CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

Decreased deliveries continued to the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms for the week ended May 6, 1932, as compared with the previous week. The amount for the week ending May 6, was 627,540 bushels and for the previous week 750,871 bushels. Manitoba and Saskatchewan showed slight decreases of 47,923 and 141,418 bushels respectively while Alberta increased 60,407 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 1,353,709 bushels were delivered by the farmers. From August 1 to May 6, 1932 Country elevator and platform loadings amounted to 238,631,343 bushels, compared with 288,547,230 bushels for the same period in 1930-31. Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to May 6, as compared with the identical period a year ago were as follows; figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 22,207,509 (33,358,584) bushels, Saskatchewan 106,547,858 (155,319,488) bushels, Alberta 109,925,976 (99,869,158) bushels.

Stocks in Store

Stocks of Canadian wheat in the elevators and afloat in Canada and United States for the week ended May 13, 1932, amounted to 156,903,715 bushels which was 3,841,140 bushels less than the previous week, when 160,744,855 bushels were shown as stored. The amount in transit on the Lakes for the week was 2,441,585 bushels a reduction of 1,507,595 bushels from that of week ago. For the corresponding week in 1931, 143,748,410 bushels were reported in store in the above elevators. Stocks in all the Canadian elevators declined from the previous week - marked decreases took place in the Western Country, Vancouver and the Head of the Lakes elevators from the previous week.

Canadian Eastern elevators stocks amounted to 11,229,824 bushels, as compared with 9,381,625 bushels for the previous week, an increase of 1,398,199 bushels over those of week ago. The amount in United States positions also shows an increase over the previous week, 6,731,736 bushels being shown as stored compared with 4,499,010 bushels of a week ago. For the same week in 1931, 6,915,845 bushels were stored.

Export Clearances

Wheat clearances from Canadian and United States Atlantic Seaboard ports for the week ended May 13, 1932, amounted to 5,720,010 bushels exceeding last week's total of 5,506,104 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 7,553,867 bushels were moved from the above ports. The bulk of the movement for the week ended May 13, was from Montreal, with 2,738,411 bushels; Vancouver shipped 2,336,599 bushels and United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports 645,000 bushels.

Internal Movement

For the week ended May 13, 1932, the principal internal movements for the Western Division consisted of shipments from the Western Country Elevators amounting to 2,988,526 bushels; shipments from the Head of the Lakes were 3,229,255 bushels and from Vancouver 2,336,599 bushels. In the Eastern Division, large vessel shipments were recorded from Montreal of 2,738,411 bushels and 923,811 bushels moved from Lower Lake ports to Montreal by vessel.

Wheat inspections for the week ended May 14, 1932 consisted of 1,667 cars, compared with 2,458 cars in the same week in 1931. The gradings show that 1,360 cars were placed in the first four grades and 136 cars tough and damp for the above week in 1932, and for the same week in 1931, 1,596 cars were placed in the contract grades and 653 cars tough and damp.

For the week ended May 14, 1932, the vessel movement from the Head of the Lakes to Eastern Canadian and United States ports was 3,340,768 bushels, the distribution of which was as follows:- To Canadian Lower Lake ports (Pt. Colborne, Kingston and Toronto), 677,618 bushels; to Lake Huron and Georgian Bay Ports 1,276,834 bushels; to Buffalo 811,292 bushels; to Montreal 455,024 bushels and to Sorel 120,000 bushels. During the same week in 1931 6,450,757 bushels were shipped, 4,298,553 going to Buffalo, 1,759,570 to Can. Lower Lake Ports and 392,634 bushels to Montreal.

WORLD SITUATION

World shipments of wheat and flour for the week ending May 14, amounted to 18,616,000 bushels compared with 20,086,000 bushels for the previous week and 20,016,000 bushels for the corresponding week last year. For the fourth consecutive week shipments of wheat from North America showed an increase amounting in the past week to 9,656,000 bushels. Shipments from the Argentine and Australia receded from the totals of the previous week. Russia for the third consecutive week failed to clear any wheat.

World shipments from August 15 to May 14, 1932 amounted to 640 million bushels compared with 625 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31. North America shipments to date in the present crop year are about 20 million bushels less than during the same period in 1930-31. Russian shipments to date in the present crop year amounted to 71 million bushels compared with 89 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Import Requirements Estimate

Mr. Broomhall estimates world wheat import requirements for 1931-32 at 776 million bushels. The position of this estimate on May 14th, 1932, is shown in the following table:-

According to the above estimate there is a balance of 136 million bushels to be shipped in the last 11 weeks of the present crop year, or an average of 12,384,000 bushels per week compared with weekly average shipments of 15,604,000 bushels for the preceding 41 weeks. Actual shipments from May 14, 1931 to July 31, 1931 amounted to 162 million bushels.

RUSSIA

Our London Correspondent advises that up to May 5th, 53,462,532 acres of grain had been sown in Russia, of which 22,882,293 acres were sown to wheat, involving completion of the "plan" to the extent of 21 per cent. At the same time last year 60,682,557 acres of all grains were sown. On May 10th 78,400,272 acres were sown of which 32,536,842 acres were sown to wheat, thereby completing 31 per cent of the plan. At the same date in 1931, 88,366,178 acres were sown.

As shown by the above figures, the spring seeding program has fallen behind that of last year.

The wheat areas of Russia received considerable moisture during the week ending May 19th, substantially more than during immediately preceding weeks. Temperatures remained about the same as during the preceding week.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 13, 1932

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 13, 1932 show a net decrease of 5,292,909 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 156,903,715, Oats 9,228,719, Barley 7,463,772, Flax 1,384,413 and Rye 9,868,015 a total of 184,848,634 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 3,841,140, Oats 358,962, Barley 787,901 and Rye 367,173 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 62,267 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 189,749,830 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 143,748,410, Oats 11,739,944, Barley 19,118,852, Flax 1,632,058 and Rye 13,510,566 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a decrease of 3,581,321 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,671,844, Oats 390,394, Barley 420,506, Flax 26,736 and Rye 71,841 bushels.



PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR .- Stocks of grain at this elevator are the same as for the previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATORS.- Wheat stocks are the same as for the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR).- Stocks for the week show a net decrease of 2,564,680 bushels. Decreases are noted in wheat of 1,897,581, Oats 33,623 and Rye 873,209 bushels while Barley and Flax show increases of 147,248 and 92,485 bushels respectively.


