Export shipments show a slight increase from the previous week, but are only little half of that of the same week in 1931. Vancouver continues to be the predominate exporter. For the four weeks ended January 29th, 1932, exports amounted to 11,196,185 bushels, as compared with 18,390,459 bushels for the same period in 1931.

Canadian wheat stocks in Canadian and United States elevators decreased slightly from the previous week when 195,446,396 bushels were reported as compared with 196,992,004 bushels for a week ago. For the same week in 1930, 202,649,469 bushels were shown as stored.

Eastern Elevator wheat stocks continue downwards. The amount reported stored for the week was 19,029,421 bushels, as compared with 19,526,182 bushels for the previous week. For the same week in 1931, some 25,681,141 bushels were in store.

Stocks in United States Lake and Seaboard elevators and afloat amounted to 21,917,585 bushels, a small decrease from the previous week when 22,892,029 bushels were shown in the corresponding positions. For the same week in 1931, 26,541,733 bushels were reported stored. As in former weeks, the bulk of the former, amounting to 15,379,239 and 5,445,936 bushels were stored at Buffalo and New York, respectively.

Receipts of wheat at the Western Country Elevators and over the Loading Platforms for the week ended January 22nd, 1932; increased over the previous week.

The deliveries amounted to 2,163,829 bushels, as compared with 1,779,516 bushels for that of a week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,236,619 bushels were forwarded. During the period from August 1st to January 22nd, 1932, the movement from the farms was 203,220,301 bushels against 256,922,004 bushels for the period ended January 23rd, 1931.

Western Inspection returns for the week ended January 31st, 1932, show that 2,058 cars graded in the first four grades, as compared with 1,658 cars for the same week in 1931. The damp and tough wheat for the above week in 1932 amounted to 312 cars, while 1,387 cars were placed in the same grades in 1931. The total wheat inspections for the week were 2,608 cars, compared with 3,239 cars for the corresponding week of a year ago.

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending January 30th, amounted to 14,241,000 bushels compared with 19,101,000 bushels for the week previous. Australian shipments dropped sharply for the week, amounting to 4,000,000 bushels compared with 7,670,000 bushels for the week previous.

World shipments for the 26 weeks ending January 30th, amounted to 394,000,000 bushels compared with 388,000,000 bushels for the same period last year.

France

The French Government has announced that their milling quota has been revised to allow the use of 10% foreign wheat in French mills. Previously only 3% foreign wheat could be used.

A cablegram received on February 4th from the International Institute of Agriculture at Rome reveals that the winter wheat area sown in France this season is 12,894,000 acres.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS -- WEEK ENDING JANUARY 29, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 29, show a net decrease of 1,950,575 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: wheat 195,446,396, oats 14,524,198, barley 11,422,262, flax 1,391,543 and rye 12,875,633, a total of 235,660,032 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,545,608, oats 346,201, flax 20,563 and rye 137,781, while barley shows an increase of 99,578 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 262,397,293 bushels, made up as follows: wheat 202,282,971, oats 14,207,343, barley 30,435,752, flax 2,080,417 and rye 13,390,810 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 234,888 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 275,735 and flax 1,932 bushels, while increases are noted in oats of 70,903 bushels, barley 2,088 bushels and rye 9,788 bushels.

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
