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

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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended October 16, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 2,233,988 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 932,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 3,165,988 bushels.

Although the overseas movement of wheat for this week is slightly lower than the previous week, still it is the fourth highest quantity since August, 1, 1931. The average shipped weekly for the present crop season amounted to 2,766,572 bushels.

For the three weeks ended October 16, 1931, the amount of wheat shipped overseas from the Canadian Seaboard ports was 7,482,544 bushels; this with clearances from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports of 2,325,000 bushels makes a total of 9,807,544 bushels.

An increase is shown in the wheat stocks over the previous week ended October 9, 1931. The quantity in store on October 16, amounted to 140,239,326 bushels compared with 125,325,238 bushels for the week ended October 9, 1931, while 177,024,044 bushels were in store for the week ended October 17, 1930.

Of the total quantity in store on October 16, 1931, 9,057,492 bushels were on the elevators, at the United States lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports. This is a remarkably low amount in store, at these ports for this time of the shipping season. Buffalo storage of Canadian wheat was 7,974,525 bushels, New York 1,081,967 bushels and Duluth 1,000 bushels. For the week ended October 17, 1930, 20,378,449 bushels were in store, some 15,505,988 bushels being in Buffalo, N.Y.

Reports from the Western Country Elevators for the week ended October 9th show wheat is moving more rapidly. A record amount of 17,160,462 bushels is reported at the above elevators and over the loading platforms. This compares with 10,659,371 bushels for the previous week and 20,366,129 bushels for the week ended October 10th 1930. From August 1, to October 9, 1931, 79,861,435 bushels were received against 161,662,626 bushels for same period in 1930.

Inspections of wheat for the Western Division covering the week ended October 14th 1931 were 6,304 cars of which 4,875 cars graded no. 3 Northern and better and 1,104 cars tough and damp. For the same week in 1930, 8,088 cars were inspected 6,766 cars grading in the contract grades while 657 cars were tough and damp.

Vessel movement of wheat from the Head of the Lakes continues slow. The quantities with destinations shipped during the week ended October 14th were as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake ports 2,214,642; to Montreal 1,034,474; to Sorel 181,041; to Buffalo 1,263,237, a total of 4,693,394 bushels.

A noticeable feature in the lake shipments this year was a comparatively small amounts destined to Buffalo and other United States lake ports. Lake Shipments for the same week in 1930 amounted to 13,385,495 bushels to all destinations.

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Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 16, show a increase of 10,237,118 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 134,556,434, Oats 9,195,066, Barley 11,475,568, Flax 955,038 and Rye 12,243,865, a total of 158,425,939 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 9,231,196, Oats 598,611, Barley 289,263, Flax 66,526 and Rye 51,517 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 234,514,751 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 177,024,044, Oats 10,836,539, Barley 31,715,737, Flax 1,816,222 and Rye 13,126,209 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 9,556,591 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 9,101,420, Oats 257,200, Barley 77,099 bushels, Flax 91,166 and Rye 29,706 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, ELMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 3,751 bushels, Oats show a decrease of 7,249 bushels, while an increase is noted in Wheat of 411 bushels and Barley 3,087 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 728,635 bushels, Oats shows an increase of 737,048 bushels and Barley 551 bushels, while a decrease is noted in Oats of 7,969 and Rye 795 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS:- Wheat stocks at this elevator are the same as the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS:- Stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net decrease of 1,528,248 bushels, decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,653,596 bushels, Oats 73,940 bushels, and Flax 39,297 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 215,164 bushels and 23,421 bushels respectively.
