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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended October 23, 1931, according to elevator reports from Canadian Seaboard ports, 2,502,772 bushels of Canadian wheat were shipped by vessel overseas. The clearances of Canadian wheat from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 713,000 bushels, making a total export clearance for the week of 3,215,772 bushels.

An increased movement overseas is noted from the Port of Montreal, over the previous week of 612,220 bushels, while from Sorel, Vancouver and United States Atlantic ports small decreases are shown.

During the four weeks ended October 23, 1931, the amount of wheat shipped overseas from the Canadian Seaboard ports was 9,985,316 bushels; this with clearances from United States Atlantic Seaboard ports of 3,038,000 bushels makes a total of 13,023,316 bushels.

According to the above clearance figures more wheat moved overseas during October than for the previous two months of August and September.

Wheat stocks again increased over the previous week. The amount in store in all the elevators for the week ended October 23, was 153,642,716 bushels as compared with 141,942,719 bushels a week ago. For the same week in 1930, 180,054,728 bushels were in store.

The amount of Canadian wheat in the elevators, at the United States lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports shows a small reduction from the previous week, being 8,904,715 bushels. The bulk of this 7,738,625 bushels were in store at Buffalo, and the balance in New York.

Another record was established for the deliveries to the Western Country elevators and over the loading platforms. During the week ended October 16, 18,188,510 bushels of wheat were moved from the farms. This compares with 17,160,462 bushels for the previous week, which was the highest amount recorded up to that date. During the week ended October 17, 1930 only 9,176,726 bushels were received at the above elevators.

Wheat inspections for the western Division were almost twice the amount for the same week in 1930. The number of cars reported were 8,165 for the week ended October 21, 1931, and 4,418 cars for the same week in 1930. According to the grading 6,307 cars were placed in the contract grades and 1,430 cars in the tough and damp class, while for the same week in 1930, 3,467 cars were shown to have graded No.3 Northern and better, and 600 cars damp and tough.

During the period from October 15, to 21, lake shipments amounted to 6,724,552 bushels, the majority of which were destined to Canadian lower lake and seaboard ports. The distribution of these shipments was as follows: To Buffalo 2,742,675 bushels, to Lower Lake ports 2,741,834 bushels, to Montreal 1,229,530 bushels; and to Quebec 10,513 bushels.

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THE FOREIGN SITUATION

World shipments of wheat and flour amounted to 18,692,000 bushels for the week ending October 24th compared with 17,025,000 bushels for the previous week and 18,565,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from Canada and the United States showed an increase of about two million bushels for the week. Argentine and Australian shipments were slightly lower for the week, while Russian clearances increased moderately but remained below the corresponding figure for 1930.

From August 1st to October 24th world shipments amounted to 197 million bushels compared to 189 million bushels for the same period in 1930.

Quantities on Passage.-

Quantities of wheat on passage to Europe increased by 4,232,000 bushels for the week ending October 23rd. Wheat and flour on passage amounted to 40,664,000 bushels compared to 36,432,000 bushels for the previous week and 43,664,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year.

Increasing Utilization of grain in the Argentine.-

An official statement issued by the Economic and Statistical Division of the Ministry of Agriculture on Sept. 28, 1931 stated:-

"In spite of the reduced area sown with wheat, a relatively larger quantity is set aside for home consumption and seed purposes than was the case last year. This was determined by the greater consumption of wheat as an article of food, and by its more liberal use, when mixed with other ingredients, as maintenance for fowls, etc. The wheat used for this latter purpose had been affected by rust, and was harvested economically by farmers possessing their own harvesting and threshing machinery".

Referring to maize the report states:-

"It is unquestionable that a much larger quantity will be required than has been the case in previous years, Argentine farmers having realised that while present low prices continue it is convenient to convert their maize into meat, or to feed it to horses, which are being used to a considerable extent in agricultural work this year."

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending October 23, show a net increase of 13,204,777 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 146,812,642, Oats 9,937,390, Barley 11,389,938, Flax 1,165,810 and Rye 12,324,966 a total of 181,630,746 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 12,256,208, Oats 742,324, Flax 210,772 and Rye 81,101 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 85,628 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 236,817,708 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 180,054,728, Oats 10,279,531, Barley 32,211,209, Flax 1,946,940 and Rye 12,325,300 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 7,746,983 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 7,171,881, Oats 345,624, Barley 66,806, Flax 124,982 and Rye 37,690 bushels.






