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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

Export shipments overseas for the week ended February 26, 1932 shows a small reduction from the corresponding week in 1931, and for the four week period the movement overseas 15,882,769 bushels below that same four weeks in 1931.

Canadian Wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and United States on February 27, 1932 amounted to 186,919,578 bushels a decrease of 2,111,722 bushels from the previous week. A considerable reduction is shown from the corresponding week in 1931, when 190,201,734 bushels were reported in store.

Eastern Elevators stocks are shown as 15,275,317 bushels a small reduction from the previous week. This compares with 16,650,794 bushels of a week ago and 20,846,507 bushels for the same week in 1931.

Canadian wheat in United States lake and Atlantic Seaboard elevators and afloat amounted to 14,928,440 bushels, as compared with 17,741,927 bushels for the previous week and 17,502,578 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. The majority of this is held in the elevators in Buffalo and New York.

There is 4,506,752 bushels more wheat reported in store in the western Division than for the same week a year ago, but in the Eastern Division, the stocks show a corresponding decrease of 5,571,190 bushels.

Wheat deliveries to the Western Country elevators and over the loading platforms for the week ended February 19, amounted to 2,763,170 bushels, a small reduction from the previous week. Alberta receipts account for 1,817,593 bushels of the above total.

During the same week in 1931, 3,057,822 bushels moved from the farms, while for the period from August 1 to February 19, 1932, 214,402,374 bushels passed into commercial channels as compared with 268,530,005 bushels for the corresponding period of a year ago.

World shipment of wheat and flour for the week ending February 27th amounted to 15,176,000 bushels compared with 15,202,000 bushels for the week previous and 14,842,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. The Argentine and Australia with shipments of 5,174,000 bushels and 4,901,000 bushels respectively were the large factors for the week. Shipments from North America receded sharply for the week amounting to 4,437,000 bushels compared with 5,630,000 for the week previous. Russia and the Danube were not factors of importance in the wheat movement for the week.

From August 1, 1931 to February 27, 1932 world shipments of wheat and flour amounted to 456 million bushels compared with 452 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Reduced Danubian Winter Wheat Acreage

The United States Department of Agriculture estimates that there has been a reduction of over $1\frac{1}{2}$ million acres in the winter wheat acreage sown in the Danube basin last fall. Bulgaria, Roumania, Hungary and Yugoslavia all show reduced winter wheat sowings but the decrease is mainly in Roumania where the statistics of the Department show a decrease of over one million acres compared with the area sown in the fall of 1930.

France increases Milling Quota

The French Government has increased the quantity of foreign wheat allowed to be milled in France from 20 to 25 per cent. This change marks the fourth adjustment in the French milling quota during the past month.

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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 26, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 26, 1932 show a net decrease of 2,144,923 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 186,919,578, Oats 14,607,684, Barley 11,430,333, Flax 1,360,500, and Rye 12,593,688 a total of 226,911,783 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,111,722, Barley 49,391 and Rye 138,648 bushels, while Oats and Flax show increases of 154,523 and 315 bushels respectively. For the same week last year the amount in store was 248,909,016 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 190,201,734, Oats 13,802,049, Barley 29,526,511, Flax 2,104,459, and Rye 13,275,163 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net increase of 168,634 bushels Oats and Rye show increases of 289,357 and 15,117 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 32,023, Barley 102,419 and Flax 1,398 bushels.


INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 418,319 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 481,110 bushels and Barley 1,803 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 64,594 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 888,010 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 834,396, Barley 51,943 and Rye 1,671 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 5,850, and 48 bushelss respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATORS. Grain stocks at elevator are the same as for previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. Grain stocks at elevator are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 593,913 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 571,748 bushels, Barley 19,494 bushels, Flax 2,569 bushels and Rye 9,163 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 9,061 bushels.
