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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended November 6, 1931, according to elevator reports from the Canadian seaboard ports, the export shipments of wheat overseas were as follows:-

This is almost twice the amount of the previous week, when 3,753,221 bushels were shipped. The movement of 6,129,814 bushels is the largest since the week ended May 28, 1931, when some 6,342,601 bushels were forwarded.

Wheat stocks in the elevators continue to increase; the amount in store for the week ended November 6, was 171,695,120 bushels as compared with 164,134,449 bushels a week ago. The two largest amounts are at the Country Elevators and at the Head of the Lakes.

A slight increase is noted in the wheat stocks at the United States lake and Atlantic seaboard ports; the amount in store being 11,329,470 bushels as compared with 10,268,447 bushels for the previous week. The bulk of the former (10,095,108 bushels) was stored and afloat in Buffalo and the remainder in New York elevators.

A decrease is shown in the deliveries at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms, during the week ended October 30, when 16,003,775 bushels were shipped from the farms. The previous week's movement amounted to 19,336,715 bushels which is the record so far this season, and for the week ended October 31, 1930, 11,700,444 bushels were shown as shipped to above elevators.

Western wheat inspectors for the month of October 1931, show a substantial increase over the same month in 1930. The number of cars inspected was 33,076 for October 1931 while 24,883 cars passed inspection for the corresponding month in 1930. Of the former amount 79.14% graded in the contract grades while 14.66% was tough and damp.

During the week ended November 7, 1931, 5,996,349 bushels of wheat were shipped by vessel from the Head of the Lakes to the following ports:- To Buffalo 3,509,620 bushels; to Canadian Lower lake ports 2,009,783 bushels; to Montreal 358,940 bushels; and to Sorel 88,000 bushels.



According to the report dated November 10, 1931 from our correspondents in Montreal, the ocean freight rates from that port were as follows:- To Liverpool 9.2 cts. to London 7.5¢ per bushel; to Antwerp 6.6 cts. per bushel; to Hamburg and Bremen 8.4 cts. per bushel.



Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 6, 1931, show a net increase of 9,381,391 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 170,150,220, Oats 11,508,775, Barley 10,455,068, Flax 1,673,293 and Rye 12,733,158 bushels, a total of 206,570,514 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 9,501,483, Oats 856,619 and Flax 217,802 bushels, while Barley and Rye show decreases of 805,595 and 138,992 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 255,336,292 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 194,775,942, Oats 12,470,845, Barley 32,602,068, Flax 2,227,662 and Rye 13,259,775 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS: - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 2,496,441 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,154,784, Oats 167,246, Flax 135,611 and Rye 53,328 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 14,528 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 420,120 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 422,413 bushels, while decreases are noted in Oats of 2,209, Barley 81 and Rye 3 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS: - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 391,627 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 495,885 bushels, while a decrease is noted in Oats of 104,258 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS: - Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase of 66,657 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS: - Stocks at this elevator are nil.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND FORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 4,158,548 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 4,583,106, Oats 578,290 and Flax 64,182 bushels, while Barley and Rye show decreases of 1,028,591 and 43,379 bushels respectively.

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


