#### CANADIAN THEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended July 3, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian seaboard ports, 2,469,647 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic seaboard ports amounted to 978,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 3,447,647 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended June 26, 1931. The quantity in store on July 3, 1931, was 116,903,807 bushels, compared with 119,498,016 bushels for the week ended June 26, 1931, while 121,664,270 bushels were in store for the week ended July 4, last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on July 3, 5,962,349 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 4,896,030 bushels are in store and afloat at Buffalo, N.Y.

The shipments from the western country elevators for the week ended June 26, amounted to 4,828,475 bushels, compared with 9,220,034 bushels for the week ended June 19, 1931. For the period from August 1st, 1930, to June 26, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 300,658,389 bushels or 69,383,713 bushels more than the total of 231,274,686 bushels for the period August 1st, 1929 to June 27, 1930.


During the week ended June 30, 6,672 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 5,722 cars for the same week last year. Of the 6,672 cars inspected, 792 cars or 11.87 p.c. graded tough, and damp, and 5,373 cars or 80.53 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the week ended June 30, 1931, amounted to 3,375,060 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows: To Canadian lower lake ports 838,561 bushels, to Montreal 354,562 bushels, to Buffalo 1,992,893 bushels, to other U.S.Lake ports 189,044 bushels.

Cool and rainy weather has prevailed in the West during the past week, causing a slight, but general, improvement in wheat prospects and a considerable improvement in the prospects for the late-sown grains. The condition report released on Thursday showed by far the poorest crop situation at the end of June that has ever been reported by the Bureau. The condition of wheat in every district of Manitoba and Saskatchewan declined during June, and in the southern districts, the changes were tremendous. Three of the largest and most important wheat-producing districts of Saskatchewan promised only one-quarter of an average crop at June 30, and many more of the wheat districts in all three provinces showed prospects of only half a crop. Even with the more favourable weather prevailing to date in July, there are indications of drastically reduced yields of grain crops.


The winter wheat crop in Ontario has suffered from hot, dry weather and premature ripening will cause some reduction in yield.

Deliveries of wheat at western country elevators are being maintained at higher levels than prevailed in the late weeks of the 1929-30 season, but are lower than they have been recently, probably accounted for by general attention to summer fallowing.



#### The Foreign Situation.

The present feeling in the world wheat markets is bearish, but there is a better feeling with regard to the future when the full effect of the reduced North American spring wheat supplies and lower acreages in the Southern Hemisphere has been realized. At present, the pressure of deliveries of new winter wheat in the United States has a depressing effect. Supplies on passage are much higher than a year ago and there are renewed advices regarding Russian offers. In the face of better domestic crop prospects and in expectation of continued exporters competition, the European importers are not purchasing freely. However, a contemplation of the future is more encouraging. The spring wheat crop in North America will be very short, even if favoured with optimum conditions in the remaining weeks of the growing season. Thus the pressure of North American shipments on the international market usual in the late months of the year will be greatly reduced this autumn. To date, the Farm Board has persisted in its intention to hold the bulk of its wheat supplies for higher levels and then sell at a limited and determined rate. Private exporters in the United States are selling very small quantities. In the Argentine, financial conditions in the rural districts and the difficulties of ploughing and sowing in the hard, dry soil will lead to a large decrease in the seeded area. Latest reports from Australia show further excessive rains, particularly in the East, and private advices now mention the possibility of a 40 per cent acreage reduction. The amount of wheat visible remains considerably under the supplies of a year ago. Unless there is a change to very favourable weather conditions in Argentine and Australia, it seems probable that lower supplies from these countries will be pressed on world markets in the early months of 1932 than was the case in 1931. There is no completely authentic information available on Russian crop prospects. The acreage increases have probably been realized and some regions report average weather conditions. Chartering for July and August shipment has commenced in anticipation of an exportable surplus at the Black Sea ports. It is notable that, in countries adjacent to Russia, for which information on the growing crops is available, the weather of spring and early summer was not favourable for growth. Wheat has suffered much less than rye, barley, and oats. The west-central countries of Europe have improved crop prospects recently, requiring upward revision of probable production. In the south and east-central states, severe heat and limited rainfall have injured the wheat crop during its most critical period. An important consideration with regard to wheat markets in the next crop year is how much revision in prevailing duties and regulatory measures will be required by the change in wheat harvests compared with those of 1930. It is not expected that the full constructive effect of such changes will become apparent until the spring of 1932, although in the immediate future it is likely the that the requirements of the largest European importing countries will be rather more completely filled by the new domestic crops.

### CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED JULY 3, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 3rd, 1931 show a net decrease of 3,118,626 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 116,903,807; Oats 9,071,428; Barley 12,527,593; Flax 1,042,089; and Rye 12,667,680, a total of 152,212,597 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,594,209; Oats 667,472; Flax 145,336; and Rye 39,988 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 328,379 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 161,334,107 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 121,664,270; Oats 8,566,661; Barley 22,116,558; Flax 440,539; and Rye 8,546,079 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 4,499,503 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 3,878,628; Oats 195,075; Barley 265,455; Flax 49,537; and Rye 110,808 bushels.


