

CANADIAN WHEAT STATISTICS

Primary Movement

The deliveries to the Western Country Elevators and over the loading platforms for the week ended May 20, 1932, increased over the previous week. The amount delivered for the week ended May 20, was 1,637,584 bushels and for the previous week 855,594 bushels. By Provinces, the receipts for the above week were as follows:- Manitoba 203,823 bushels; Saskatchewan 735,625 bushels; Alberta 698,136 bushels. From August 1 to May 20, 1932, Country Elevators and Platform Loadings amounted to 241,174,521 bushels, compared with 291,692,552 bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

Marketings of wheat in the three prairie provinces up to May 20, as compared with the same period a year ago were as follows, figures within brackets being those for 1931:- Manitoba 22,527,369 (33,649,932) bushels; Saskatchewan 107,663,931 (156,981,982) bushels Alberta 110,983,221 (101,060,938) bushels.

Stocks in Store

Canadian wheat stocks in the elevators and afloat in Canada and the United States for the week ended May 27, 1932 amounted to 148,923,751 bushels a reduction of 4,122,029 bushels from the previous week, when 153,045,780 bushels were reported stored.

The amount in Transit on the Lakes for the week was 5,006,742 bushels, an increase of 285,739 bushels. For the corresponding week in 1931, 132,592,538 bushels were reported in store in the above elevators. Stocks in all the elevators show decreases with the exception of the Eastern Canadian and United States Lake port elevators and the Private and Mill elevators in the Western Division.

The wheat in store at the Eastern Canadian elevators increased slightly over the previous week. The amount reported in store was 12,538,379 bushels compared with 12,051,214 bushels of a week ago. The amount reported in United States positions was 7,202,208 bushels, as compared with 5,823,026 bushels for the previous week. For the same week in 1931, 5,991,729 bushels were shown as stored.

Export Clearances

A slight decrease is shown in the wheat clearances from Canadian and United States Atlantic Seaboard Ports for the week ended May 27, 1932.

The Ocean shipments for the week were 3,992,200 bushels compared with 4,015,630 bushels for the previous week and 6,342,601 bushels for the corresponding week a year ago. By ports the export clearances for the week ended May 27th, 1932 and May 28, 1931 were

Internal Movement

During the week ended May 27, the principal internal movements for the Western Division consisted of large shipments from the western country elevators of 4,404,858 bushels, while 3,404,036 bushels moved from the Head of the Lakes by Vessel and 1,365,915 bushels were exported from Vancouver, B. C. The Eastern elevators shipments amounted to 1,917,285 bushels cleared from Montreal and 1,668,386 bushels shipped from the Lower Lake ports to the St. Lawrence ports.

World shipments of wheat and wheat flour for the week ending May 28, 1932 amounted to 13,551,000 bushels compared with 15,500,000 bushels for the previous week and 14,816,000 bushels for the corresponding week in 1931. The feature of the week's shipments was the sharp reduction in clearance from the Argentina, shipments amounting to 2,041,000 bushels compared with 3,541,000 bushels for the previous week. For the fifth consecutive week Russia failed to clear any wheat.

World shipments from August 1, 1931 to May 28th, 1932 amounted to 669 million bushels compared with 660 million bushels for the same period in 1930-31.

R U S S I A

According to our London correspondent spring sowings of all grain in Russia up to May 20th amounted to 135,393,492 acres or 53.5 per cent of "the plan". The area sown to wheat amounted to 44,210,271 acres or 68 per cent of "the plan"; and barley 12,053,977 acres or 69 per cent; to oats, 19,854,861 acres or 44 per cent.

At the same date last year the area sown to all grains amounted to 139,868,636 acres, or 57 per cent of the plan while the area sown to wheat amounted to 43,701,227 acres or 63 per cent of the plan.

CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 27, 1932.

Returns received as to stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 27, show a net decrease of 4,960,144 bushels. Stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 148,923,751, Oats 6,540,367, Barley 6,738,235, Flax 1,440,896 and Rye 10,266,313, bushels a total of 173,909,562 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,122,029, Oats 373,409 Barley 241,303 and Rye 267,013 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 43,610 bushels. For the same week last year the amount in store was 172,682,499 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 132,592,538, Oats 10,839,691, Barley 15,447,408, Flax 1,253,602 and Rye 12,549,260 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS:-

Stocks of grain in store in these elevators show a net decrease of 4,244,598 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 4,293,935, Flax 9,050 and Rye 130,005 bushels while Oats and Barley show increases of 129,546 and 58,846 bushels respectively.

INTERIOR TERMINAL (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW, EDMONTON AND CALGARY). Stocks for the week show a decrease of 244,443 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 2,161 bushels, Oats 162,933 bushels and Barley 79,349 bushels.

VANCOUVER PRIVATE AND TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - Grain stocks at these elevators show a net increase of 355,818 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 363,781 bushels, Barley 16,649 bushels, while Oats and Flax show decreases of 24,299 and 313 bushels respectively.

PRINCE RUPERT ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

VICTORIA ELEVATOR. - Stocks at this elevator are the same as for previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). Stocks at these elevators show a net decrease of 2,814,988 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,421,353 bushels Oats 46,726 bushels, Barley 379,285 bushels and Rye 21,287 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 53,663 bushels.

IN TRANSIT LAKES. -

Grain in transit shows a net decrease of 91,918 bushels, Rye shows a decrease of 504,930 bushels, while increases are noted in Wheat of 285,739, Oats 78,297 and Barley 48,976 bushels.


