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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended June 19, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard Ports, 3,669,412 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 834,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 4,503,412 bushels.

For the three weeks ended June 19, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports 11,025,998 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 1,997,000 bushels, making a total clearance for the period of 9,233,181 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended June 12, 1931. The quantity in store on June 19, 1931, was 122,617,720 bushels, compared with 125,744,673 bushels for the week ended June 12, 1931, while 128,573,296 bushels were in store for the week ended June 20, last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on June 19, 5,238,642 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 4,122,820 bushels are stored at Buffalo, N.Y.

The shipments from the western country elevators for the week ended June 12, amounted to 6,207,112 bushels, compared with 6,841,377 bushels for the week ended June 5, 1931. For the period from August 1st, 1930, to June 12, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 297,463,523 bushels or 67,912,020 bushels more than the total of 229,551,503 bushels for the period August 1st, 1929, to June 13, 1930.

During the week ended June 21, 5,538 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 5,542 cars for the same week last year. Of the 5,538 cars inspected, 626 cars 11.30 p.c. graded tough, and damp, and 4,479 cars or 80.08 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the period from June 15th to 21st, 1931, amounted to 1,579,080 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake Ports 282,767 bushels, to Montreal 355,577 bushels, to Buffalo 613,954 bushels, and other United States ports 326,782 bushels.

Rains have fallen generally in west over week end of June 22, although not heavy, the dry areas of Saskatchewan were benefited. According to the weather forecast further rains were promised in many localities in Saskatchewan and Alberta. Later, Alberta reports copious rains have fallen in large sections of the provinces, which will provide moisture for the crops. General prospects look good.

Wheat deliveries to the country elevators continue in advance of those of the same weeks last year.





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Foreign Situation.

During the week, the grain market was unsettled by the announcement of the Hoover Proposal to extend for one year the payment of the war obligations of the countries of Germany, France, Belgium and the United Kingdom. This together with the report, that the Farm Board selling policy would not be changed sent the wheat prices up, but the rise was only of temporary duration. It is realized that the Continental countries of Europe will not modify their extreme protectionist measures. Continental arrivals have increased during the week, being 10,512,000 bushels, as compared with 8,880,000 bushels for the previous week.

The Italian wheat crop, according to threshing returns so far, indicate a production of 240,000,000 bushels. The previous year's crop amounted to 213,600,000 bushels. The Canadian Trade Commissioner at Milan, Italy, reports as follows on the "compulsory milling of Italian wheat":- "Representation have been made to the Italian Government to maintain the price of wheat at artificial levels. The request was not granted, but a committee was formed for the purpose of ascertaining what could be done for Italian farmers. The results of their deliberations were as follows:

1. To introduce legislation to compel millers to use a certain amount of Italian wheat in the flour. The percentage to be fixed by the Ministry of Agriculture.
2. A system of Agricultural credits to be established to prevent farmers selling their crop to speculators at low prices.
3. The Government to purchase 500,000 quintals of Italian wheat from the growers for cash for army purposes.

According to Broomhall, the adoption of the foregoing has stopped overseas buying and caused reselling.

According to statistics furnished by the Canadian Trade Commissioner in Holland, the bulk of the arrivals of wheat for the week ended May 30, were from Canada, the amount being 22,299 tons, with the United States contributing 10,795 tons, Argentine 10,350, and Germany 925 tons.

The visible supply in the United States has decreased 1,539,000 bushels for the week, the total is however, 80,000,000 bushels over last year. The Farm Board states that sales abroad will continue so long as they do not disturb the world market.

The crop prospects in France has improved. Native offers of wheat are small with the result there is better demand for foreign grain. North African wheat is being offered freely at lower prices.

Russian shipments amounted to 176,000 bushels during the week ended June 18, making a total since August 1, of 90,792,000 bushels as compared with 5,672,000 bushels for the previous year.

The following cablegrams have been received from the International Institute in Rome:-

"Russia (Soviet) area sown this season in thousand of acres up to June 5, Wheat 59,546, Barley 14,216, Oats 36,288".

"Russia (Soviet) June 1, cereal crop condition generally average. In several districts principal producing regions winter Wheat and Rye above average".

"Spain, Current year forecasts Wheat, 143,298,090 bushels: Rye, 19,684,250 bushels; Barley, 87,268,140 bushels; Oats 38,905,440 bushels."

The German crop is forecasted to be 18,400,000 bushels more than that of the year 1930. France reports crop fair to good.





CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS -- WEEK ENDED JUNE 19, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending June 19, 1931, were 159,038,288 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 122,617,720, Oats 9,835,848 Barley 12,643,503, Flax 1,294,399 and Rye 159,935,288 bushels. A decrease is noted in Wheat of 3,126,953, Oats 544,488 and Barley 734,814 bushels while flax and rye show increases of 6,715 and 39,165 respectively. Figures for the corresponding week last year were as follows: Wheat 128,573,296, Oats 9,045,434, Barley 22,620,217 Flax 513,830, Rye 2,445,490 making a total of 169,198,267 bushels,

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Stocks of grain in store show a decrease of 4,601,627 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 4,361,605, Oats 65,433, Barley 104,162, Flax 22,360 and Rye 48,067 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON MOOSE JAW) Shows a net decrease of 27,484 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 15,731, oats 9,682, flax 10, and rye 1,621 bushels while barley shows an increase of 560 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS: Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 1,196,334 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 1,166,398 and 39,280 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 3,157 and Rye 6,187 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR: Wheat stocks at this elevator show no change.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR: Stocks at this elevator remains nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND POPE ARTHUR) Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 732,363 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,827,939, Flax 34,585 and Rye 68,516 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 234,337 and 964,340 bushels respectively.

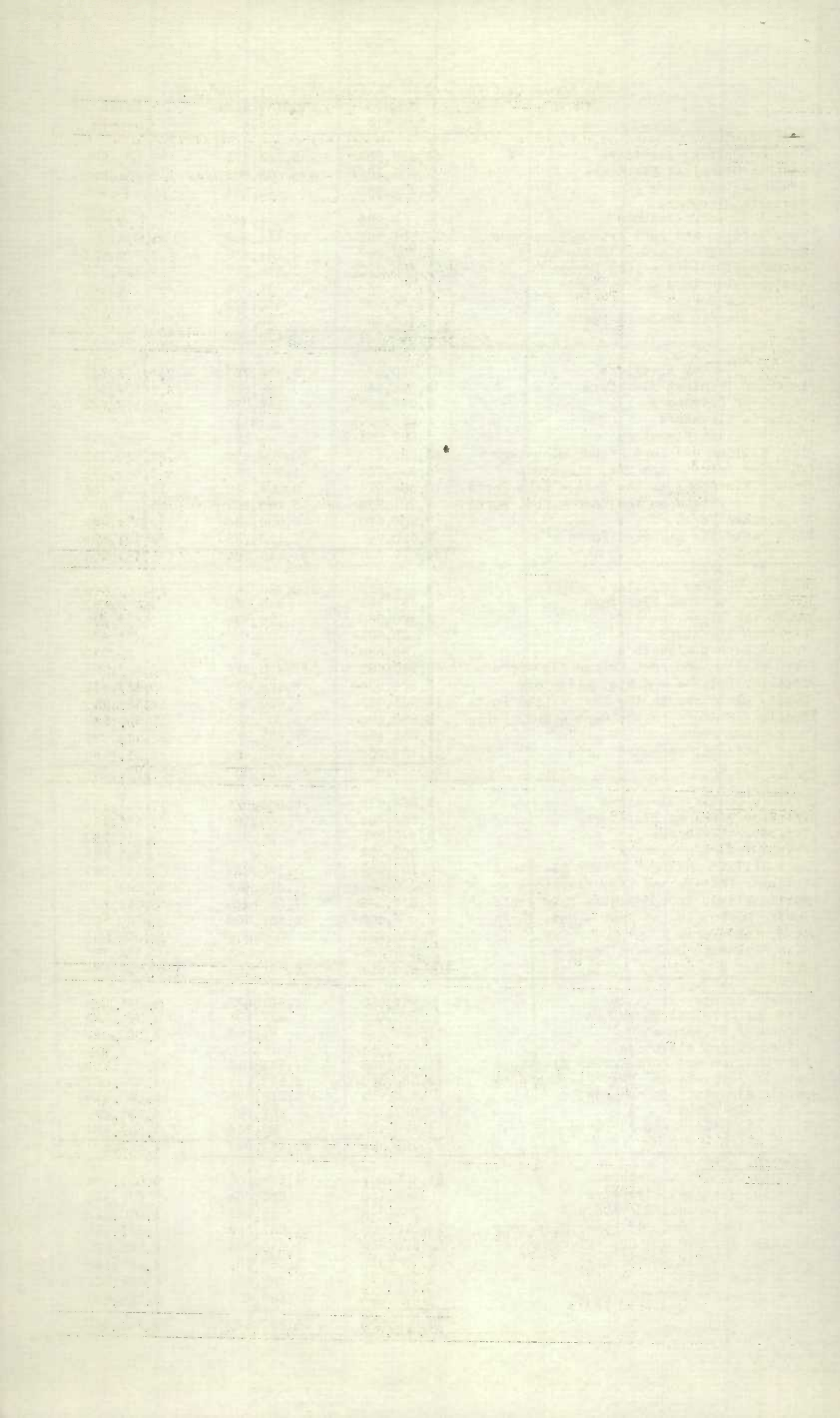
