CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended May 1, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 4,890,730 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 1,620,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 6,510,730 bushels.

According to elevator reports for the period from April 1st to May 1st, 1931, from Canadian Seaboard ports, 9,491,565 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from the United States Atlantic ports amounted to 6,527,000 bushels, making total export clearances during the period of 16,018,565 bushels from these ports.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended April 24th, 1931. The quantity in store on May 1, 1931, was 158,851,062 bushels, compared with 164,573,149 bushels for the week ended April 24, 1931, while 175,965,493 bushels were in store for the week ended May 2nd last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on May 1st, 2,776,303 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 1,970,309 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The western country elevator shipments for the period ended April 24th, amounted to 1,813,848 bushels, compared with 1,697,833 bushels for the week ended April 17th, 1931. For the period from August 1st to April 24th, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 285,820,841, or 62,841,644 bushels more than the total of 222,979,197 bushels for the period from August 1st to April 25, 1930.

During the week ended April 30th, 3,916 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,995 cars for the same week last year. Of the 3,916 cars inspected, 1,510 cars or 38.5 p.c. graded tough and damp and 1,963 cars or 50.2 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the week ended April 30th amounted to 4,907,382 bushels. The distribution of which was as follows:-

To Canadian Lower Lake ports 2,345,599 bushels,
To Montreal 1,561,955 bushels, and to Buffalo 999,828 bushels.

The weather in the West has continued unsettled, but with fewer high winds and some precipitation. Over most of the important wheat-producing regions, rain and warmth are urgently required. Seeding has progressed rapidly in Manitoba and is now nearly completed. Snow hindered operations to some extent. In Saskatchewan and Alberta, seeding is not so far advanced, since the weather and soil conditions have been unsatisfactory, with reduced acreages probable.

Country elevator deliveries have remained over a quarter million bushels daily despite the concentration on seeding and the preparation of land.

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THE FOREIGN SITUATION

The feature of foreign trade in wheat during the present month to date has been the increased volume of export from Canada. The supplies of native wheat and of imported sorts in the United Kingdom, France, Germany and Italy are low, and trade observers expect further relaxation of continental restrictions to fill the demands up to the next European harvest. Australia is shipping freely, but the continuance of high shipments to the Orient is a helpful influence to the other exporting countries feeding the European market. Russian shipments have fallen very low and Broomhall does not expect them to assume large proportions again until July or August. There is evident concern in that country over the slow progress of seeding operations. Argentine shipments continue at an even level, the low exchange rates helping to draw demand. The steady world buying has kept prices firm, with recent tendencies to advance.

The weather in southern Europe has been generally satisfactory for crops, but northern European countries are reporting higher-than-usual winter-killing and delayed seeding of spring crops. The winter wheat crop in the United States is one of unusual promise, but opposite conditions prevail over the hard spring wheat territory.

At the present time, the large supplies of wheat in the United States constitute the important bear factor overhanging the market. The other main exporting countries have heavy supplies but these are being reduced at normal rates.

After a long interval, when no Indian wheat has been on the international market, Broomhall reports the sale of a parcel to England for May-June shipment.

World shipments for the past week were about $1\frac{1}{2}$ million bushels higher than the previous week and considerably higher than shipments in the same week of 1930 or 1929. North American shipments were the highest since early December of last year. Argentine clearances also increased but Australian shipments were lower and there was no wheat cleared from Russia. Continental arrivals were 6,968,000 bushels, compared with 5,208,000 bushels last week and 4,600,000 bushels last year. Belgium, France, Holland and Greece took the largest supplies. United Kingdom arrivals were also higher at 3,200,000 bushels. The quantities of wheat on passage showed a moderate increase at 48,056,000 bushels. Liverpool stocks were again lower and on May 4th were 2,064,000 bushels. Continental port stocks are very low, with the exception of Rotterdam, which has 2,207,000 bushels.

The United States Department of Agriculture reports that stocks of wheat in interior mills and elevators were 71,208,000 bushels at April 1, a reduction of 11,632,000 bushels since March 1. This decrease is regarded as a normal disappearance.

CONTINUING INSTRUCTION

8. The eighth step is to determine the methods of evaluation. These methods should be designed to measure the progress of the pupils, and should be based on the principles of education.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED MAY 1, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 1, show a decrease of 7,367,837 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 158,851,062, Oats 12,792,528, Barley 23,868,615, Flax 1,804,415, and Rye 13,542,197 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,722,087, Oats 1,208,119, Barley 247,120, Flax 118,075 and Rye 72,436 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 222,501,092 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 175,965,493, Oats 12,903,172, Barley 24,221,554, Flax 849,374 and Rye 8,561,499 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 3,291,328 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 2,437,723, Oats 746,003, Barley 28,000, Flax 65,034 and Rye 14,568 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a decrease of 511,878 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 492,026, Oats 18,703, and Barley 1,149 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 638,809 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 589,140 and 51,056 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 1,387 bushels.


