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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

During the week ended March 4, 1932, and the week ended March 6, 1931, according to elevator returns from Canadian Seaboard Ports, the export shipments of wheat overseas were as follows:-

The export shipments during the week ended March 4, 1932, slightly increased over the previous week and although less than the same week in 1931 corresponds favourably to last year's movement. A notable feature was the increased shipments from the United States Seaboard Ports over those of the previous week.

Wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and United States on March 4, 1932, continue to show reduced quantities. The amount reported in store was 184,730,263 bushels as compared with 186,919,578 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931 189,843,029 bushels were shown as stored.

Canadian Wheat stocks in the Eastern Elevators amounted to 14,743,628 bushels, a slight decrease from the previous week when 15,275,317 bushels were reported. Last year for the same week 19,860,170 bushels were in store.

The stocks of Canadian Wheat in the United States positions for the week ended March 4, 1932 were 13,876,368 bushels slightly less than the previous week, when 14,928,440 bushels were reported. As in the former weeks, the majority of this is held in the elevators or vessels afloat located at Buffalo and New York.

Wheat deliveries to the western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms for the week February 26, 1932 increased over the previous week. The receipts are shown as 3,527,350 bushels of which 2,107,629 bushels were from the province of Alberta. For the previous week February 19, 1932 2,763,170 bushels were reported. During the week ended February 27, 1931, 3,057,812 bushels were moved from the Western farms. From August 1 to February 26, 1932, 217,929,724 bushels were marketed which compares with 268,530,003 bushels for the corresponding period in 1931.

Western inspections for the week ended March 7, 1932 show 2,012 cars inspected, as compared with 1,886 cars for the same week in 1931. The grading shows 1,509 cars were placed in the contract grades and 313 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1931, 757 cars graded no. 3 nor. and better and 1,035 cars tough and damp.

World Situation

World shipments for the week ending March 5th amounted to 16,386,000 bushels compared with 15,176,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,977,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Shipments from the Argentine reached their high point for the year during the week with clearances of 6,333,000 bushels. North America and Australia held the levels of the previous week while Russia was not a factor of importance with shipments of only 136,000 bushels.

From August 1, 1931, to March 5th, 1932 world shipments of wheat and flour amounted to 472 million bushels compared with 465 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

The Argentine - Second Estimate of Production

The Argentine Government issued a second estimate of 1931 production. The revised estimate of the wheat crop shows an increase of 8 million bushels over the preliminary estimate. Small increases are also shown in the case of other grains. The revised estimates and preliminary estimates are shown as follows:

India - Wheat Acreage

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics has received a cable from India showing a revised estimate of the area under wheat in that country. According to the cable the present acreage amounts to 33,745,000 acres compared with 31,020,000 acres last year.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH, 4, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 4, 1932, show a net decrease of 2,964,592 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 18,730,263, Oats 14,114,894, Barley 11,186,468, Flax 1,372,333, and Rye 12,543,233 a total of 223,947,191 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,189,315, Oats 492,790 Barley 243,865 and Rye 50,455 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 11,833 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in Store was 248,166,589 bushels made up as follows Wheat 189,843,029; Oats 14,061,773; Barley 28,867,530; Flax 2,111,853 and Rye 13,282,404 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 317,553 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 279,256 and 250,126 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in Wheat of 192,368, Flax 3,209 and Rye 16,252 bushels.
