

CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended July 10, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian seaboard ports, 1,983,062 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic seaboard ports amounted to 627,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 2,610,062 bushels.

For the two weeks ended July 10, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports 4,452,709 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 1,605,000 bushels, making a total clearance for the period of 6,057,709 bushels.

Wheat stocks show a decrease compared with the previous week ended July 3, 1931. The quantity in store on July 10, 1931, was 113,910,655 bushels, compared with 116,903,807 bushels for the week ended July 3, 1931, while 118,949,850 bushels were in store for the week ended July 11, last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store on July 10, 4,730,667 bushels are in elevators at the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, of which 3,801,671 bushels are in store and afloat at Buffalo, N.Y.


The shipments from the western country elevators for the week ended July 3, amounted to 4,772,926 bushels, compared with 4,828,475 bushels for the week ended June 26, 1931. For the period from August 1st, 1930, to July 3, 1931, wheat delivered at country elevators was 302,360,114 bushels or 70,155,152 bushels more than the total of 232,204,962 bushels for the period August 1st, 1929 to July 4, 1930.

During the week ended July 7, 2,953 cars of wheat were inspected, compared with 3,540 cars for the same week last year. Of the 2,953 cars inspected, 428 cars or 14.49 p.c. graded tough, and damp, and 2,269 cars or 76.83 p.c. were placed within the contract grades.

The quantity of wheat moved by vessel from the Head of the Lakes during the week ended July 7, 1931, amounted to 1,670,978 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows: To Canadian lower lake ports 547,300 bushels, to Montreal 542,065 bushels and to Buffalo 581,613 bushels.

The weather in the west remains generally favourable for growth. Recent rains have been concentrated mostly in Manitoba and in northern regions of the other provinces, so that the drought area of Saskatchewan and south-eastern Alberta is in need of further precipitation. There have been some damaging high winds in Saskatchewan and the first heavy losses from hail were reported early in the week. The first infections of stem rust were noted in southern Manitoba early in July. Because of the prevailing drought, rust has been later than usual in attacking the spring wheat areas of both the United States and Canada. Grasshoppers and wheat stem maggots are damaging crops in Manitoba, and it is reported that the use of poison bait for the killing of grasshoppers is being neglected because of the discouragingly short crops.

The deliveries of wheat to country elevators show a seasonal decline, but remain slightly in excess of last year's figures.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDED JULY 10, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending July 10th, 1931, shows net decrease of 4,634,312 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 113,910,655, Oats 9,150,508, Barley 11,189,667, Flax 881,040 and Rye 12,446,415, a total of 147,578,285 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,993,152, Barley 1,337,926, Flax 161,049 and Rye 221,265 bushels while Oats shows an increase of 79,080 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 158,487,448 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 118,949,850, Oats 8,470,130, Barley 22,056,834, Flax 447,182 and Rye 8,563,452 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 3,538,616. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,192,864, Barley 184,247, Flax 75,298 and Rye 90,356 bushels while Oats show an increase of 4,149 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW)... Show a decrease of 2,961 bushels. Wheat, Barley and Flax show decreases of 9,010, 173 and 27 bushels respectively while increases are noted in Oats of 4,614 and Rye 1,605 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 483,178 bushels. Wheat, Oats and Barley show increases of 483,619, 9,531 and 1,416 bushels respectively while decrease is noted in Rye of 11,388 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as shown previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 928,553 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 1,091,950 and 171,247 bushels respectively while decreases are noted in Oats of 102,605, Flax 94,568 and Rye 137,471 bushels.






