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Export Movement of Canadian Wheat

Elevator reports from Montreal, Quebec, Sorel and Vancouver show that 3,267,557 bushels were shipped by vessel overseas during the week ended September 12, 1930. Shipments to Buffalo and other United States Lake Ports for the week ended September 14, were 6,534,349 bushels. This makes a total water movement of 9,801,906 bushels.

Wheat stocks show an increase from the previous week ending September 5, 1930. The quantity in store on September 12, 1930, was 118,743,059 bushels, compared with 99,003,497 bushels last week and 131,645,834 bushels for the same week last year.

Of the total quantity of wheat in store for the week, 16,171,993 bushels are in elevators at United States Lakes and Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

The rail movement continues to show an increase, due to heavy transport of grain into the Western Country Elevators. The vessel shipments for the week ended September 14 increased 1,484,764 bushels over the previous week, while Country Elevator shipments increased from 5,963,811 bushels to 18,848,820 bushels.

Deliveries to Western Country points amounted to 33,126,000 bushels for the week ended September 12, while for the same week last year the quantity was 21,172,000 bushels. For the period from August 1 to September 12, the Wheat received at Country points was 95,295,000 and 50,499,000 bushels for the years 1930 and 1929 respectively.

Inspections for the Western Division for the week ended September 12 show that 14,106 cars of new-crop Wheat were inspected against 8,747 cars for the same week of last year.

The grading for the above week's Wheat is shown to be high, some 12,272 cars being placed in the contract grades made up as follows:- No. 1 Hard Manitoba, 1,547 cars; No. 1 Northern, 71,651 cars; No. 2 Northern, 3,164 cars; No. 3 Northern, 306 cars.

FOREIGN SITUATION

The Bureau is in receipt of a communication from the Trade Commissioner at Milan, Italy, stating that the Wheat harvest in Yugo-Slavia this year has yielded 89,004,174 bushels, Barley 19,231,142 bushels, Rye 9,562,443 bushels and Oats 15,652,297 bushels.

The following cablegram was received from the International Institute in Rome to the Department of Agriculture stating as follows:- "Australia Wheat August New South Wales minor damage frost and diseases in some districts, prospects otherwise good. Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia conditions very promising prospects above average area sown this season in thousand acres 17,491."

World shipments of Wheat dropped to 12,755,000 bushels during the week ended September 12 from 14,457,000 bushels for the previous week. This is, however, an increase over the same week last year. North American weekly shipments amounted to 7,687,000 bushels, compared with 6,944,000 bushels for the same week in 1929.

Argentine and Australia shipments continued relatively small, consisting of 392,000 and 550,000 bushels respectively.

The import market trade during the week ended September 5 was limited to purchases to cover the actual needs of merchants and millers. Continued free offers of Russian Wheat are mentioned and increased shipments from the Danube and Black Sea ports. A preliminary estimate of the world's Wheat crop is calculated to be 4,470,544,000 bushels for 1930-31 as against 4,204,824,000 bushels for 1929-30.

Reports from the United States states Spring Wheat crop better than expected a month ago being estimated at 240,000,000 bushels. The Winter Wheat crop is placed at 597,000,000 bushels, making the total Wheat production of the United States 837,000,000 bushels according to September 1 forecast.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPT. 12, 1930.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Sept. 12 show an increase of 25,110,952 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat, 118,743,059; Oats, 6,440,598; Barley, 26,098,443; Flax, 462,568 and Rye, 10,279,403, a total of 162,024,071 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 19,739,562; Oats, 471,539; Barley, 4,124,960; Flax, 11,131 and Rye, 763,730 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 166,938,043 bushels made up as follows: Wheat, 131,645,874; Oats, 15,155,505; Barley, 14,385,147; Flax, 411,296 and Rye, 5,340,261 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS -

Stocks of grain in store at these elevators show an increase of 14,103,266 bushels made up as follows: Wheat, 13,134,642; Oats, 144,805; Barley, 365,021; Flax, 49,438 and Rye, 409,360 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY).- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 694,585 bushels. Wheat and Barley show an increase of 718,308 and 1,275 bushels respectively, while Oats shows a decrease of 24,998 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 499,619 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 568,989 and 468 bushels respectively, while Oats and Rye show increases of 63,880 and 5,958 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR.- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 69,523 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR.- Stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at the head of the lakes show a net increase of 5,903,897 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,067,854; Oats, 272,517; Barley, 1,049,725 and Rye, 552,049 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 38,248 bushels.




