

A slight decrease is shown in the export shipments of wheat from Canadian and United States ports during the week ended January 22, as compared with the previous week, while the movement is a little over half of that of the corresponding week in 1931. For the three weeks ended January 22nd, the shipments amounted to 8,754,056 bushels, as compared with 14,061,204 bushels for the same period in 1931. The water shipments from Vancouver amounting to 6,710,771 bushels compare favourably with 7,122,788 bushels for the same period in 1931.

Stocks of wheat in Canadian and United States elevators show a considerable decrease from the previous week when 196,332,697 bushels were reported in store, as compared with 199,384,242 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, 205,758,003 bushels were reported in store.

Canadian wheat in Eastern Elevators continues on a downward trend. The amount reported is shown as 19,526,182 bushels, as compared with 20,099,368 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, some 26,655,725 bushels were in store.

Reports from United States Lake and Seaboard Elevators show 22,892,029 bushels of wheat were reported stored and afloat. This is a decrease from the previous week, when 23,363,746 bushels were shown in the same positions. For the corresponding week in 1931, 27,914,024 bushels of wheat were in these ports. The bulk of the former amounting to 16,000,101 bushels and 5,380,518 bushels were stored and afloat at Buffalo and New York respectively.

After seven weeks of relatively small world shipments, the international movement increased sharply for the week ending January 23rd and in point of volume was the largest of the present cereal year. Australia was the largest factor in the market last week with shipments amounting to 7,670,000 bushels, compared with 6,520,000 bushels for the week previous. The Argentine showed an increase of over 1 million bushels for the week ending January 23rd. Russian exports were very small, amounting to 304,000 bushels. North America held the level of recent weeks with shipments of 5,516,000 bushels.


Total world shipments for the week ending January 23rd amounted to 19,101,000 bushels, compared with 16,646,000 bushels for the week previous and 13,316,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year.

World shipments from August 1st, 1931, to January 23rd, 1932, amounted to 379 million bushels, compared with 370 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

INDIA

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 22, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 22, 1932 show a decrease of 3,535,572 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 196,992,004 Oats 14,870,399, Barley 11,322,684, Flax 1,412,106 and Rye 13,013,414 a total of 237,610,607 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,479,331, Oats 641,987 Barley 241,095, Flax 27,222 and Rye 145,937 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 266,430,678 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 205,758,003, Oats 14,316,832, Barley 30,926,879, Flax 2,114,093 and Rye 13,364,871 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 1,155,185 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 690,432, Oats 377,636, Barley 80,316 and Flax 9,666 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 2,865 bushels.




