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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended May 29, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 5,358,601 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 984,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 6,342,601 bushels.

For the four weeks ended May 29, 1931, the quantity of wheat cleared from Canadian Seaboard ports, according to elevator returns was 20,795,109 bushels. The amount of Canadian wheat exported from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports is shown to be 6,364,000 bushels, making a total export clearance of 27,159,109 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended May 22, 1931. The quantity in store on May 29, 1931, was 155,575,299 bushels, compared with 140,896,108 bushels for the week ended May 22, 1931, while 142,630,418 bushels were in store for the week ended May 30th, last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on May 29th, 5,991,729 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 4,644,423 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N. Y.

The shipments from the western country elevators for the week ended May 22, amounted to 4,433,484 bushels, compared with 3,672,298 bushels for the week ended May 15, 1931. For the period from August 1st, 1930, to May 22nd, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 291,692,852 bushels or 65,545,740 bushels more than the total of 226,147,112 bushels for the period August 1st, 1929, to May 23rd, 1930.

During the week ended May 31, 4,263 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 3,115 cars for the same week last year. Of the 4,263 cars inspected, 562 cars or 13.18 p.c. graded tough, and damp, and 3,373 cars or 79.24 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the period ended May 31, 1931, amounted to 6,665,509 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake Ports 3,061,689 bushels, to Montreal 585,556 bushels, to Sorel 94,000 bushels, and to Buffalo 2,924,264 bushels.

The condition of grain crops in Western Canada was reported as seriously low by the telegraphic correspondents of the Bureau on June 1st. Only limited areas on the fringe of the main grain producing section are reported as having favourable moisture conditions. In the central region, drought, high winds, frost and cutworms have caused great damage. This situation has only been partly corrected by the rains of June 2 and 3, and further precipitation is urgently required.

Seeding operations have advanced rapidly and farmers have been able to deliver grain in increasing volume during the past week.

THE FOREIGN SITUATION

Although the movement of grain on the Great Lakes continues in good volume, there has been a decided recent reduction in foreign demand and world movement. The improvement of European crop conditions and continued high prospects from the American winter wheat areas have discouraged millers from any extensive commitments. Continental arrivals have fallen off and port stocks have increased slightly in the past two weeks, indicating a reduced milling consumption. It is not likely that this condition will be prolonged, considering European crop prospects and present stocks.

The declines in world movement during the past week were due to lower clearances from North America, Argentine, and Russia. The movement from Australia also remained much lower than the average weekly movement since the first of the year. Clearances are well above those of this time last year and even in excess of the movement in the record season, 1928-29.

The movement of wheat into Germany is undoubtedly restricted by the fact that millers will not buy extensively with the present hope of a reduced duty.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Rotterdam has favoured us with the following report on crop conditions in Switzerland:

"A report on crop conditions in Switzerland, dated May 15th, and issued by the Swiss Peasants Union indicates that winter wheat is considerably below the ten year average and also much poorer in condition than was the case a year ago. On the basis of 100 as the average for a ten year period, the position of wheat, as well as other grains, on the 1st May 1931, as also on the same date for the preceding four years and on the 1st April of the present year was as follows:-

As you are aware the Swiss Government subsidizes the production of domestic wheat and during the last few years the yield has averaged about 120,000 metric tons. Imports in 1929 were 466,727 metric tons and in 1930 479,843 metric tons. During the latter period, Canada supplied 246,516 metric tons out of the total."

Recent reports show that the seeding in Russia is proceeding more rapidly, but is still backward in Siberia.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED MAY 29, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 29, 1931 show a net decrease of 7,199,553 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 135,575,299, Oats 11,005,596, Barley 15,940,723, Flax 1,270,307, and Rye 12,618,150 bushels a total of 176,410,075 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,320,809 Barley 1,102,240 Flax 184,501 and Rye 728,143 while Oats shows an increase of 36,140 bushels. Stocks for the same week last year were as follows:- Wheat 139,997,519 Oats 18,468,960, Barley 14,299,488, Flax 931,943 and Rye 3,933,461 bushels making a total of 177,631,371 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 3,585,792 bushels made up as follows Wheat 2,951,884 Oats 248,939, Barley 258,981 Flax 39,589 and Rye 86,299 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a decrease of 27,480 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 26,381, Oats 822 and Barley 277 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 355,810 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 321,494, Barley 20,417 and Rye 13,146 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 247 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks show a decrease of 648,853 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,508,483 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,308,905, Barley 447,727 and Flax 53,941 bushels while Oats and Rye show increases of 198,791 and 103,299 bushels respectively.



CANADIAN GRAIN IN STORE, May 29, 1931.


