The overseas shipments of wheat for the week ended January 15, from Canadian and United States Atlantic Seaboard ports amounted to 2,653,098 bushels, as compared with 4,036,889 bushels for the same week in 1931. It will be noted, the shipments for the past week were little over half of that of the corresponding week in 1931. Vancouver, however, slightly increased its output. For the two weeks ended January 15, 6,097,846 bushels were moved from the above ports, while 8,085,064 bushels were shipped during the same two weeks in 1931.

Wheat stocks in Canadian and United States elevators decreased slightly from the previous week. The amount in store for the week was 199,384,242 bushels, against 200,416,777 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, 209,912,982 bushels were reported stored.

Canadian wheat in the Eastern elevators amounted to 20,099,368 bushels, slightly less than the previous week when 20,650,572 bushels were stored. For the corresponding week in 1931, the stocks amounted to 28,127,898 bushels.

Canadian wheat in United States positions amounted to 23,863,746 bushels, slightly reduced from the previous week when 24,537,809 bushels were shown as stored. For the same week in 1931, 29,291,258 bushels were reported. The bulk of the former amounting to 16,413,694 and 6,436,215 bushels respectively is stored and afloat in Buffalo and New York.

The deliveries at the Western Country elevators and over the loading platforms amounted to 2,818,700 bushels, which compares with 2,101,691 bushels for the previous week January 1st. For the same week in 1931, the receipts were reported as 2,671,066 bushels. A noteworthy feature this year is the continued large amount coming forward from Alberta. The receipts for that province were 1,851,307 bushels, as compared with 1,356,829 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. From August 1, to Jan. 8, 1932, 199,276,956 bushels were reported delivered; while during the period to January 10, 1931, some 254,685,385 bushels were forwarded from the farms.

Western wheat inspections for the week ended January 14, were 1,366 cars of which 1,022 cars graded in the contract grades and 236 cars were shown tough and damp. For the same week in 1930, 733 cars graded in the first four grades and 1,030 cars tough and damp, from a total number of 1,890 cars inspected.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 15, 1932.

- Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 15, 1932 show a net decrease of 1,366,867 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 199,471,335, Oats 15,512,386, Barley 11,563,779, Flax 1,439,328 and Rye 13,159,351 a total of 241,146,179 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 913,521, Oats 416,512 Barley 131,371 and Flax 28,537 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 123,074 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 270,806,571 bushels made as follows: Wheat 209,912,982, Oats 14,348,783 Barley 31,067,016, Flax 2,138,687 and Rye 13,339,103 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 123,407 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 406,708 bushels Barley 747 bushels and Rye 10,442 bushels. While Oats and Flax show decreases of 279,657 and 14,833 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net increase of 2,322 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 7,331 bushels and Barley 6,643 bushels while wheat show a decrease of 11,652 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 319,036 bushels a decrease is noted in Wheat of 489,790 bushels while increases are noted in Oats of 158,115 bushels, Barley 12,329 bushels and Flax 310 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. - Stocks at this elevators are the same as for previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator show an increase in Wheat of 47,946 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). - Stocks at the Head of the Lakes show a net increase of 348,850 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 352,942 bushels Flax 4,033 bushels and Rye 130,580 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 48,162 and 90,543 bushels respectively.




