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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended December 4th, 1931, according to elevator returns from Canadian seaboard ports, the export shipments of wheat overseas were as follows:

During the week ended December 4th, 1931, the export shipments of wheat were 1,412,824 bushels below those of the same week in 1930. Reduced shipments were shown from Montreal and U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports.

A small increase is noted in the wheat stocks over the previous week, when 186,807,435 bushels were reported in store, as compared with 185,416,528 bushels a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1930, 211,431,865 bushels were stored in the elevators. The stocks in the Eastern Elevators have risen from 18,808,553 bushels on November 27th to 20,866,956 bushels on December 4th; this compares with 33,336,030 bushels for the corresponding week in 1930.

Wheat in United States Lake and Atlantic Ports amounted to 19,594,364 bushels on December 4th, as compared with 16,722,162 bushels for the previous week. The bulk of the former, amounting to 17,719,330 bushels, is located at Buffalo, while New York accounts for 1,500,034 bushels and Duluth 1,000 bushels.

Deliveries at the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms receded to a little over one half the previous week's movement, when 5,231,366 bushels were shipped against 9,591,016 bushels for the week ended November 20th. For the corresponding week in 1930, 9,039,386 bushels were forwarded from the farms. The primary movement for the period from August 1st to November 27th, 1931, amounted to 175,062,076 bushels, and for the same period in 1930, to 230,309,737 bushels.

The vessel movement from the Head of the Lakes shows an improvement over the previous week. During the period from November 21st to November 30th some 10,147,821 bushels were shipped, the destinations of which were as follows:- 4,265,600 bushels to Lower Lake Ports; 4,754,115 bushels to Buffalo; 996,198 bushels to Other United States Ports and 131,908 bushels to Montreal.

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending December 5th, amounted to 11,505,000 bushels, the smallest weekly total for the present crop year. Of the total shipments 7,130,000 bushels came from North America, the only large source of supplies until the southern hemisphere crops are available. It is interesting to note that total Russian shipments from August 1st to December 5th have fallen behind the total for last year, the same period considered. For the second successive week Russian shipments have been under one million bushels. World shipments for the week ending December 5th were about five million bushels under the total for the same week last year and as a result total world shipments from August 1st to December 5th, have fallen slightly lower than the total for the same period in 1930.

Quantities of wheat and flour on passage continue at a relatively low level amounting for the week ending December 7th to 33,752,000 bushels compared to 43,256,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

Preliminary Argentine Estimate

The Argentine Government has issued a preliminary estimate of production showing the following outturn:

The above estimate shows a reduction in estimated wheat production of twenty million bushels, although the acreage sown to wheat was nearly four million acres less than last year. The preliminary estimate must therefore be based upon substantially better yields per acre than last year in spite of crop damage reported from time to time.

EUROPEAN CROPS

The International Institute of Agriculture at Rome has cabled that the 1931 wheat crop of Yugoslavia is now estimated at 98,802,196 bushels, or about ten million bushels higher than previous estimates of this crop. The 1930 crop was estimated at 80,325,000 bushels.

The 1931 wheat crop of Hungary is now estimated at 65,664,000 bushels, compared to an outturn of 84,337,000 bushels in 1930.

The Polish wheat crop is now estimated at 75,691,000 bushels, compared to the earlier estimate of 72,752,000 bushels and an outturn of 82,322,000 bushels in 1930.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 4, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 4th, show a net increase of 1,582,035 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 186,989,489; Oats 14,035,590; Barley 10,683,650; Flax 1,628,024 and Rye 12,126,166 bushels, a total of 225,462,919 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,048,316; Oats 314,940; Barley 538,857 and Flax 81,470 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 401,548 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 272,934,400 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 211,431,865; Oats 14,159,742; Barley 31,849,584; Flax 2,175,960 and Rye 13,317,249 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 99,626 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 192,178 bushels and Oats 22,566 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 67,374 bushels. Flax 3,219 bushels and Rye 44,525 bushels.






