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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

Export shipments through the Port of Vancouver continue to increase. The amount moved was 2,845,513 bushels, as compared with 1,965,091 bushels last week. For the same week in 1930, some 1,385,694 bushels were shipped. During the five weeks ended January 1, 1932, 14,818,400 bushels of wheat were cleared from Canadian and United States Seaboard ports. The bulk of this 9,674,470 bushels left through the Port of Vancouver. Last year for same period, 17,572,503 bushels were shipped. It will be noted there were larger shipments, through the Port of Montreal and United States Atlantic Seaboard ports last year than this year for the same period. Wheat stocks in Canadian and United States Elevators increased over the previous week when 192,305,958 bushels were reported against 190,734,642 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1930, 216,700,161 bushels were in store.

Eastern Canadian Elevator wheat stocks show a small reduction from the previous week. The amount in store was 18,841,102 bushels against 19,186,855 bushels last week. For same week in 1930 the stocks were 31,083,592 bushels. An increase took place in the Canadian wheat stocks in United States Lake and Atlantic Seaboard ports. The amount reported being 19,674,025 bushels as compared with 18,614,569 bushels for the previous week. Of the former amount 17,044,091 bushels were stored and afloat at Buffalo and 1,600,101 bushels at New York. Afloat wheat at Toledo is shown in this week's total which accounts for some of the increase over the previous week.

Deliveries at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms for the week ended December 25th amounted to 3,396,009 bushels. This compares with 4,973,397 bushels for the previous week and 3,453,171 bushels, for the corresponding week in 1930. A large decrease is noted in the wheat receipts for the province of Alberta, the amount being 1,988,273 bushels, a little over half of that of the previous week. The primary movement from August 1 to date amounted to 194,357,565 bushels, while for the same period last year 248,668,908 bushels. Western wheat inspections for the week ended December 31, 1931 was 3,046 cars of which 2,166 cars were placed in the contract grades while 627 cars were graded tough and damp. For the same week in 1930, 3,242 cars were inspected, 1,046 cars of which were shown in the first four grades and 2,059 cars graded tough and damp.

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending January 2nd amounted to 10,199,000 bushels compared with 12,863,000 bushels for the previous week and with 9,545,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments showed a substantial increase for the week, amounting to 5,921,000 bushels compared with 4,754,000 bushels for the week previous. Shipments from the Argentine and Australia receded sharply from the totals of the week ending December 26th.

Russian shipments for the week ending January 2nd were the lowest of the present crop year, amounting to only 272,000 bushels compared with 1,256,000 bushels for the previous week and 1,216,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Russian shipments continue to fall behind the totals of last year. From August 1st 1931 to January 2nd 1932, Russian shipments of wheat have amounted to 65,502,000 bushels compared with 70,891,000 bushels for the same period a year ago.

World shipments from August 1st, 1931 to January 2nd 1932 amount to 331,749,000 bushels compared with 331,470,000 bushels for the corresponding period last year.

The Canadian Trade Commissioner for Australia, in a memorandum dated December 9th, 1931 states.

"The end of November completed the export season of Australian wheat and flour for 1930-31. In the concluding week of the season, the shipments of wheat were, practically, negligible, but shipments of flour from all the States aggregated some 6,250 tons.

Official figures of the wheat yield of the Commonwealth for the harvest of 1930-31 were 212,628,669 bushels. Wheat required in that period for home consumption and for seed purposes was estimated at approximately 50,500,000 bushels, and the exportable surplus of the crop was approximately 162,137,861 bushels.

The shipments of wheat and flour - for the season ended on November 30th - expressed in terms of wheat amounted to 157,766,657 bushels, so that practically the whole of the 1930-31 crop has been shipped overseas.

In comparison with previous seasons (December 1st to November 30th) the exports of Australian wheat were as follows:-

Today's price for new f.a.q. Australian wheat is approximately 3s5d. (In Australian currency) f.o.b. steamer at principal ports, while old wheat can be obtained at 2 pence per bushel less. Approximate commitments (computed to this date) of new season's wheat aggregate 750,000 long tons of which 18 cargoes approximately 150,000 tons have been sold to Shanghai at about three shilling and three pence three farthings (3s. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ d.) per bushel c.i.f. in English currency returning about two shillings and nine pence (2s. 9d.) to growers.

The quality of the new wheat in South and Western Australia - the latter averaging 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ pounds to the bushel - is excellent, in Victoria good, while some has been damaged in New South Wales through excessive rain.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 1, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 1, 1932 show a net increase of 1,266,301 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 192,305,958, Oats 15,855,446, Barley 11,494,963, Flax 1,471,370 and Rye 12,343,745 bushels a total of 233,471,482 bushels. Increases are noted in wheat of 1,521,266, Oats 161,123 and Barley 95,365 bushels. While Flax and Rye show decreases of 453 and 511,000 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 278,638,514 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 216,700,161, Oats 15,059,725, Barley 31,349,407, Flax 2,134,932 and Rye 13,394,269 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 216,016 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 162,853 bushels Oats 39,200 Barley 23,581 bushels while Flax and Rye show decreases of 7,625 and 1,993 bushels respectively.


