CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to country elevators and platform loadings for the week ending April 1 amounted to 1,521,543 bushels compared with 3,072,438 bushels for the week previous. About half of the deliveries for the week were in Alberta. The figures for the week ending April 1 show the first recession in the relatively heavy winter movement of grain from farms in the Prairie Provinces. From August 1, 1931 to April 1, 1932 country deliveries and platform loadings amounted to 232,403,000 bushels compared with 278,568,599 bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Marketings of wheat in the three provinces up to April 1 are as follows: Manitoba, 21,527,169 bushels; Saskatchewan, 104,015,240 bushels; Alberta 106,861,391 bushels.

Inspections

Inspections during the week ending April 7, 1932 in the Western Division decreased sharply from the previous week. During the week ending April 7 inspections amounted to 1,422 cars compared with 3,106 cars for the previous week. Of the 1,422 cars inspected 1,041 cars graded within the first four grades and 256 cars graded tough and damp. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,775 cars were inspected, 1,231 cars grading within the first four grades and 1,427 cars grading tough and damp.

During the month of March in the Western Division 9,008 cars of wheat were inspected of which number 6,702 cars, or 74.4 per cent of inspections, graded No. 3 Northern or better. The quality of March inspections compares favourably with previous months. For the eight months ending March 31, 1932, 127,727 cars of wheat were inspected of which 96,710 cars, or 75.51 per cent graded No. 3 Northern or better. For the same period in 1930-31 151,938 cars were inspected, of which number 101,760 cars or 65.84 per cent graded No. 3 Northern or better.

Stocks in Store

Stocks of Canadian wheat in elevators and afloat in Canada and in the United States for the week ending April 8 amounted to 181,894,129 bushels compared with 184,565,284 bushels for the previous week and 178,057,369 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. During the week stocks of wheat in western country elevators declined by 1½ million bushels while stocks in store at Fort William, Port Arthur and Vancouver increased by a similar amount. Stocks of wheat in eastern Canadian elevators amounted to 10,834,509 bushels compared with 12,470,554 bushels for the previous week or a reduction of 1,636,045 bushels.

The volume of stocks of wheat in United States positions declined by about 600,000 bushels, stocks amounting to 10,860,032 bushels compared with 11,675,048 bushels for the previous week and 10,316,940 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931.

With a falling off in primary receipts and the opening of inland navigation, the next few weeks will probably witness seasonal reductions in stocks of wheat in store.

Export Clearances

Export clearances of wheat for the week ending April 8 amounted to 2,366,098 bushels compared with 2,976,326 bushels for the previous week and 3,858,794 bushels for the corresponding week last year. Clearances from West St. John amounted to 33,650 bushels, from Vancouver, 1,565,148 bushels and from United States Atlantic Ports, 767,000 bushels. The Vancouver movement exceeded that of the corresponding week of 1931 while the movement from United States ports and West St. John was sharply lower than for the same week last year.

Internal Movement

The internal movement of wheat in Canada for the week ending April 8 was largely a matter of shipments from country elevators towards terminal markets - a movement of 2,488,896 bushels of wheat. Rail shipments from eastern elevators amounted to 1,413,520 bushels. Rail shipments from interior terminal elevators, and private and mill elevators amounted to 526,827 bushels. Rail shipments from Port Arthur and Fort William were small, amounting to 3,608 bushels, while 412,331 bushels were discharged from eastern elevators for local requirements.

World shipments for the week ending April 9th, amounted to 14,749,000 bushels compared with 15,619,000 bushels for the previous week and 11,958,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North American shipments receded from the level of the previous week while shipments from the Argentine showed an increase of about 900,000 bushels. Russian shipments continued to be insignificant.

World shipments from August 1, 1931 to April 9, 1932, amounted to 551 million bushels compared with shipments of 538 million bushels for the same period last year. North American shipments for the same period amounted to 218 million bushels compared with 243 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. It is interesting to note that during the past three weeks North American shipments have exceeded those of the corresponding weeks in 1931. Russian shipments to date in the present crop year amount to 71 million bushels compared with 85 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

#### RUSSIA

A cable received from our correspondent in London outlines some interesting facts in connection with the cereal industry in Russia. Production of all grain in Russia in 1913 amounted to 1254 pounds per capita while corresponding figures for recent years are as follows (per capita): 1928, 1,065 pounds; 1929, 1,019 pounds; 1930, 1,217 pounds; 1931, 1,056 pounds. Production of all grains in 1931 amounted to not more than 79.7 million metric tons. In 1931 spring wheat acreage was 9 per cent and production 40 per cent under the plan. Average yield all grain in 1931 amounted to 11.1 bushels per acre compared with yield of 13.3 bushels per acre required to fulfil the plan.

It is too early to determine the damage caused by the thaw over the winter wheat area in January followed by frost in February but it is apparent that damage to winter wheat and rye will be considerable.



CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 8, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 8, 1932 show a net decrease of 2,830,238 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 181,894,129, Oats 14,710,721, Barley 11,154,105, Flax 1,407,531 & Rye 12,368,612 bushels a total of 221,535,098 bushels. Wheat & Oats show decreases of 2,671,155 and 271,072 bushels respectively, while increases are noted in Barley of 32,845, Flax 27,910 and Rye 51,234 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 235,351,118 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 178,057,369, Oats 14,579,322, Barley 27,162,311, Flax 2,042,372 and Rye 13,509,744 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:- Stocks in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 2,047,284 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,556,271, Oats 475,308, Barley 26,016 bushels while Flax and Rye show decreases of 5,206 and 5,108 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a net increase of 126,009 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 91,167 bushels and Oats 57,177 bushels; while Barley show a decrease of 22,335 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- Grain stocks at these elevators show an increase of 709,209 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 348,356 bushels, Oats 265,666 bushels, Barley 95,176 bushels and Rye 11 bushels.

PRINCE RUPERT AND VICTORIA ELEVATORS:- are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 1,010,873 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 946,328 bushels, Barley 23,730 bushels, Flax 20,249 bushels and Rye 28,692 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 8,126 bushels.
