CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended November 13, 1931, and two weeks ended Nov. 13, according to elevator reports from the Canadian seaboard ports, the export shipments of wheat overseas were as follows:

Although, the export movement for the week ended November 13, was reduced to a little over half the previous week's shipments, still it is the second largest during the season and compares favourably to the same week last year. The water shipments for the first two weeks of November were nearly of the same volume, as that of the corresponding two weeks in 1930.

Stocks of wheat in the elevators throughout Canada continue to increase; the amount in store on November 13 was 174,140,217 bushels as compared with 171,695,120 bushels a week ago, and 198,083,932 bushels for the same week in 1930.

Canadian wheat stocks at the United States lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 11,002,119 bushels, a slight decrease from the previous week, when 11,329,470 bushels were in store. Of the former amount 9,882,152 bushels were in the elevators and afloat at Buffalo, while the balance 1,119,967 bushels were stored in New York.



Another decrease is shown in the deliveries at the Western Country elevators for the week ended November 6, 1931, when 13,418,588 bushels were reported shipped from the farms. The platform loadings for the week having not reported. The movement for the previous week amounted to 16,003,775 bushels. During the same week in 1930 13,625,180 bushels were shown as forwarded to the above elevators.

Wheat inspections in the Western Division for the week ended November 7, 1931, show that just twice the number of cars were inspected as compared with same week in 1930. The number of cars being 9,170 and 4,542 respectively. Of the former number, 7,408 cars or 80.7 per cent graded in the contract grades and 1,061 cars or 14.4 per cent were tough and damp.

A considerable increase is noted in the Vessel Shipments from the Head of the Lakes for the week November 7th over the previous week. The wheat movement amounted to 6,480,972 bushels destined as follows: To Buffalo, 3,880,035 bushels; to Canadian Lower Lake Ports 2,068,343 bushels; to Montreal 360,394 bushels; to Sorel 172,200 bushels.

According to a report dated November 18, 1931, from our correspondents the ocean freight rates from West St. John, N.B. were as follows: To Liverpool, 6 cts. per bushel; to London, 8 cts. per bushel; to Belfast 7.5 cts. per bushel; to Antwerp, 6 cts. per bushel; to Rotterdam 6 to 6.6 cts. per bushel; to Hamburg, 6 cts. per bushel. The foregoing rates are all for December shipments.



Foreign Situation.
Wheat Situation in Australia.

The following cable was received from the Canadian Trade Commissioner for Australia:

"Old crop wheat practically exhausted and carryover about smallest on record. Total shipments to date including flour equivalent estimated 154,321,020 bushels of which 83,039,406 bushels exported to non European countries. Owing continuance dry weather in some states the new crop now estimated slightly more than 150,000,000 bushels of which about 105,000,000 bushels available for export. Some new wheat already shipped, excellent quality. New South Wales running sixty five pounds to bushel and sales made to Shanghai guaranteed sixty one and half pounds bushel. Sales new crop made at variable f.o.b. prices ranging from four shillings to three shillings eight pence bushels. Three hundred and twenty thousand tons shipping space already chartered".

Agricultural Conditions in Ireland

The Canadian Trade Commissioner for the Irish Free State reports as follows:

Dublin, October 26, 1931. With the arrival of September, weather conditions throughout the greater part of Ireland improved and one of the best months of the present year was experienced for farming work. Harvest was well advanced during the period and by the close of September was almost completed in many districts with favourable results.

The bulk of the wheat crop had been harvested by the beginning of October and is stated to be of fair quality, although adversely affected in certain districts by the excessive summer moisture. Imports of wheat into the Irish Free State during the first eight months of the year totalled 6,674,018 bushels, as compared with 5,962,606 bushels for the same period in 1930. There is comparatively little storing of imported wheat in Ireland, so that usually importations pass almost immediately into consumption. During the 1931 period (January to August) the principal sources according to countries of origin were:-

The oat crop is reported to be variable, but the yield is expected to be below the average, while the quality is good. The recent Irish Free State tariff on oats of two shillings and six pence per cwt. is expected to have the effect of raising prices and stopping the imports from Russia and Germany.

The yield of barley is also expected to be below average in the Irish Free State owing to the wet season - with resulting lodging and difficulty in cutting.

As reported previously, difficulty was experienced in practically all districts with potato blight. Crops that were frequently sprayed have proved good, but, unsprayed potatoes are giving poor yields. On the whole, the general yield will be likely to be below average, with an unusually large proportion of small potatoes. Recent market quotations have been from 6/- to 8/- per 112 lbs. with supplies limited. Importations from Canada, however, are not permitted under the existing embargo.

Germany-Wheat Production.

The Market Reports Bureau of the German Farm Council estimates 1931 wheat production in Germany at 150 million bushels or over 6 million bushels lower than the last official estimate. The Bureau estimates 1931 rye production at 259 million or 16 million bushels less than the last official estimate. Production of wheat in Germany last year amounted to 139 million bushels and production of rye amounted to 302 million bushels.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 13, 1931, show a net increase of 3,307,485 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 173,808,494 bushels; Oats 11,947,982 bushels; Barley 10,117,595 bushels; Flax 1,690,857 bushels and Rye 12,313,071 bushels. A total of 209,877,999 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 3,658,274; Oats 439,207 bushels and Flax 17,564 bushels while Barley and Rye show decreases of 337,473 and 470,087 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 259,812,711 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 198,083,922 bushels; Oats 13,271,650 bushels; Barley 32,695,584 bushels; Flax 2,302,050 bushels and Rye 13,459,505 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 1,201,178 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 441,883 bushels; Oats 542,377 bushels; Barley 85,494, Flax 50,978 and Rye 80,446 bushels.
