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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended December 18th, 1931, according to elevator returns from Canadian Seaboard Ports, the export shipments of wheat overseas were as follows:-

During the week ended December 18th, 1931, the bulk of the export shipments of wheat left Canada through the Port of Vancouver, the amount being 1,566,714 bushels, as compared with 1,357,353 bushels for the same week in 1930. The movement for the week ended December 18th from Canadian ports was 1,612,700 bushels, against 3,193,855 bushels for the corresponding week in 1930. So far this month, 9,175,868 bushels were shipped from Canadian and United States Ports overseas. For the same period in December, 1930, 11,744,994 bushels were forwarded.

A slight increase took place in the wheat stocks in the elevators for the week ended December 18th when 190,862,193 bushels were reported in store, as compared with 189,306,796 bushels for the previous week. During the same week in 1930, 216,650,613 bushels were shown as stored.

Eastern Elevator's wheat in store show a slight reduction from the previous week. The stocks reported for the week amounted to 20,232,633 bushels, while for the previous week 21,179,129 bushels were shown as in the elevators. For the corresponding week in 1930, 32,784,692 bushels were reported.

Canadian wheat in United States elevators amounted to 19,736,464 bushels, a decrease from the previous week when 19,940,776 bushels were reported. Of the former, amount, 18,081,776 bushels were in the Lake Ports and 1,655,200 bushels in the Atlantic Seaboard Ports of New York and Baltimore.

The deliveries to the Western Country Elevators, together with the amount shipped over the loading platforms amounted to 4,964,838 bushels, as against 5,959,245 bushels for the previous week December 4th, 1931. This is a decrease of 994,407 bushels. For the same week ended December 12th, 1930, 3,691,903 bushels were shown in the primary movement. During the period from August 1st to December 12th, 1931, some 185,986,159 bushels were moved from the farm, and for the corresponding time in 1930, 241,071,357 bushels were forwarded.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 18, 1931.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending Dec. 18, 1931 show a net increase of 1,878,381 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 190,862,193, Oats 15,320,214, Barley 11,236,264, Flax 1,477,083 and Rye 12,002,651, a total of 230,898,405 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 1,782,685, Oats 28,218 and Barley 272,035 bushels, while Flax and Rye show decreases of 60,163 and 144,394 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 278,466,684 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 216,650,613, Oats 14,929,575, Barley 31,487,849, Flax 2,034,156 and Rye 13,364,491 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 555,821 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 485,577 bushels, Barley 91,600 bushels, and Rye 28,359 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 42,821 and 6,894 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). - Stocks for the week show an increase of 41,929 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 15,106 bushels, Oats 23,779 bushels and Barley 3,044 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 270,289 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 259,226 bushels, Oats 33,874 bushels, and Flax 96 bushels, while Barley and Rye show decreases of 14,693 and 8,214 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Stocks at this elevator show an increase in Wheat of 90,637 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Grain stocks at this elevator show an increase of 140,525 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 140,423 bushels and Oats 102 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lake show an increase of 2,517,807 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 2,009,985 bushels, Oats 273,109, Barley 169,460, Flax 16,130 and Rye 49,123 bushels.
