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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

The St. Lawrence ports are now closed for the winter months; this is reflected in the movement for the past week. The vessel shipments from Vancouver and United States Atlantic seaboard ports, however, show substantial increase over the same week in 1930. For the two weeks' period ended December 11, 1931, the movement decreased by 1,287,971 bushels from the same two weeks in 1930.

Wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat continue to increase slowly; the quantity in store at the end of the week, December 11, amounted to 189,306,796 bushels, as compared with 186,807,435 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1930, 215,324,811 bushels were stored in the elevators. A slight increase is noted in the wheat stocks in the eastern elevators over the previous week. The stocks amounted to 21,179,129 bushels for the week ended December 11, against 20,866,956 bushels on December 4. Of the former amount 15,215,705 bushels were stored in the Georgian Bay and Lower Lake Ports and 5,963,424 bushels in the St. Lawrence and Atlantic Seaboard Ports. The same week in 1930, some 33,021,092 bushels were reported in store, of which 23,921,110 bushels in the elevators in the Lower Lake ports and 9,099,982 at the St. Lawrence and Seaboard ports.

A slight increase is shown in the wheat stocks in the United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports, the amount being 19,940,776 bushels, as compared with 19,594,364 bushels for the previous week. The bulk of the former amounting to 17,811,437 bushels is located at Buffalo, while New York has the next largest amount, 1,455,502 bushels. Smaller amounts are shown at Erie and Duluth.

The deliveries to the Western Country Elevators, together with the amount shipped/loading platforms amounted to 5,959,245 bushels as against 5,231,366 bushels for the previous week November 27, 1931. This is an increase of 727,879 bushels. For the same week ended December 5, 1930, 7,069,712 bushels were shown in the primary movement. During the period from August 1 to December 4, 1931, some 181,021,821 bushels were moved from the farm and for the corresponding time in 1930, 237,379,449 bushels were forwarded.


According to the Western inspection returns for the week ending December 14, 1931, 2,146 cars or 73 per cent graded in the first four grades. During the same week in 1930 885 cars or 27 per cent were placed in the above grades while the damp and tough grades amounted to 474 cars or 16 per cent in 1931 and 2,308 cars or 69 per cent in 1930.

Navigation in the lakes closed December 8th, 1931 and during the period from December 1 to December 8, some 1,737,244 bushels of wheat were shipped from the Head of the Lakes, the distribution of which was as follows:-

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 11, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending December 11th, show a net increase of 3,557,105 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 189,079,108, Oats 15,291,996, Barley 10,964,229, Flax 1,537,246 and Rye 12,147,045 bushels, a total of 229,020,024 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 2,090,019, Oats 1,256,406, Barley 280,579 and Rye 20,879 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 90,778 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 276,543,082 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 215,324,811, Oats 14,349,852, Barley 31,577,260, Flax 2,019,385 and Rye 13,271,764 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show an increase of 778,055 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 470,210, Oats 175,366, Barley 104,746, Flax 4,625 and Rye 23,108 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show a net increase of 143,144 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 45,725, Oats 68,457 and Barley 29,857 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 895 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 323,577 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 202,845, Oats 109,244, Barley 12,453 and Flax 31 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 995 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Stocks at this elevator show an increase of 77,840 bushels, made up as follows, Wheat 77,839 and Oats 1 bushel.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Grain stocks at this elevator show an increase of 105,718 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 105,569 and Oats 153 bushels.




