Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 2,429,857 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended September 5, 1930. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended September 7, were 5,815,613 bushels. This makes a total water movement of 8,245,470 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase from the previous week ending August 29, 1930. The quantity in store on September 5, 1930, was 99,003,497 bushels, compared with 91,152,722 bushels last week and 115,635,431 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 13,549,909 bushels are in elevators at United States Lakes and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

The rail movement continues to show an increase, due to heavy transport of grain into the Western Country Elevators. The vessel shipments for the week ended September 7 increased 2,344,005 bushels over the previous week, while Country Elevator shipments increased from 3,722,531 bushels to 5,963,811 bushels.

Inspections for the Western Division for the week ended September 7 show that 11,703 cars of New-crop Wheat were inspected against 6,368 cars for the same week of last year.


Deliveries to Western Country points amounted to 32,742,000 bushels for the week ended September 5, while for the same week last year the quantity was 16,123,000 bushels. For the period from August 1 to September 5, the Wheat received at Country points was 62,163,000 and 29,327,000 bushels for the years 1930 and 1929, respectively.

FOREIGN WHEAT SITUATION

World shipments of Wheat declined from 16,133,000 bushels in the week ended August 29th to 14,457,000 bushels in the week ended September 5th. This latter amount, however, is an increase over the same week of last year. North American weekly shipments amounted to 9,940,000 bushels, or twice the amount for the same week in 1929.

The import market was limited during the week ended August 29th, owing to the fact that the millers and merchants were confident that the market would go lower. Business is reported slow on account of the nervousness caused by the steady flow of Russian Wheat into the markets. The shipments to date amount to 7,408,000 bushels, while for the same period last year no shipments were reported.

One notable feature in connection with the world movement is the heavy reduction in the shipments of Argentine and Australian Wheats. For the week ended September 5, 1930, the Argentine shipments were 461,000 bushels against 6,000,000



bushels for the same week last year. Australia shipped 513,000 bushels, compared with 1,704,000 bushels in the same week last year.

In connection with the European situation, reports from France state that the crop is threshing out better than expected. Estimates now range from 220,000,000 to 260,000,000 bushels. The German crop estimate is now reduced, so that the crop may not be any larger than last year. Reports show that there is a large supply of Wheat even if there is a short crop in Canada, and if the United States use a large quantity of their Wheat for feeding purposes. Argentine and Australia promise a fairly good crop.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPT. 5, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 5, show a net increase of 8,904,124 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat, 99,003,497, Oats 5,969,059, Barley 21,973,483, Flax 451,737 and Rye 9,515,043, a total of 136,913,119 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 7,850,775, Barley 699,001, Flax 13,497 and Rye 387,550 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 46,499 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 147,252,376 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 115,535,431, Oats 14,840,004, Barley 11,727,174, Flax 362,982 and Rye 4,696,785 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 5,625,826 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 5,300,580, Barley 27,994, Flax 10,510 and Rye 317,856 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 31,114 bushels.
