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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

The export movement of 4,638,020 bushels during the week ended November 20, 1931 was the second largest this season being exceeded by the week ended November 5, when 6,129,814 bushels were shipped. From the above figures, it will be noted, that the movement this year is slightly under that of last year, both for the week and the three week period.

Wheat stocks for the week ended November 20 amounted to 182,330,072 bushels, an increase of 8,189,855 bushels over the previous week when 174,140,217 bushels were in store. For the corresponding week in 1930, wheat stocks were 204,033,457 bushels. One noteworthy feature is the comparatively small quantities stored in the Eastern Elevators this year being some 17,355,365 bushels, against 33,513,549 bushels for week of November 26, 1930.

An increase is shown in the Canadian wheat stocks at the United States lake and Atlantic Seaboard Ports, for the week November 20, 1931 when 14,713,425 bushels were stored as compared with 11,002,119 bushels for the previous week November 13. Of the former amount 13,390,775 bushels were in the elevators and afloat at Buffalo; the balance 1,295,413 bushels were stored at New York.

The deliveries for the week ended November 13th amounted to 13,430,601 bushels, compared with 13,418,583 bushels for the previous week November 6. During the corresponding week in 1930, the movement amounted to 13,441,911 bushels.

Western inspections for the week ended November 21 were 550 cars over the previous week. The number of cars inspected for the above week was 6,604 compared with 6,054 for the previous week. Of the former 4,781 cars or 72.4 percent graded in the contract grades and 18.6 percent were tough and damp.

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending November 21 receded sharply from the levels of the previous week, amounting to 13,743,000 bushels compared with 17,476,000 bushels for the week ending November 14th. North American shipments decreased by about 2 million bushels for the week. Russian shipments amounted to 2,768,000 bushels compared with 2,480,000 for the previous week and 6,344,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

World shipments from August 1st to November 21 amount to 261 million bushels compared with 257 million bushels for the same period in 1930.


Conditions in the Argentine

The following cable was received from the International Institute of Agriculture on November 21st:

"Argentine cereals and flax crop conditions fairly good. Slight damage is reported locally consequent on cryptogamic diseases, hail storms, too much rain, rust attacks and by hard frost in Pampa. No serious damage reported Entre-rios. Harvest has begun in the North of the country."

European Estimates

The 1931 wheat crop in Greece is now officially estimated at 12,236,000 bushels compared with 12,493,000 bushels in 1930. The 1931 crop was previously estimated at over 18 million bushels. The 1931 crop in Germany is now officially estimated at 160,670,000 bushels compared with an outturn of 139,217,000 bushels in 1930. The German rye crop is now estimated at 262,000,000 bushels compared with a production of 302,317,000 bushels in 1930. Twenty-six European countries report estimated production of wheat of 1,394 million bushels compared to 1,377 million bushels for the same countries in 1930. Nineteen European countries report a combined rye production of 731 million bushels compared with 873 million bushels for the same countries in 1930.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 20, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 20, show a net increase of 9,682,992 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 182,453,140; Oats 12,566,685; Barley 10,424,489; Flax 1,583,108 and Rye 12,231,285 a total of 219,263,707 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 8,649,646; Oats 618,703; Barley 306,894 and Flax 107,749 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 81,786 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 265,471,344 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 204,033,457; Oats 13,457,776; Barley 32,098,019; Flax 2,139,696 and Rye 13,742,396 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 2,655,933 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,123,369 bushels, Oats 129,792 bushels, Barley 257,622 bushels, Flax 50,618 bushels and Rye 94,532 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY):- Stocks for the week show a net increase of 810,821. Increases are noted in Wheat of 746,194, Oats 59,933 bushels, Barley 1,775 bushels and Rye 3,005 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 86 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS:- Grain stocks at these elevators show an net increase of 258,488 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 315,930 bushels, Barley 397 bushels, Flax 281 bushels and Rye 511 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 58,631 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks at this elevator show an increase in Wheat of 182,118 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR:- Wheat stocks at this elevator are 170,000 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR):- Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 864,308 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat and Oats of 1,417,829 bushels and 430,329 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Barley of 502,286 bushels, Flax 201,909 bushels and Rye 279,655 bushels.
