Barley of 284,134, Flax 5,271 and Rye 137,135 bushels.






