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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended May 15, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 5,052,867 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 2,501,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 7,553,867 bushels.

For the two weeks ended May 14, 1931, the quantity of wheat cleared from Canadian Seaboard ports, according to elevator returns were 10,381,038 bushels. The amount of Canadian wheat exported from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports is shown to be 4,061,000 bushels, making a total export clearance of 14,442,038 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended May 8th, 1931. The quantity in store on May 15, 1931, was 146,082,871 bushels, compared with 152,418,424 bushels for the week ended May 8th, 1931, while 161,339,047 bushels were in store for the week ended May 16th, last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on May 15th, 5,915,845 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 5,010,288 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.


The shipments from the western country elevators for the week ended May 8, amounted to 4,019,979 bushels, compared with 4,367,343 bushels for the week ended May 1st, 1931. For the period from August 1 to May 8, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 288,547,230 bushels or 64,511,508 bushels more than the total of 224,035,722 bushels for the period August 1 to May 9, 1930.

During the week ended May 14, 2,458 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 1,469 cars for the same week last year. Of the 2,458 cars inspected, 648 cars or 26.3 p.c. graded tough and damp and 1,496 cars or 60.9 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the week ended May 14, 1931, amounted to 6,450,757 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake Ports 1,759,570 bushels, to Montreal 392,634 bushels and to Buffalo 4,298,553 bushels.

During the past week the crop situation in the West has been improved somewhat by showers and snowfalls rather generally scattered, but most helpful in Manitoba and Alberta. The precipitation was accompanied by lower temperatures, falling below freezing at some points. High winds were again recorded, causing some damage to growing crops. A general soaking rain is still the great necessity, especially in Saskatchewan.

Work on the land has restricted deliveries during the past few weeks, but recent daily reports show an increasing tendency.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED MAY 15, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 15, 1931, show a net decrease of 8,583,501 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 146,082,871, Oats 12,343,235, Barley 19,261,006, Flax 1,651,696, and Rye 13,552,648, a total of 192,891,456 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 6,335,553, Oats 360,789, Barley 1,824,307 and Rye 104,844, while flax shows an increase of 41,992 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 206,159,608 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 111,339,047, Carts 11,780,733, Barley 23,848,291, Flax 714,775, and Rye 8,476,762 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 3,268,424 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,728,780, Oats 4,641,611, Barley 27,378, Flax 18,738 and Rye 29,367 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a decrease of 372,882 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 353,637, Oats 17,516 and Barley 1,729 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 163,499 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 216,582 bushels and Rye 107 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 50,152, and Barley 3,038 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 58,624 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks at this elevator show no change.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 4,319,381 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,307,130, Oats 482,853, Barley 584,634, and Flax 6,529 bushels, while an increase of 61,865 bushels is shown in Rye.
