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CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Deliveries of wheat to the western Country Elevators and over the **loading** platforms for the week ended April 22nd amounted to 1,514,596 bushels compared with 1,796,332 bushels for the previous week. Small increases are shown in deliveries in Manitoba and Saskatchewan, while a marked decrease was noted in Alberta. For the corresponding week in 1931, 1,885,602 bushels were delivered by the farmers. From August 1, 1931 to April 22, 1932 Country Elevators and platform Loadings amounted to 237,302,932 bushels, compared with 285,820,841 bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to April 22, were as follows:- Manitoba 22,029,171 bushels, Saskatchewan 105,948,026 bushels, Alberta 109,325,079 bushels.

STOCKS IN STORE

Stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended April 29 amounted to 164,269,592 bushels compared with 168,754,395 bushels for the previous week. The amount in Transit on the lakes for the week was 3,156,225 bushels. The decrease in stocks was 4,484,803 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 155,863,930 bushels were reported. Stocks in all the elevators declined from the previous week with the exception of the Eastern Lake Port Elevators.

Increased stocks are shown at the Eastern Canadian elevators at the Lake Ports while decreases are noted at the Seaboard Ports. The amount reported at Lake and Seaboard elevators was 10,605,502 bushels as compared with 1,877,610 bushels for the previous week. Wheat stocks in United States positions declined 2,673,321 bushels, the stocks amounting to 4,579,824 bushels, compared with 7,253,145 bushels for the previous week, and 2,776,303 bushels for the same week in 1931.

EXPORT CLEARANCES

During the week ended April 28th, the export clearances amounted to 4,175,340 bushels as compared with 4,049,021 bushels for the previous week. For the corresponding week in 1931, 6,510,730 bushels were shipped. Montreal exceeded Vancouver in the vessel shipments during the week the amounts being 1,735,369 and 1,718,171 bushels respectively. For the four weeks ended April 28, the movement of Canadian wheat from Canadian and United States ports was 13,666,733 bushels compared with 16,018,565 bushels for the same period in 1931.

INTERNAL MOVEMENTS

For the week ended April 28, the internal movement consisted of large shipments from the Western Country Elevators, the amount reported being 5,003,488 bushels. Large vessel shipments took place from the Head of the Lakes.

Navigation opened on the Lakes on April 19th and the movement of wheat from the Head of the Lakes to Eastern Canadian and United States ports was 5,740,804 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:- To Montreal, 2,938,817 bushels; Canadian Lower Lake Ports 2,244,132 bushels, Buffalo 348,873 bushels; Other United States Ports 146,500 bushels and Quebec 62,482 bushels.

Wheat inspections for the week ended April 30 amounted to 3,405 cars compared with 3,916 cars for the same week last year. Of the former number 2,664 cars were placed in the contract grades, and 338 cars tough and damp. For the corresponding week last year 1,963 cars graded in the first four grades and 1,490 cars tough and damp.

World Situation

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending April 30, amounted to 17,768,000 bushels compared with 16,082,000 bushels for the previous week and 16,360,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. All the major exporting countries showed an increase for the week with the exception of Russia from which country no shipments were forthcoming. North American shipments continued on a high level with clearances from Argentine and Australia moderately large.

World shipments of wheat and flour from August 1, 1931 to April 30, 1932 amounted to 601 million bushels compared with 585 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. North American shipments in recent weeks have exceeded those of the same weeks last year with the result that total shipments to date during the present crop year are now only about 19 million bushels under the total for the corresponding period in 1930-31. Shipments from Russia this year amount to 71 million bushels compared with 86 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. The Argentine and Australia have both shipped in larger volume during the present crop year than during 1930-31.

Import Requirement Estimate

Mr. Broomhall estimates world wheat import requirements for 1931-32 at 776 million bushels. The position of this estimate on April 30th, 1932, is shown in the following table:-

According to the above estimate there is a balance of 175 million bushels to be shipped in the last 14 weeks of the present crop year, or an average of 13,460,000 bushels per week compared with weekly average shipments of 15,412,000 bushels for the preceding 39 weeks. Actual shipments from April 30, 1931 to July 31, 1931 amounted to 202 million bushels.

RUSSIA


Our London Correspondent advises that up to April 20th, 15,921,233 acres of grain had been sown in Russia, of which 6,642,290 acres were sown to wheat, involving completion of the "plan" to the extent of 6.3 per cent. At the same time last year 8,201,543 acres had been sown. By April 25th, further progress had been made with 24,576,073 acres under crop, of which 10,339,041 acres were sown to wheat. As at this date 9.8 per cent of the sowing plan had been completed. On the same date in 1931, 16,793,538 acres had been sown to all grains. It is apparent, therefore, that spring sowings in Russia are slightly ahead of last year, although generally late.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 29, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 29, 1932, show a decrease of 6,391,845 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 164,269,592, Oats 11,459,070, Barley 9,413,495, Flax 1,299,053 and Rye 11,164,496 bushels a total of 197,605,706 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,484,803, Oats 621,517 Barley 558,952, Flax 48,291 and Rye 678,282 bushels. For the same week last year/amount in store was 206,882,528 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 155,863,930, Oats 11,951,191 Barley 23,816,164, Flax 1,756,984 and Rye 13,494,259 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 4,353,041 bushels made up as follows Wheat 3,431,416, Oats 511,371, Barley 205,624, Flax 109,343 and Rye 95,287 bushels.



PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR:- Stocks at this elevator show an increase in wheat of 9,156 bushels.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR:- Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.



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


