A decrease in the export shipments is shown for both the week and the three weeks ended March 18, 1932, in comparison with the same periods last year. The movement for this week however, was slightly higher than that of the previous week.

A slight increase is again shown in the stocks of wheat in the elevators and afloat in Canada for the week ended March 18, 1932, when 186,338,163 bushels were reported in store as compared with 185,057,175 bushels for the previous week. For the same week in 1931, 185,192,509 bushels were shown as stored. Increased stocks are reported in the western elevators, while a small decrease is shown for the Eastern division.

Stocks of Canadian wheat in Eastern elevators slightly decreased from those of the previous week, the amount reported being 13,785,091 bushels, as against 14,743,628 for last week. For the same week in 1931, 17,586,808 bushels were in store.

Canadian wheat in United States positions are reported as 13,193,472 bushels, as compared with 13,876,368 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 14,434,277 bushels were reported. The majority of this is held in the elevators and afloat at Buffalo and New York.

Deliveries at the Western Country Elevators and over the Loading Platforms for the week ended March 11, were slightly below those of the previous week March 4, 1932. The receipts were 2,697,991 bushels and 3,416,822 bushels for the above mentioned two weeks respectively. Of the first amount 1,696,306 bushels were moved from Alberta. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,337,640 bushels were shipped to the above elevators. From August 1, to March 20, 1932, 224,044,537 bushels were marketed as compared with 275,428,421 bushels for the corresponding period in 1931.

According to a report dated March 21 received from our correspondent the ocean freight rate on wheat from West St. John to Liverpool, Manchester, London and Glasgow was 4.5 cents per bushel; for Cardiff and Swansea 6 cents per bushel, and Antwerp, Rotterdam, Hamburg and Bremen 8 cents per bushel.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 18, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 18, show an increase in all the grains of 1,821,478 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 186,452,453 bushels Oats 14,720,542 bushels, Barley 11,140,283 bushels Flaxseed 1,383,619 bushels and Rye 12,591,354 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,395,278 bushels, Oats 336,668, Barley 770,231, Flaxseed 11,715 and Rye 794 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was Wheat 185,192,509, Oats 14,716,825, Barley 27,754,496, Flaxseed 2,119,453 Rye 13,374,795 bushels.



INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net increase of 35,427 bushels. Increases are noted in Oats of 100,825 bushels and Barley 20,026 bushels while Wheat and Rye show decreases of 84,084 and 1,440 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 877,985 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 641,467 bushels Oats 163,003 bushels Barley 68,811 bushels and Rye 4,704 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND VICTORIA ELEVATORS.- Stocks at these elevators are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 11,471 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 822,324 bushels, Barley 38,733 bushels Flax 3,196 bushels and Rye 17,357 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 11,471 bushels.
