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CANADIAN WHEAT MOVEMENT

The export shipments of wheat for the week ended March 31, are a little over those of the previous week and 1,429,218 bushels more than ^{the} corresponding week in 1931. For the five week period ending at the above date, a decrease of 1,816,888 bushels is noted in the movement as compared with the same period last year.

Canadian Wheat Stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and United States for the week ended March 31, 1932 were less than previous week, being 184,565,284 bushels as compared with 186,395,529 bushels last week. For the same week in 1931, 180,540,105 bushels were reported in store.

In the Eastern Elevators in Canada, the wheat stocks amounted to 12,470,554 bushels a small reduction from the previous week, when 13,082,449 bushels were reported in store. On March 31, 1931, 15,931,326 bushels were stored.

Canadian Wheat stocks in United States positions continue to be reported lower than the previous week, when 11,675,048 bushels were shown in stock, as compared with 12,774,235 bushels for the previous week. On the same date in 1931, 11,132,729 bushels were reported. These stocks are held chiefly in the elevators and vessels afloat at Buffalo and New York.

The deliveries at the western country elevators and over the loading platforms for the week ended March 25, 1932 were slightly lower than those ^{of} the previous week. The receipts were 3,072,438 bushels and 3,765,282 bushels respectively. Alberta was the chief contributor with 1,522,848 bushels. Saskatchewan next with 1,282,708 bushels and Manitoba 266,882 bushels. During the same week in 1931, 3,140,178 bushels were moved from the farms.

From August 1 to March 25, 1932, 230,882,257 bushels were marketed, as compared with 278,568,599 bushels for the same period ended March 31, 1931.

During week ended March 31, 1932, the western inspections amounted to 3,106 cars of which 2,296 cars graded in the first four grades and 561 cars tough and damp. For the same week in 1931, 3,071 cars were inspected, 1,136 cars grading in the contract grades and 1,766 cars tough and damp.


World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending April 2nd amounted to 15,619,000 bushels compared with 13,985,000 bushels for the previous week and 13,960,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. The important feature of the week was the increase in shipments from North America, shipments amounting to 6,114,000 bushels compared with 5,552,000 bushels a week ago and 3,665,000 bushels two weeks ago. Shipments from the Southern hemisphere continued on a moderate scale with shipments of about 8 million bushels from the Argentine and Australia. Russia continues to take an inactive interest in the wheat market.

From August 1st, 1931 to April 2nd, 1932, world shipments of wheat and wheat flour amounted to 536 million bushels compared with 526 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. During the same period North American shipments amounted to 214 million bushels compared with 240 million bushels in 1930-31. To date in the present crop year Russian shipments amounted to 70 million bushels compared with shipments of 85 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

European Situation

Europe continues to take good quantities of foreign wheat. It is now suggested that the 1931 French wheat crop was over estimated and as a result domestic supplies are now very scarce and have forced the government to lower milling quotes much below the level of the same time last year. Reports are frequent that Germany will open up her market to some extent in the near future.

There are many conflicting reports as to the crop situation in Europe. Reports from Hungary indicate crops are not developing favourably while conditions in the Balkan States are described only as fair. Italy and France report good growth.



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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 1st, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 1st, 1932 show a decrease of 2,264,698 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 184,565,284, Oats 14,981,793, Barley 11,121,260, Flax 1,379,621, and Rye 12,317,378 a total of 224,365,378 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,830,245, Oats 184,391 Barley 138,516, Flax 7,257 and Rye 104,289 bushels. For the same period last year the amount in store was 238,486,247 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 180,540,105, Oats 14,886,836, Barley 127,551,677, Flax 2,059,372 and Rye 13,448,257 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks in store in these elevators show a decrease of 906,285 bushels made up as follows wheat 657,223, oats 200,200 barley 38,223 flax 6,237 and rye 4,392 bushels.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 123,167 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 167,780 bushels and Rye 3,829 bushels. While Oats and Barley show increases of 29,866 and 18,576 bushels respectively.


