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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to Western Country Elevators and platform Loadings for the week ended April 15, amounted to 1,796,332 bushels compared with 1,588,204 bushels for the previous week. As in the previous week half of the deliveries were from Alberta. For the corresponding week in 1931, 1,790,600 bushels were delivered by farmers. From August 1, 1931 to April 15, 1932 Country Elevators and platform loadings amounted to 235,788,336 bushels, compared with 283,935,239 bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to April 15 are as follows:- Manitoba 21,866,411 bushels; Saskatchewan 105,268,846 bushels; Alberta 108,653,079 bushels.

Inspections

Inspections of wheat in the Western Division increased from the previous week when 2,092 cars were reported compared with 1,317 cars. Of the 2,092 cars inspected 1,637 cars graded in the first four grades and 190 cars graded tough. For the corresponding week in 1931, 2,350 were inspected 1,230 cars grading within the first four grades and 915 cars tough and damp.

Stocks in store

Canadian wheat stocks in Elevators and Afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended April 22, amounted to 168,754,395 bushels, compared with 176,668,609 bushels for the previous week. The former amount include 1,926,191 bushels of wheat in transit in the lakes. This is a decrease of 7,914,214 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 162,040,874 bushels were reported. The stocks in the Western Country Elevators declined about $3\frac{1}{2}$ million bushels, while those at the Head of the Lakes decreased by 1,591,856 bushels.

Increased stocks are shown at the Eastern Canadian Elevators at the Lake ports, the amount reported being 9,877,610 bushels as compared with 9,876,311 bushels for the previous week. Wheat stocks in United States positions declined 2,281,357 bushels, the stocks amounting to 7,253,145 bushels compared with 9,534,502 bushels for the previous week and 3,896,181 bushels for the same week in 1931.

Export Clearances

During the week ended April 22, the export clearances amounted to 4,049,021 bushels, which is the largest since the first week in December, 1931. The movement for the corresponding week in 1931 was 3,146,784 bushels. Clearances from Vancouver, 2,980,088 bushels and from United States ports 666,000 bushels. Vancouver increased their shipments over the previous week and exceeded those the same week last year while West St. John & U. S. ports are considerably lower.

Internal Movement

For the week ended April 22, the internal movement consisted of large shipments from the Western Country Elevators to the Terminal Markets of Fort William and Vancouver. The movement amounted to 3,939,020 bushels. Rail shipments from the Georgian Bay elevators amounted to 240,877 bushels to the St. Lawrence ports.

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending April 23rd, 1932, amounted to 16,082,000 bushels compared with 15,871,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,792,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. North America again showed substantial shipments for the week, clearances amounting to 7,294,000 bushels. From August 1st, 1931 to April 23rd, 1932 North America shipments amounted to 233 million bushels compared with 253 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Since the beginning of the present crop year the Argentine has shipped 104 million bushels compared with 75 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. To date in 1931-32 Australian shipments have amounted to 110 million bushels compared with 105 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Russian shipments in 1931-32 are about 15 million bushels under the total for the same period last year.

Australia

In a cable received on April 26th from the International Institute of Agriculture at Rome, the 1932 Australian wheat acreage is roughly estimated at 15,500,000 million acres compared with 14,500,000 acres in 1931.

North America

During the month of April shipments of wheat from North America showed a substantial increase over the same period last year. During the four weeks ending April 23rd, 1932, North American shipments amounted to 25,552,000 bushels compared with 17,415,000 bushels for the same weeks in 1931, or an increase of over 8 million bushels in the case of the present year.

Import Requirement Estimate

Mr. Broomhall estimates world wheat import requirements for 1931-32 at 776 million bushels. The position of this estimate on April 23rd, 1932, is shown in the following table:-

According to the above estimate there is a balance of 193 million bushels to be shipped in the last 14 weeks of the present crop year, or an average of 13,818,000 bushels per week compared with weekly average shipments of 15,330,000 bushels for the preceding 38 weeks. Actual shipments from April 23, 1931 to July 31, 1931 amounted to 219 million bushels.

Foreign News

Market news from Europe continues to be encouraging. Supplies of domestic and foreign wheats are very scarce in France and Italy. Spain and Portugal are reported to be in the market for upwards to 10 million bushels of wheat, while Germany is making provision for the importation of wheat for feeding purposes. In general the demand situation is more favourable to-day than at any time during the present crop year.

The most important crop news comes from the winter wheat area of the United States. While rains have been received in some sections of the drought area, private reports indicate that there was considerable deterioration in the first 3 weeks of April which of course was not covered by the Government crop report issued on April 10th and showing conditions up to April 1st. Further damage to, or improvement in, this important wheat crop is anxiously awaited by the cereal world.

Russia

The London Corn Circular of April 18th, 1932 quotes the Riga correspondent of the "Times" (London) as follows:-

"As the result of a conference between M. Andreyeff, the Soviet Commissar for Land Transport, and the new Committee for Railway Construction, six commissions have been appointed to investigate conditions on the railways and advise on means for their improvement.....The Commissariat for Agriculture has announced that, owing to the inefficiency of the railways, the plans for sending grain to districts threatened with famine have failed. The grain was delivered to the railways, but, though it should all have reached its destination before April 1st, less than half had been transported by April 7th. Twenty-four thousand truckloads remained somewhere en route, while the Urals, Bashkiria, Kazakstan, Western Siberia, and parts of the Ukraine waited in vain."

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 22, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 22, 1932, show a decrease of 10,796,958 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 168,754,395, Oats 12,080,587, Barley 9,972,447, Flax 1,347,344 and Rye 11,842,778 a total of 203,997,551 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 7,914,214, Oats 1,452,779 Barley 890,186, Flax 59,944, and Rye 479,835 bushels. Included in the visible statement for the first time, are the stocks of grain in transit on the Lakes. For the same week last year the amount in store 214,189,428 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 162,040,874 Oats 13,242,228, Barley 24,080,506, Flax 1,855,755 and Rye 12,970,065 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of Wheat 3,562,697, Oats 425,912, Barley 186,880, Flax 73,399 and Rye 94,784 bushels.

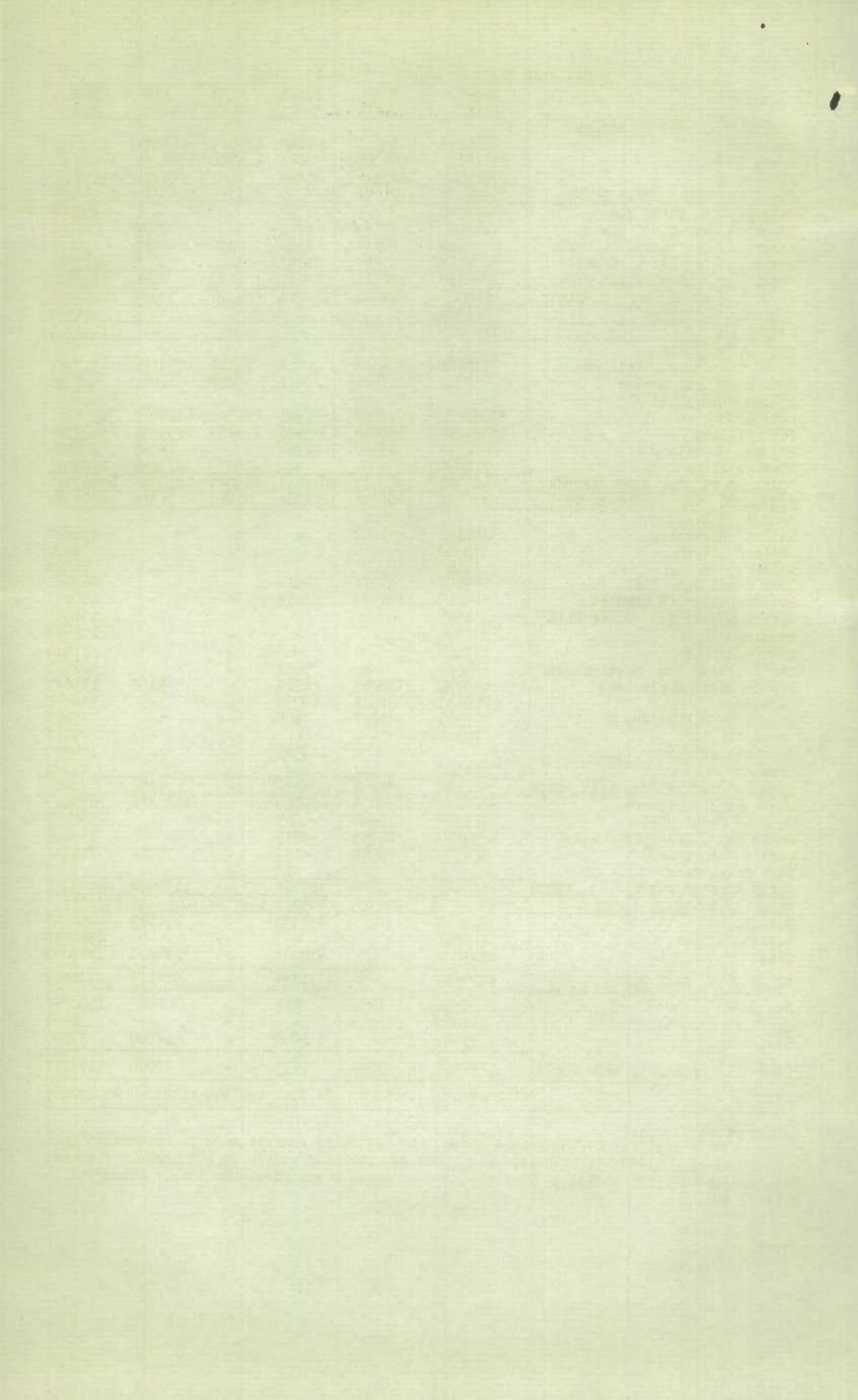
